### FALL SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS

It was an existing season for the 412 student-athletes that participating in a fall sport at HHS! Highlights include:

- Average team GPA of 3.38, program retention rate of 81%
- Average multi-sport athlete rate of 56%
- Combined varsity W/L record of 54-46-4 (56% WP)
- Three teams won at least one section game & five teams finished in the top 3 in the Metro East Conference
- Girls' soccer finished 13-3-2, the most wins in a single season in school history. They hosted (and won) a section playoff game for the first time in over 20 years.
- Girls' soccer head coach Scott Meier was named both Section 3AA Coach of the Year and Minnesota State AA Girls Coach of the Year.
- Boys' soccer coach Christian Waage was named Section 4AA Assistant Coach of the Year.
- The synthetic turf at McNamara Stadium/Todd Field was a big hit. There were over 80 different events on 40 different dates, marking more than a 4x increase in events and 2x increase in dates compared to the average fall season on grass. Events included varsity and lower level practices and games, marching band, and HMS events. Four different community groups used the stadium at least once; Little Raiders football, HFC soccer, YMCA, SEAS. Todd Field also hosted three MSHSL section/state playoff games.
