



HIGH PERFORMANCE BOYS 14 PROGRAM | Spring 2019

Phase 1 | March 18 – March 31, 2019

District Trials / Top 30 Selection - \$100 per candidate

Each Minnesota Hockey District (12) will invite a minimum of forty (40) candidates to participate in the trials to determine the top thirty (30) players. Each candidate will receive 3.5 hours of ice time and a participant jersey.

Players / coaches who have not registered with Minnesota Hockey / USA Hockey will be required to register online with USA Hockey at www.usahockeyregistration.com for insurance purposes.

Phase 2 | April 1 – April 18, 2019

District Top 30 Skill Sessions - \$150 per player

The top 30 players from each district will participate in ten (10) skills training sessions by the district coaching staff. Each district will receive a maximum of ten (10) hours of ice as a reimbursable expense for pre-festival training. After the pre-festival preparation, twenty (20) players will be selected for each district team. (Team formed by April 15, 2018).

Phase 3 | April 26 – 28, 2019

Minnesota Hockey Spring Festival: Duluth, MN - \$200 per player

All teams will play three (3) games during the Festival against other district teams. Player Evaluation: A team of knowledgeable coaches and scouts will evaluate all participants, consult with team coaches and select the top 120 players for participation in the CCM Minnesota Hockey High Performance Boys 14 Development Camp. Alternate selectees will also be chosen by the evaluation team and will be invited to the camp in the event one of the original selectees is unable to participate. All selectees and alternates are **required** to view the Development Camp informational video. The Development Camp schedule will be posted on the HP 14 webpage at Minnesota Hockey.

Phase 4 | June 16 – 20, 2018

Minnesota Hockey Development Camp: St. Cloud, Minnesota - \$650 per player

120 selected players participate in a weeklong development camp at St. Cloud State University. Housing and meals are provided. Six (6) teams play a round robin schedule of games, attend dry land training sessions, and classroom sessions daily. The staff at the Development Camp will be headed by Camp Director Jacob Mars of Minnesota Hockey, and will include prominent college and high school coaches teamed with current and former college hockey players to serve as coaches, role models, and counselors for each team.

Expense of this camp is shared equally by the participants and is based on actual cost less grants received from Minnesota Hockey and USA Hockey.
