Scripture Readings: August 31: Sir 3:17-18, 20, 28-29, Heb 12:18-19, 22-24a, Lk 14:1, 7-14 (126)

## Why is Crucifixion conducting a capital campaign?

**Isaiah 28:16** Therefore, the Lord God has this to say to you in response: Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion, a stone that has been tested, a precious cornerstone as a firm foundation; those who place their trust in it will not falter.

#### The campaign's purpose is to raise funds for the following projects:

**Gathering Space** - This project will include a large parish gathering space, offices and meeting spaces, ADA access and restrooms, as well as a covered drop off entrance to a new lobby. The primary benefits of this expansion are to:

- offer a convenient, welcoming space for funeral visitations, post funeral luncheons, and other large gatherings
- prevent disruptions to student activities at the school and enhance school security by eliminating parish events taking place while classes are in session
- provide people access to an event after Mass without having to go outside or cross the street

**Daycare Center** - Crucifixion's daycare serves the La Crescent area community and helps to generate consistent enrollment into Crucifixion School. Additionally, daycare children transition smoothly into kindergarten in a familiar and welcoming environment. It also provides steady cash flow to our school. This project will provide a dedicated space for the daycare center, which will:

- increase our current capacity of 40 children to a maximum capacity of 110 children
- provide infant care
- return former daycare space in the school for student activities
- improve security
- add much needed storage space
