Pavilion Project Update & Action

Robbins started the discussion with a presentation overview of draft agreement language with the City including the updates discussed by the EHA board at the last meeting which the City was responsive to. Reviewed the typical gambling income after expenses are covered. Gambling covers about 50% of our expenses with an average excess of ~\$260K per year. Reviewed a number of scenarios with different gambling revenues assumptions. If we continue with our recent average, we would be able to pay down the line of credit in about 18 months. If we experience some of our recent higher revenues, we could pay down the line of credit within a year. There are always risks that we could lose gambling revenue as well. Additional discussion on advertising and donation potential and leveraging gambling relationships. Good support from the Board for this investment but we will have to pay close attention to our discretionary spending. Very positive for bars/restaurants to be associated with a big donation like this to the Eagan community.

Motion for Treasurer Ryan Thomas to obtain a \$350,000 line of credit made by Gunderson. Cahill seconded. All present in favor.

Motion to donate up to \$1.3M, less expenses already incurred, to the City of Eagan to fund the agreed-upon refrigerated rink at Goat Hill consistent with the terms of the memo of understanding as presented to Eagan Hockey by the City of Eagan on June 28, 2021 made by Gunderson. Seconded by Davis. All present in favor.

Recommendation to have a meeting and present this concept to the membership and send communications out describing the project.



Spring is here and we've officially called an end to the 2021/22 hockey season. Once again, I'd like to begin by thanking all of our coaches, team managers, parent volunteers and Board members who have spent so much of their time contributing to our Association. Your continued efforts are so important to allow EHA to be successful in bringing the game of hockey to the youth within our community.

We began the 2021/22 season by welcoming nine new members to the Board: Chris Rasnin, Luke Cahill, Eric Gundersen, Lindsay Greenlee, Tena Lyons, Christian Prouty, Christian Mondick, Eric Chaloux, and Sara Lent. And, as the year concludes, three Board members have chosen to end their time on the Board: Chrissy Beckwith (Secretary), Mike Larson (Pavilion Project Manager), and Roxanne Davis (President). I sincerely thank all of these individuals for their years of service and commitment to EHA.

The 2021/22 season was a breath of fresh air after two seasons of Covid restrictions. It was great to see our families back enjoying, not only the game of hockey, but each other as team building returned to full throttle. While Covid was still present, it had minimal impact on the season. Special thanks to Robert Braun (Vice President) for managing our Covid responses and working to make sure all families' needs were addressed.

For the girls program, over half of our teams finished above 0.500 in district play, with our 12UB1 team finishing third in the district tournament and advanging to regional play. Our boys program also had impressive results. Our entire Bantam program will hang banners in the rink this year. A and B1 teams both advanced through Districts, Regions and our B1 team participated in the State tournament. Bantam B2 and C both placed 3rd in the district regular season and both were runners up in the district tournament. At Peewees, our A team advanced to Regions, our B1, B2 finished over 0.500, in district play, and our C team went undefeated in district play and were the D-8 Peewee C playoff Champs. All of our Squirt teams finished with 0.500 records or better in district play, with our C and B2 Blue teams finishing 3rd in District Play-offs. These numbers represent the players who reside in Eagan and registered through EHA. † 2015-16 Minnesota Hockey went to 15U on a pilot program for girls – previously 14U.

These numbers represent our total registrations. They do not consider move-ups or players that quit after registration.

The 2021-2022 season brought many successes, including an amazing registration report. We continue to see incredible growth in our program. We have more registered players across all levels than we have had in over ten years with an overall increase from last year at 11.6%. At our youngest levels of play, numbers are in the high double and triple digits. Notably, at the Mite level we increased our number of players from last year to this year by 35.7%. And the girl's program has increased from last year to this year by 27%.

These numbers are a nod to our wonderful families that make EHA an amazing program.

Volunteer Coordinator - Sara Lent

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

The volunteer requirement this year was four credits per family. Adjustments were made in the Dibs module in SportsEngine which better allowed for tracking and reporting of hours completed. Over 1500 credits were claimed and fulfilled in Dibs this year representing strong volunteer support from our EHA families helping in everything from coaching and team managers, to tryouts, tournaments, and a wide variety of EHA events.

