ABOUT US: Founded in 2003, Homegrown Lacrosse, a Twin-Cities based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, works to create positive change in the lives of young people. The organization’s mission is to build a community that inspires and empowers youth to excel in life and lacrosse. We achieve our mission through a wide variety of programs designed to develop character, build self-confidence, and instill a sense of community.



Program offerings include nationally recognized overnight summer camps, year-round skill training, leagues, tournaments, Captain’s Cup, special events, travel team experiences, an in-school physical education program, inner-city after-school programs, a youth leadership development program, scholarship fund and several other “Grow the Game” initiatives including training of community leaders, coaches, and referees.

Each works to provide valuable life and perspective-changing experiences to over 10,000 youth who come from a diverse array of socio-economic, cultural, and geographic backgrounds. We also partner with and support over 120 community lacrosse organizations each year.
