Conestoga Rugby Club, founded in 1971, is the oldest high school-affiliated rugby program in the United States. Based in Berwyn, PA, the club serves Conestoga High School and the surrounding community, operating as a nonprofit registered with Rugby Pennsylvania and USA Rugby. The club fields a U19 Boys team (players born on or after September 1, 2006) competing in Division 1 of Pennsylvania high school rugby.

The Head Coach leads the U19 Boys Rugby program, overseeing coaching, player development, and team management throughout the competitive season.

Purpose

Provide leadership, coaching expertise, and mentorship to the U19 Boys Rugby team, fostering a culture of excellence, sportsmanship, and personal development.

Key Responsibilities

Leadership & Vision

- Establish and communicate team vision, values, and standards
- Model exemplary behavior and sportsmanship
- Build strong relationships with players, staff, parents, and club leadership
- Inspire and motivate players to reach their potential
- Assume responsibility for team performance and player conduct

Coaching & Player Development

- Design and implement comprehensive training programs
- Lead all team practices with age-appropriate methods
- Develop individualized player development plans
- Teach proper rugby techniques and safety protocols
- Foster understanding of the Laws of the Game
- Encourage tactical awareness and game intelligence
- Provide constructive feedback and mentorship

- Ensure compliance with Rugby Pennsylvania and USA Rugby requirements
- Oversee team selection and match lineups

- Work with Club leadership to ensure completion of required paperwork and physicals
- Oversee equipment distribution and inventory

- Coordinate competition schedules and rule compliance
- Participate in coach development and professional growth
- Maintain records: training plans, match reports, evaluations, incidents
- Support fundraising, outreach, and promotional activities

Communication & Community Relations

- Maintain open communication with players, parents, and administration
- Conduct parent/player meetings as required
- Represent the club professionally at all events
- Foster positive relationships with coaches, officials, and the rugby community
- Promote rugby and the club within the school and local community
- Collaborate with volunteers and event coordinators

Discipline & Standards

- Establish and enforce team protocols and disciplinary procedures
- Address breaches of conduct promptly and fairly
- Ensure discipline on and off the field
- Promote respect among all participants

- Current SafeSport Training certification (annual)
- USA Rugby Background Check (valid for two years)

- Experience working with teenage athletes (ages 14–18)
- Proven track record in player skill and tactical development

- Matches: Weekend fixtures (home and away)
- Additional: Pre-season planning, meetings, professional development
- Must be available for all scheduled activities

Working Conditions

- Outdoor work in various weather
- Physical demands: demonstrating techniques, standing, active supervision
- Evening and weekend hours required
- Travel to away fixtures within Pennsylvania

- Ensure team and player compliance before competition
- Adhere to all relevant policies (USA Rugby, Rugby Pennsylvania, PIAA, School District)

- Complete annual SafeSport training and biennial background checks