Hockey Operations – Grant Robbins

The 2021-22 hockey season is in the books, and it was a great one for Eagan Hockey Association! Certainly the highlight was the return of full on and off-ice activities for all of our teams for the first time in two seasons. The impacts of COVID-19 were minimal this year, and I thank all EHA members for their flexibility to keep our teams skating throughout the season. I would also be remiss to not thank our Vice President, Robert Braun, for the terrific communication and leadership as our point person for "everything COVID". On the ice, it was terrific to see the very broad success of teams at all levels. The 2021-22 season included several thrilling runs by our teams in District, Region and even State Tournament play. The development, sportsmanship, and strong performance of our skaters is a huge testament to our volunteer and paid coaches. We can't thank you enough for all you do for our association!

As discussed above, we were thrilled to see our association grow by more than 10% this year. We now stand at more than 30% above the size of our association during the 2018-19 season. Our Eagan traveling team count (Squirt - Bantams, U10-U15, and Junior Gold) grew to 22 this year, the highest in many seasons. The

association's goal is to maintain the high level of ice touches for every team as we continue to grow, and this was a significant focus for Hockey Operations this year. We were unable to maintain the same number of hours of ice at Woog, but worked hard to find time at other nearby rinks and provided additional funding to our teams to allow for more flexibility. In addition, as part of the EHA Pavilion project discussed below, the association reached a 25-year agreement with the City of Eagan for priority use of the refrigerated outdoor rink at Goat Hill. Beginning this fall, we expect to have up to 500 hours of much higher quality outdoor ice available for EHA teams.

As in past years, one of the primary responsibilities of Hockey Operations is to lead our tryout process at the beginning of the season. This year's tryout committee included Hockey Operations, two additional members from the EHA Board of Directors, and four association members at large including one that was new to the committee. The contributions of all committee members is truly appreciated, and participation on the committee is something I would encourage all interested association members to inquire about in future years. It is not only a way to fulfill volunteer requirements for the season, but a way to become actively involved in the operation of the association. The feedback received during the tryout process is invaluable in helping to move the association forward.

Our goals for tryouts remained unchanged from past years:

- 1. Evaluation process that is based on meaningful, objective criteria.
- 2. Develop and maintain a clear process that is marked by impartiality for all players.
- 3. Respectful consideration of all players.
- 4. Continuously improve our process from year to year.

We again hosted tryout information sessions to review the overall tryout process and collect questions and feedback from the association at large. The committee plans to continue these sessions and be as transparent as possible about the overall process, including sharing results from prior seasons. Pre-tryout sessions are open to the public and held to get our skaters and goalies back on the ice and familiar with the various drills that are evaluated during the skills portion of tryouts. For both skills and scrimmage evaluations, our process again included independent skater and goalie evaluators on a closed to the public basis. Independent evaluators and randomized processes to assure equal opportunity for all participants remain the foundations of Eagan Hockey tryouts. The committee continued to build on the data analysis tools available throughout the process to facilitate fair and efficient processes for team formation. As in past years, we used a variety of drills and scrimmage formats to evaluate skaters and goalies for all traveling teams.

Coach Selection Committees

Our coach selection committee includes Hockey Operations, Coach in Chief, and the level coordinators as outlined in the EHA Handbook. The committee worked hard to retain coaches from past seasons and attract new coaches across all levels. A combination of volunteer parents and paid coaches continues to serve the association well. We expect to continue to see increases in team numbers in the years ahead, and will focus even more effort on recruitment of additional coaches for the 2021-22 season.

Thanks to everyone for all you did this season for the association. I look forward to seeing you around the rink in a few short months.

EHA Pavilion Update – Mike Larson

In October of 2018, the EHA approached the City of Eagan with an idea to partner with them on a mini-sized, refrigerated rink as an experiment at Pilot Knob Park. That winter, a successful partnership provided a variety of experiences for both park users and EHA members. That partnership also inspired us to consider forming an even larger partnership.

