Principal's Letter Matt Biggar

We have had a very successful start at Burlingame High School. We have begun our 84th year at Burlingame High School in excellent shape with our renovated facilities. Staff and students have been inspired by the renovations in our Main Building.

Our renovated classrooms are 50% larger than they were prior to modernization. These large classrooms support effective classroom instruction by providing space for a variety of learning activities. Our renovated classrooms have significant amount of natural light through multiple windows that reach towards the high classroom ceilings. They are also equipped with dual paned windows that improve noise insulation and classroom climate. All of these features help to keep our students focused on learning. Our classrooms are also each equipped with a pair of data connections and have an infrastructure for wireless technology. We have a brand new computer lab for classes to use that will soon be equipped with new computers, thanks to our Parents Group.

Our office space has also been greatly improved through redesign and modernization to better serve our students, parents and staff. Our Main Office now is located immediately to the right as you enter the building. Our Attendance Office is located immediately to the left as your enter the building. Down the hallway to the right, you will find our Student Services Office, Counseling Office, Career Center and Health Office all next to one another. This enables us to efficiently connect students to staff and services as needed. Through our Counseling Office, you will find our Alumni Room which is our main meeting room on campus. It can hold 150-200 people for both daytime and evening school functions. It has a large screen that retracts from the ceiling for use during presentations. Alumni and historic school items will also be featured in this room.


We are pleased with not only the modern features in our Main Building but also with how well it reconnects us to our school history. The beautiful exterior of our school along with a number of features inside retain their historic feel. Most noteworthy and apparent as you enter the building is the placement of historic murals back into the main hallway. These murals were painted by Frederick Alexander Pawla as a WPA project during the New Deal. They were donated to our school in 1930. Our district carpenter did a wonderful job framing them to the hallway walls.

With our school history, renovated facilities, outstanding faculty and staff, and a focus on continuous school improvement, we expect great things from all of our students at Burlingame High School. Thanks to the hard work of our faculty and expanded options under the 7 Period Day, we are

offering a number of new courses to students this year including Integrated Science. Advanced Placement, Environmental Science, Beginning Choir. Advanced Placement Music Theory, Multimedia, Engineering Technology, Facing History and Ourselves, and Spanish for Native Speakers. Our teachers also regularly work in teams to monitor and adjust our curriculum in all of our courses to best meet student needs.

While we will continue to benefit from an overall high level of funding per pupil and strong community support, we will be facing short-term budget challenges. The San Mateo High School District is also facing a significant budget shortfall this year. As I write, more details will be forthcoming and may already be publicized by the time you read this. We are bracing for the impact of reductions district wide that are needed to restore the district's reserve. While these reductions will challenge us, they are short-term and we will work through it. As a Basic Aid District, we continue to maintain per pupil funding well above the state average. Parent Group support will be more important than ever, as we work through this financially challenging time. I thank you, our BHS alumni and Alumni Association, for your continued support.

After I hung up, not believing what I had just heard, I thought to myself "Oh no, not Dick". Dick Dunbar was one of the cornerstones of the Alumni Association. When the Association was re-vitalized in 1998 he became treasurer of the new organization. At any time you could ask him where something was or how monies were allocated and he knew the answer. When we needed a new editor for the Panther Postscripts, Angie, his wife, volunteered her services.

Dick Dunbar was a 1949 graduate of Burlingame High School. He enlisted in the Air Force and was stationed in Ohio. There he met and fell in love with Angela. They were married before returning to Burlingame. He started as a U. S. postal mail carrier and she as a legal

secretary. Like most families of that era, they bought a home and started a family. Dick soon became involved in the American Legion and Angie joined the Auxiliary. At the Post Office, his star kept raising until he became Postmaster of Burlingame, the city of his youth. After their children were grown, the American Legion became a major part of their lives. The two held every leadership post in the local Veteran's group and several positions at state and national levels. Dick was slated to serve his fourth term as head of Post #409. Angle was preparing to leave for a national convention. Because of Dick's interest in the Boys and Girls State program, the Alumni Association has sponsored students for several years. In his honor, the grant will be named The Dick Dunbar Award. In the last edition of this newsletter we wished Angie "Happy Trails". Now in sadness, from the BHS Alumni Association, we say "Happy Golden Trails" to Dick and Angie.

