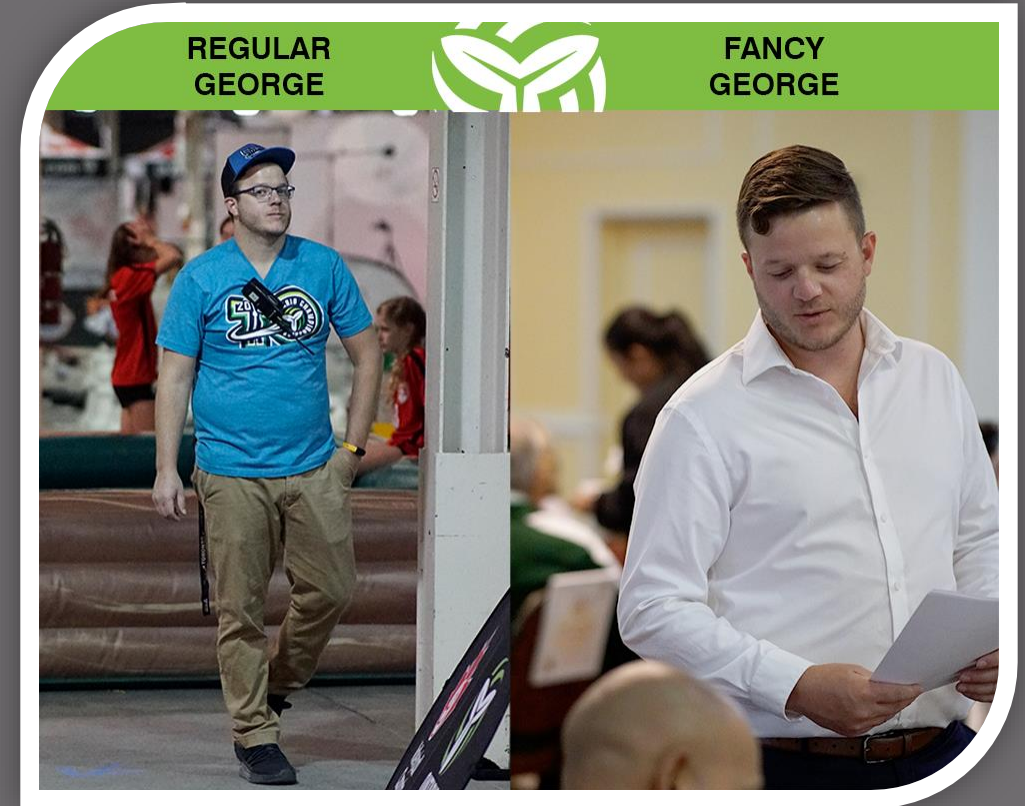

- Let's harness the power of volleyball to create lasting impacts in our communities. Share your stories, inspire change!"



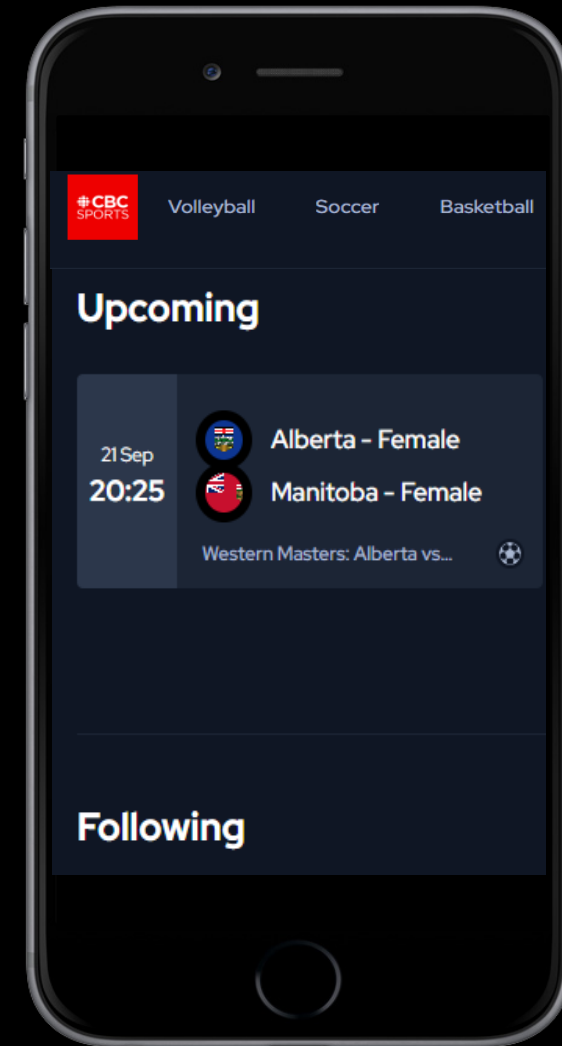

Introducing CBC Sports Connect: **Core Features**

- **Livestream Games**
 - Camera requires an ethernet connection or 5G router with data
 - Audience sign-in to CBC Sports Connect with name, email and postal code
- **Watch on Demand**
 - Content can be uploaded post game or rewatched, tagged and shared on social
- **Access Analytics**
 - With Subscription, content uploads to VIDSWAP for game breakdowns and analysis



CBC & OVA Partnership

- Pixellot camera(s) leased to clubs at \$1500/year, subsidy available from OVA
- Game content uploaded or livestreamed into CBC Sports Connect weekly
- Content viewable to all audience via www.cbc.watch.pixellot.tv
 - Users need to sign-in with name and email
- The more content is uploaded and streamed live, the more for users to enjoy

VidSwap VIP Pricing

- Clubs can also sign up for CBC VIP pricing with Vidswap, a leading analytics tool
- Content from Pixellot camera can auto upload into Vidswap for game breakdowns and analytics.

CBC VIP Pricing:

- Club fee of \$1495 USD for unlimited access to analytics platform
- Additional \$499 USD per team for season long game breakdowns **OR**
- \$799 USD per team for game breakdowns without club access fee

Regional Council – Purpose



The overall role of the Regions is to collaborate and cooperate to help grow the sport of volleyball in Ontario by integrating the OVA's strategic plan into programs and drawing on the expertise within the Regions to strengthen programming.

- The purpose of the Regional Council is to:
- Encourage and facilitate exchanges of information and experiences about volleyball programs and issues at the club and regional level.
- Provide advice on program and services design and delivery between clubs, Regions, and the OVA.
- Review and report to regional members on actions taken by the Board and OVA management, and the implications for clubs and Regions.
- Communicate information from the Board and OVA management to regional members to ensure an effective and accurate two-way flow of information.
- Provide input to the Board regarding policy, and to OVA management on operational policies, practices, standards development, and implementation.
- Share best practices across the province.

Regional Council Next Steps

- As promised at the August 21st Club Leader Town Hall, the [Club Leader FAQ](#) has been posted on the OVA website to address common themes on the Club Resource page and emailed directly to Club Leaders.
- Work with OVA staff to see if any other areas from the survey results need to be reviewed

CLUB RESOURCES: ONCA TOOL BUILDER

Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010 (ONCA)

ONCA provides Ontario not-for-profit corporations, including charitable corporations, with a modern legal framework to meet the needs of today's not-for-profit sector. It sets out how not-for-profit corporations are created, governed and dissolved.

As of October 19, 2021, ONCA is in force.

CLEO's bylaw builder helps nonprofits develop a set of bylaws that comply with Ontario's Not-for-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA). The tool asks you questions, explains what your choices are, and includes information to help you decide. Then, based on your answers, it generates a set of bylaws for your nonprofit. The Bylaw Builder is free to use and all text has been legally reviewed.