In September of 2020, the EHA reached out to the Parks and Recreation Department to discuss the possibility of installing a covered, refrigerated rink at Goat Hill Park. The Pavilion would serve as a hockey rink from early November to early March with predictable ice. During the remaining months, The Pavilion would provide excellent space for events hosted by other youth organizations and/or by the City of Eagan.

In September of 2021, we broke ground with plans to complete the rink portion of the project by December of 2021. We were faced with a handful of hurdles including cold weather that forced us to put the project on hold until the spring of 2022. I'm happy to say that we are going strong again and will have a rink ready this fall! I encourage you to stop by and see the progress in person or visit the Eagan Hockey web page under the Fan Zone tab to find more information.

I can say without hesitation that we would not be as far along in the project as we are without the support of the City of Eagan and all of the fantastic contractors that have worked tirelessly to help us achieve our goal! A special thanks to all the volunteers that have helped and I look forward to working with more volunteers in the upcoming months as we continue to finish this project!

This investment is the result of considerable effort by EHA and the City of Eagan and will provide quality ice for future generations. Future phases include additional parking, a new warming house with a garage, and finally a pavilion covering the entire rink's surface.

We thank past board members and the entire association for their support in moving this exciting project forward.

Coach-In-Chief / Player Development – Jon Kerr

We had an outstanding group of both paid and parent coaches to serve our teams this year. By leveraging as many qualified parent coaches as possible and filling in the gaps with highly qualified paid coaches, our association thrived at all levels. We held several coach clinics throughout the season to train the coaches and share ideas amongst our coaching staff. We also held coach exit interviews at each level to discuss any improvements that can be made for next season.

Given the success our teams have had for the past two seasons, and the increase in skaters expected over the next few years, discussions are underway to make the transition back to AA hockey at both the pee wee and bantam levels. Our association moved from the AA to A level four years ago with the intention of returning to AA hockey in a few years time.

The Eagan high school players occasionally surprised the mini-mites at morning practices and attended indoor/outdoor jamborees, etc. We received a lot of great feedback from parents who enjoy seeing the older kids "give back" to the younger kids. We also began assigning high school players to traveling teams this season to occasionally help out at practice. We will look to build upon this next season.

Our annual 3v3 leagues in August for the pee wee and bantam levels continued as usual. The program has been very popular and is a great way to get back on the ice before tryouts. Special thanks to the parent volunteers who helped move boards between games for the zamboni, manage the score clock and manage the bench. These volunteer efforts help keep the 3v3 league very affordable for everyone.

We continued our relationship with CoachThem (www.coachthem.com) this season. CoachThem is a tool that allows coaches to create, edit, save, and share practice plans with other coaches within their team, level, and association. CoachThem continues to be the preferred platform for MN Hockey and its associations within.

We completed our second season using the gray and green practice jerseys for all travel teams. Please hang on to these practice jerseys over the summer. It is expected that players will return their washed practice jerseys on the first day of tryouts and choose a larger sized practice jersey each season as needed. Second year bantams can keep their practice jerseys.

Erik Anderson ran a checking clinic in September for first year bantams. Attendance was optional for second year bantams and many attended. This program allows players to gain confidence with body contact in a controlled environment and was well received. Erik Anderson also continued as our skating and skills instructor working with all of our players and coaches, improving both player and coaching skills. Devenir Goaltending continued this year as our goalie instructors.

Our dryland facilities made a comeback this season, however our treadmill room was unfortunately closed for the season due a lack of trainers available to run the equipment. We expect to have the treadmill room fully operational this summer for the treadmill program in August.

Our home ice summer program was operated by E-train this past season and we will be using them again in 2022. The older group (squirt/U10 and up), skated 3 days per week and had one day per week of dryland at the Training Haus. The same schedule is expected for the older group in 2022. The younger group (mites/mini-mites) skated one day per week and feedback received was to add more ice time. In 2022, the younger group will skate two days per week instead of one.

In summary, a very successful season for Eagan hockey both on and off the ice. Thanks to all the coaches and managers who put in a lot of hard work to make the association what it is.