Alumna of the Year



In 1960, she was known as **Maxine Kurtz**, an outstanding graduate of BHS. Today...she is known as the **Honorable Maxine M. Chesney**, an outstanding member of the Federal Judiciary.

While at Burlingame, she was a page editor and author of a regular gossip column for the "B" and a member of the French Club. She was voted "Best Dancer" in the Senior Poll and was a Life member of the California Scholarship Federation.

After leaving the halls of BHS she turned her talents loose at UC Berkeley where she graduated with honors in 1964. She continued her education at the UC Berkeley Boalt Hall School of Law and graduated in 1967. Her legal career started in 1968 when she joined the San Francisco District Attorney's Office where she served for eleven years. During this time, she created the first special District Attorney's unit in the nation devoted to the prosecution of crimes involving sexual assaults.

In 1979 Governor Jerry Brown appointed her to the San Francisco Municipal Court. Four years later he elevated her to the Superior Court where she served until 1995. In that year, President Bill Clinton appointed her to the United States District Court for the Northern District of California, a position she holds to this day.

For more than 30 years our recipient has been a lecturer and speaker at legal and judicial programs throughout California. She has been a mentor to a whole generation of young lawyers.

Burlingame High School has been ranked 279 in the United States as one of the Best High Schools in America by Newsweek magazine's annual rating. The Opportunity Index ranking utilized by Newsweek was created by Washington Post Education Columnist Jay Mathews. Mathews' book, "Class Struggle: What's Wrong (and Right) with America's Best Public High Schools", started a nationwide focus on Advanced Placement Education a few years ago. The Opportunity Index measures the number of advanced Placement exams taken at a school divided by the number of students in the measures senior class and opportunities offered at the school site.

In the 30s Burlingame offered classes in Floriculture complete with greenhouses, cold frames, Also included were compost piles. classes on building radios and airplane models. Football was played in an open field with the "freeway" in the background. The men wore threepiece suits and the woman wore hats and gloves to school and students were quite serious. All students in the cooking classes wore aprons and toques. The guys seemed to do a lot of looking around while checking out each other's food.

The 40s brought glamour girls with high fashion hairstyles and jewelry to complete every outfit. The girls seemed to dominate these film clips in fashion shows, swimming, hockey, art classes and cooking classes. One day they were caught sidestepping from lockers to showers covered in only large white towels. The guys on the tennis courts were all "decked" out in long white pants and sweaters. At the prom, couples dance cheek-to-cheek.

The highlights of the Nov 22, 1945 Little/Big Game aren't to be missed. Maybe you remember a Senior Dressup Day and Mummy Case, or the strongman or the headless woman or the China Relief Rickshaw.

The 50s brought cars, cars and more cars. While the guys showed us their muscles, the girls were taking aim in their archery and hockey classes. Was it your Senior Dress that entertained us with mermaids, dancing beer cans, Indian maidens, and harem dancers?

After graduation from BHS, she attended San Mateo Junior College and finished her education at Stanford in 1937, the same year her brother, Robert Simpson, graduated from BHS. She was a 36-year veteran of Wells Fargo Bank and the creator of the renowned Wells Fargo History Room. During her working career she developed a remarkable collection of exhibits showcasing the history of Wells Fargo and California. In 1942, Irene joined the Navy and completed officer training in Northampton, MA before her assignment to Treasure Island. In 1946, she resumed her career with the bank. Over the years, she served as president of the Conference of California Historical Societies and the California Historical Society. served on the Board for the American Association of State and Local History and was appointed chairwoman of the California Heritage Preservation Commission.

Fred and Tim Oppezzo wrote that mother, Theresa Ahern Oppezzo '34 attended Burlingame High School from 1930 to 1934. While at BHS, she lettered in sports basketball, field hockey & softball and was the MVP in all three at the varsity Theresa was a Burlingame resident all her life. She passed away on Jan. 1st 2005.




