## 2023 Minors Playoff Rules (June 9th - 26th)

- 1. Teams must play with a minimum of 7 players. Teams can only call across players if they have less than 7 players.
- 2. All pitchers must pitch from the rubber on the mound at all times. There is no "chalk line" used in playoff games.
- 3. The pitcher does not have to be replaced after 3 consecutive walks.
- 4. All players must sit one inning (3 defensive outs) before any player sits twice as stated in the house league rules. The only exception is a player pitching consecutive innings. In this situation, the pitcher must sit (3 defensive outs) after they leave the mound.
- 5. The umpire will declare the last inning as an open inning with a maximum of 10 runs per team. The open inning will be the first inning after 1 hour and 30 minutes from first pitch. All other innings will conclude at 5 runs or 3 outs.
- 6. If after 4 innings the visiting team or 3 ½ innings the home team is ahead by 10 runs the game is final. This may mean that no open inning is played. This is Little League Rule (4.10(e)).
- 7. No extra innings will be played in Round Robin games. Round Robin games can end in a tie. Extra innings will be played in the quarterfinals, semifinals, and championship games.
- 8. Ties in Round Robin standings will be broken by the following rules to determine which team places higher
  - a. Head-to-head Round Robin record of the teams involved in the tie
  - b. Runs Allowed Ratio (RAR): Number of runs allowed divided by number of defensive innings played. The team(s) with the lower RAR will advance.
- 9. Following the Round Robin, the top four teams from each division will advance to the quarterfinals in a crossover format.
- 10. The winners of the quarterfinal games will advance to the semifinals, and winners of semifinals will advance to the championship game.
- 11. The home team for quarterfinal and semifinal games will be the higher-seeded teams from the round robin.
- 12. The home team for the championship game will be determined by the best winloss record of all playoff games, then Runs Allowed Ratio if both teams have the same record.