Tournament Report – Christian Mondick and Christian Prouty

During the 2021-22 hockey season we were able to host 4 tournaments: Thanksgiving Shootout, Carter Weber Memorial Cup, Play for Patrick (co-host with Eastview Hockey Association) and the Bantam AA/A District Tournament. During the Thanksgiving Shootout we were in the first month of implementation of new game software (GameSheet) and we were able to successfully train volunteers as they were doing their first games. Due to our retiring in-house graphic designer, we locally sourced a new graphic designer, Two Nine Creative Design (Karyn Fuchs), to make the tournament programs and posters. Also, we locally sourced a new printer, Copyright Printing, to print our programs. Something new this season had EHA provide a Eagan Tournament Game Puck to each team, for every tournament game (to be given to their "player of the game"), as a Thank You for attending our Tournaments. This was a big hit with the kids playing in our tournaments.

Due to a system error, Thanksgiving Shootout registered 12 Bantam B2 teams playing instead of the original proposed 8 teams. This allowed new teams to come to the Thanksgiving Shootout that have previously never attended an Eagan Tournament. While this was exciting to have 12 teams (allowing for a new format), we will be going back to 8 Bantam Teams in 2022 - 2023. The standard format will be 8 Bantam B2 and 8 Pee Wee B2 going forward with Thanksgiving Shootout. One of the most unique aspects of Thanksgiving Shootout included the 3 player shootout at the end of each game for an additional point in the standings. Teams loved having the shootout at the end of each game regardless of the final score. Many parents commented how much fun the Shootout was and how unique it is to Eagan Hockey.

Our Carter Weber tournament had 8 Bantam B1 and 8 Pee Wee B1 teams which ran smoothly over new years weekend. Carter Weber had some returning Thanksgiving Shootout teams who were excited to attend another EHA Tournament

Play for Patrick Tournament came on the heels of the Carter Weber Tournament. We again were so appreciative of our volunteers as we had a full weekend on the East rink of AA Bantam games.

We wrapped up our tournament season with the District Tournament. We were able to host the Bantam A/AA tournament over the span of eight days in February. Of particular interest to Eagan Hockey is the Bantam A team was able to win the district tournament in front of the home crowd.

This was our eighth year partnering with the Eagan High School booster clubs to staff the tournament. Both the girls (Thanksgiving Shootout) and boys (Carter Weber) booster clubs did an excellent job of staffing the positions needed with enthusiastic players and knowledgeable parent volunteers. When we had volunteer shortages with EHA parents and/or Board members, the Eagan High School National Honor Society was able to run the penalty boxes, filling in the gap for the Bantam AA/A tournament (boys and girls high school booster clubs).

A special thank you to each volunteer and Board members who made these events run smoothly. Your extra efforts are much appreciated!

Our recommendation for next year as follows:

- 1. Plan early get advertisements for the tournaments out early so teams know to sign up. (June 1st would be an appropriate goal)
- 2. Ice Time continue to allocate any ice that the tournaments will not use back to EHA and to ensure it's being reallocated to EHA teams OR if no need exists for the extra ice to make an effort to utilize the ice time for open hockey.
- 3. Weather Policy add a weather policy to the program to avoid any surprises if weather arises
- 4. Hosting Districts It made a huge difference to be able to host district games exclusively on the West rink. Be sure to work with the ice scheduler early in the year to make sure this happens.
- 5. If applicable, work with a local coffee vendor to supply coffee at the games prior to 9am due to the rink not opening concessions.
- 6. Going forward, have some sort of championship gear for the winning team. T-shirts/Beanie hats were explored. Lead time would need to be considered and we suggest looping in Two Nine Graphic Design to design the logo used.

Girls Program - Eric Gundersen

For the 2021-2022 season we had a total of 122 girls registered with the Eagan Hockey Association, our numbers grew significantly over last year due to high numbers on the 6U level! We will continue our recruiting efforts to ensure the growth continues and also work to refine our program to maximize development for our players.

