Dear Panther Alumni,

With the holidays just behind us, I want to wish you *Happy New Year*! BHS has had a productive fall semester, and we are looking forward to a spring semester that is just as dynamic.

In October 2015, we celebrated the upgrade that our library received through a generous donation by *Salesforce* founder and chairman, Marc Benioff (class of 1982), to honor his most influential teachers, Thomas Willard (who taught at BHS from 1970-2006) and Walter Saito (1969-1999). This updated look took form in the new BHS Library Learning Lab, our computer lab that has been re-configured with latest computers and student stations. Since the opening of this new learning area, we have seen a surge in the student use of our library.

Our long-awaited new academic building will be alive with students in January 2015. Recent tours of the new building have generated a great deal of excitement among students and staff in seeing spaces that will accommodate the Culinary Arts program, computer software classes such as Architectural Design and Computer Science, and specialized programs such as our Adult Transitions class. This addition to our campus enhances the academic possibilities for our students.

These new facilities represent a joint effort by our local community, alumni, district, and school staff to create new learning spaces for our students. I am grateful for this strong support because a school community's commitment to its school creates a culture of excellence, as evidenced by the 2016 Niche rankings of best schools. Burlingame High School ranked above the other schools in our district in national (#371) and state (#42) rankings. In the SF metro area, BHS was among the top ten.

The announcer ironically was there during that 1965 season as a reporter for the Times and was the perfect person to acknowledge this team's undefeated season.

The 1965 team won their games decisively. Going 9-0 overall and 6-0 in League play. In fact Mills, (the #2 team) went 5-1 that year losing to BHS 48-13. The Panthers scored 255 points while only giving up 71, this while playing the backups much of the time. The team's average score per game was 28 to 7. Prior to the 1965 team, Burlingame had not won the Little Big game for the previous 6 years, until the 1965 team beat the Bearcats 20-0 in a mud bowl at home on Thanksgiving Day.

BHS football alumni also joined in honoring these men. In a heartfelt tribute to the past, players got up and recounted their winning season with great stories of the camaraderie they shared in achieving this honor while playing at Burlingame High School. Each player took us back 50 years and showed the friendships that were forged back then are as strong today. They recounted the blessing of good coaching and shared stories of Coaches; Bob Lightcap, Bob Booker and Ron Anderson. As one of the alumni stated, "Most of these guys look like they could play today".

The players also reminded the cheerleaders of the important role they played. Each received pre-game signs at their house before the game. How they looked forward each week to getting those signs for inspiration.

Cheerleader Colleen Cookson and Patty Panther Nancy Chandler showed their spirit, providing a special treat for those players in attendance by making signs like they did before each game to fire them up. They presented an updated sign to each player, which really capped off the night perfectly.



Derek Barton Class of 1970



After graduating from Burlingame High School in 1970, Derek attended the College of San Mateo for 2 years then transferred to San Diego State. His 16th hole play-by-play commentary at the Andy Williams San Diego Open during his last year of college propelled him into Show Biz. In 1975, Derek was hired by KTOM Radio and soon became the most popular DJ in Salinas, Monterey, Carmel and Santa Cruz. Derek moved to Hollywood in 1977 and proved he had more than just a voice. He became an actor, stuntman, writer and comedian, and he continues to use his voice in commercials, cartoons, movies and television shows.



Besides crashing cars and jumping out of windows on fire, Derek guest-starred on such shows as *Hill Street Blues*, *The Fall Guy* and *V*. He wrote a one-act play entitled *The Stand-up* that was produced at the Beverly Hills Playhouse. Since then he has written a full-length play, two TV

episodes, a pilot, three screenplays, some award winning poetry and a children's story.

Derek has performed stand-up comedy at such renowned venues as The Comedy Store, The Improv and the Friars Club in Beverly Hills. He also M.C.'s many events locally and around the country.

From 1982 to 1999, Derek was the manager and shortstop on the infamous Coney Island Whitefish softball team in the Hollywood Show Biz League. The Whitefish also played outside their league in numerous charity games. Some of his fellow actor friends on the team were Billy Crystal, Chris Guest and Rob Reiner.



In 1985, Derek's entertainment background landed him a job at the largest co-ed gym chain in the world, Gold's Gym. He started as the head of the Gold's Motion Picture and Television Division, which he innovated. The Motion Picture and Television Division promoted Gold's clientele and products in television, feature films, commercials and print. This unique service formed the basis for one of the answers on the popular game show, "Jeopardy."



From the success of the Motion Picture & Television Division at Gold's Gym, Derek became the Senior Vice-President of Marketing and helped build Gold's Gym International into one of the most respected and recognized brands in the fitness industry. During his two-decade tenure, Gold's Gym received numerous

awards and accolades for its innovative marketing, with many ads being reprinted in advertising and educational textbooks. In 2005, marking his 20th year of building and protecting an American Icon, Derek and Gold's Gym were featured in America's Greatest Brands book.



2006. Derek formed Barton Productions, a marketing consulting company based in Los Angeles, which helps its clients become more valuable and meaningful by differentiating themselves from competitors through improved branding, advertising and service. Derek is widely customer published in industry magazines and continues to be a much sought after public speaker on branding, advertising and customer service.




