Playing Music During Games

There have been a few questions recently regarding playing music at Buckhead Baseball. There has been a long-standing precedent at Buckhead Baseball that no music is played on Buckhead Baseball fields during any event for any of our seasons.

Buckhead Baseball has taken an official position on this subject, and we would like for all teams to adhere to the following. While we appreciate that some may enjoy walk up music and music during pauses in a game (before games, between innings, pitching changes, etc.), there are many who do not. Music can be a distraction for players and coaches alike and moves the focus off the kids and into the stands. Additionally, music at the ballpark has upset neighbors in the past and we would like to maintain good relationships with them; if all the fields have music on them it would basically be a non-stop cacophony of sound for our neighbors as well as the Buckhead Baseball players and patrons attending. <u>As a reminder the City of Atlanta states "No amplified</u> <u>music allowed (except by special permit)."</u>

Buckhead Baseball's position is:

- There should be no walk-up music at all.
- There should be no music played before games, between innings, pitching changes, practices, or any other Buckhead Baseball event. The only exception is on the Majors field during playoff games.
- Music on the Majors field ONLY should be limited to the Playoff Games and then only at a reasonable volume between innings or during pitching changes.