This season we took steps to bring our Co-Op closer together and start our program earlier. We merged our 6U/8U programs to begin the "SpartaCat" culture from the very start and the feedback we have received has been extremely positive from families of both associations. Many appreciated the split ice, the dual association coaches and, more importantly, the new friends our kids made throughout the season. The 2021-2022 season marked one of the largest enrollments in 6U with a total of 32 girls, in large part, to the recruitment efforts of Lindsey Greenlee, who managed the 6U program this year for us. She did an AMAZING JOB.

The 10U program, as in years past, was managed by Inver Grove Heights. For the 2021-2022 season we requested certain items to change to help enhance the experience and development of our players. The first was to bring back ice time from being 100% at VMCC to also include Eagan ice hours. This effort was two fold, one was to allow our families and kids to skate on their home ice through the life of association hockey and second, to allow for use of the dryland facilities for our teams. The end goal will continue to be 1 night a week, or 4 days a month, in Eagan during the season and we will look at the 2022-2023 season to bring more parity

to that goal. The other item was to ensure we started the season earlier to level out our ice hours to what a Squirt hockey player would experience within the Eagan Association. I am pleased to say that this season we closed the gap in ice hours and with the addition of Eagan ice this year our girls were able to enjoy a few skills sessions with Erik Anderson and Devenir Goaltenders, which are great value-adds to our kids' overall development. Our 10U program was competitive all year and our kids grew significantly.

The 12U program, as in years past, was managed by the Eagan Association. As with the 10U program we worked to integrate VMCC into the ice rotation where it was 100% Eagan Ice in the year prior. The goal of this was to allow our IGH families to continue to skate on their home ice throughout their association play. We will continue to refine to ensure we have at least 1 day a week in the season for ice at VMCC for the upcoming season. With the resurgence of COVID a couple initiatives were not available for this season. The big one was to have more integration with EHS Girls Hockey. We planned to have our 12U girls attend various EHS JV/Varsity practices and have Dan Wilson come lead practices throughout the year. The goal was to get the girls excited for EHS Hockey and start to see what that next level is like. For the upcoming season we should be able to finally start this program and hopefully it will make an impact on our players. I would be remiss not to mention that our 12UB1 team, lead by Ken Putt, made it to regionals this year and finished 3rd in districts, congrats to their great year!

15U saw a few changes to start the year, given the need for players at the EHS level, we were short to fill out our team, we took steps to find available players in the district and were able to enlist girls from Farmington to join our team for this season. We are thankful for their partnership and they were a terrific addition to the team all around! We also purchased new jerseys for the girls and hired a new head coach, Jessica Ptachick who played hockey at the highest levels and she was a terrific addition. Under her leadership the team made it to regional finals and only 1 goal away from the state tournament. As with the 12U program we had hoped for more integration with EHS to continue the effort to get our kids getting excited about the next level, with the COVID resurgence we again had to dial that goal back.

Our girls enjoyed a special event at the Women's Gopher Hockey Game where our 6U girls got to play on the ice at intermission and our whole program got tickets at a discounted price and recognition at the event. We attempted a USA vs Canada hockey game for the entire girls program and a fun Girls EHS hockey day but both of these events had to be canceled due to COVID resurgence. We will continue to look at these opportunities and add more throughout the upcoming year as these opportunities help build the love for the sport.

For the upcoming season we will continue to work with our IGH partners and build upon the momentum we had this year. We will continue to advocate for split ice at both locations for all levels, ensuring Dryland use at the 10U level, keeping ice hours and skills development equal across all levels, continue to search and find female coaches for our various levels, level 3x3 games for 10U, 12U and 15U, find and create opportunities for our kids to have fun and many more initiatives. Lastly, due to high demand, we will be looking to add a Jersey Program for the upcoming season where our kids can keep their jerseys and have their name on the back.

Overall our girls program made changes we feel will enhance player development, foster a love for the sport and most importantly, help create a culture that continues to create memories and friendships for our kids that will last a lifetime!

Mini Mite & Recruiting/Retention – Lindsay Greenlee

Our 2021/2022 season had amazing growth and numbers we have never seen as an association before. Mini mites had 12 teams and a total of 122 kids. In its first year our 6U coop program had a total of 45 girls. I believe the girls program will continue to grow as players and parents talk about the program in the coming years.

Obviously, the on-ice aspects are the focus for our Mini-Mites/6U. Another major component to the success of our younger programs is the "fun" other activities we offer our skaters. This year, we had hot dog hockey with no weather cancellations, outdoor jamboree, indoor jamboree and the end of the year party. Kids and parents alike enjoyed and raved about the fun events with great attention to detail.

We had such a large demand for our Little Wildcats program we had to split into two "sessions". We ended up with a total of 83 kids trying hockey for the first time! We had kids up to 5th grade joining and playing. We also were able to secure 100% of these kids into signing up and playing the 2021-2022 season. We were able to provide all of these kids with new free gear from Pure Hockey, which went very smoothly.

This was our fourth year for our Termites program. This is for kids who will be entering Kindergarten next year. While up from last year, we had 41 kids sign up. I believe we will have better numbers this year when schools are able to have back to school nights, etc again that we can advertise. Due to covid changes this year these events did not happen.

We had an awesome year, players, parents and coaches were happy and enjoyed their time. Thank you to all the coaches and team managers who made this season a success.

Mite - Dave Karsnia

For the 2021-2022 season, we had a record 96 players registered to play Mites. By comparison, we had 68 players registered in 2020-2021, 72 players in 2019-2020, 68 players in 2018-2019, and 77 players in 2017-2018. Therefore, Mite numbers have risen approximately 37% since last season. Due to recruiting efforts beginning three years ago, our 2nd graders were the first "wave" of higher numbers for the Mite level. Due to the increase from 36 to 48 players at the top level (Mite 3), the disparity in talent between the top players and bottom players was more apparent.

Early Season Evaluations and Team Formation: Pre-season evaluations were conducted to create balanced teams while keeping school of attendance and a balanced coaching staff in mind. The Mite program is divided into two levels depending on age and skill level determined through the preseason evaluation. The Mite 3

level was mainly 3rd graders and some advanced 2nd graders. Mite 2 was mainly 2nd graders and some beginner 3rd graders. Mite 3 was 66% 3rd graders and 34% 2nd graders this season compared to only 30% 2nd graders last season. Mite 2 was 79% 2nd graders and 21% 3rd graders this season. Both levels incorporated the USA Hockey American Development Model (ADM) recommendations on team sizes, practice format, and game structure.

USA Hockey Recommended Guidelines:

- 9-13 players per team and no full-time goalies
 - EHA Mite had 12 players per team with no full-time goalies
- Players grouped into top $\frac{1}{3}$, middle $\frac{1}{3}$, and beginner $\frac{1}{3}$ during practices
 - EHA Mite complied with three "sticker color" levels
- Utilize six small-area stations during practice for 1) more puck touches, 2) maximum ice utilization, 3) increased competition for all players, 4) fun for all participants
 - EHA Mite utilized six station practices with documented practice plans
- 30-60 players per session for a full sheet of ice
 - o EHA Mite had 48 players per session
- 50-60 ice touches per season
 - EHA Mite had 54 indoor sessions
- 16-20 cross-ice or half-ice games
 - EHA Mite had 16 half-ice games. Zero games were conducted on a full sheet of ice.
- Scores are kept on the scoreboard during games, but not posted.
 - EHA Mite kept score on the scoreboard during games, but did not post them on our website.
- 60-90 second shifts during games
 - EHA Mite shifts were 90 seconds
- Practice to rame ratio of roughly 3:1
 - EHA Mite had a 3:1 ratio when including outdoor practices

Ice-time Breakdown:

- Six indoor EHA Skate School sessions and 32 practices to total 38 indoor practices
- Nine outdoor practices
- Eight unstructured outdoor Hot Dog Hockey sessions
- 16 indoor half-ice games

Coaches: All Mite coaches were certified and registered through USA Hockey. Each team was led by a parent Head Coach and assigned at least two parent Assistant Coaches. Jason Oberhamer (Mite 2) and Dave Karsnia (Mite 3) acted as Lead Head Coaches and shared weekly practice plans for the remaining coaches. This setup works well for consistency in practice planning and on-ice leadership. I can't thank all of the head and assistant coaches enough for their dedication to teaching the fundamentals of the game to this group of kids.

Outside of Association Scrimmages: EHA Mite "swaps ice" with outside associations to eliminate any additional ice costs for scrimmages. With various Mite program structures within District 8, finding competitive games that benefit our player's development is difficult. District 8 has strict rules in place for playing outside of our District. Each Mite 2 team was able to play 4-5 outside associations and each Mite 3 team was able to play 5-6 outside associations this season. This compared to 2-3 outside associations last year (COVID) and six in 2019-2020. It is extremely difficult to find competitive matches at Mite 2 (Eastview was the best matchup). In the future, I would recommend in-house play at Mite 2 with the exception of playing

Eastview. For Mite 3, Eastview, Rosemount, Lakeville, Woodbury, and Prior Lake were competitive games for EHA.

Hot Dog Hockey: The ever-popular Hot Dog Hockey Friday family fun skates returned without any cancellations due to weather. One Mite team and two Mini Mite teams paired up to provide the food and beverages each week out of their team slush funds. Hot Dog Hockey is a great non-structured event providing additional ice touches for the Mites and helps build relationships between the skaters and parents as well. The outdoor bonfire pit continues to attract parents to the event to socialize.

Outdoor Jamboree: The City of Eagan did a phenomenal job getting the ice at Rahn Park ready for us in January. The four teams from each level were able to play the other three teams "back-to-back" on a beautiful Saturday afternoon. The smoke machine, music, and starting lineups accentuate this fun event. The Eagan High School Boys and Girls teams made an appearance to support EHA.

End of Year Mite Party: Due to the increased player numbers and turf not installed on the East rink, the party was divided into two sessions- Mini-Mite and Mite. Each level was able to have 1.75 hours of open skating on the West rink, knee hockey in the dryland room, and food/drinks served in the mezzanine. Thank you to the Special Events Coordinator for her work with the Outdoor Jamboree, End of Year Mite Party, and Indoor Paw Power Jamboree.

Indoor Paw Power Jamboree: The Paw Power Jamboree is the highlight of the season. All four teams from each level play the other three teams at Eagan Civic Arena. The players are treated as top-notch hockey players (smoke machine, light show, starting lineups with spotlights) to start the games and given t-shirts after the games. The excitement by the players for this final event concludes the season on a positive note.

Next Season: We are estimating approximately 115 Mite players next season. This increase in players will require an increase of two teams for a total of 10 teams next season. To minimize impact to the skill level at Mite 3 and due to scheduling logistics, I recommend six Mite 2 teams and four Mite 3 teams next season. This will require an increase in icetime from 2 hours to 2.5 hours of ice per session. With increased numbers at Mini-Mite, I assume they will need 2.5 hours of ice per session next year as well. With the addition of the EHA Pavalion's outdoor refrigerated ice next season, I recommend that the Wednesday night session be moved to the Pavilion to fulfill the Mite ice needs while reducing impact to travel team indoor practice needs.

Summary: In summary, I feel Mite was able to have consistency again without COVID restrictions this season. EHA Mite players were given plenty of opportunity to develop if they chose to partake in the scheduled events. Mite accomplished the opportunity to get exercise, see/meet friends, develop sportsmanship, develop teamwork, develop self-confidence, and have fun following the EHA Mission. Many thanks to the coaches, managers, and parents who volunteered time to make the season a success. Every volunteer hour is meaningful, and the success of the program would not be as great without your help. Thank you!

Squirt Program - Luke Cahill

EHA fielded five Squirt teams during the 2021-2022 season. Each team comprised 11-13 skaters (58 skaters total) and six goalies were dispersed among the five teams. EHA went with a SA, SB1, SB2 Green, SB2 Blue and SC.

A successful in-house pre-season EHA 3on3 league in September set the tone for the official start of the season in October. 
