Philosophy

This is aimed at ensuring an equal and fun atmosphere that offers a positive learning experience for all that are involved. It is important that the fundamentals of the game are taught in a way that allows for participants to learn and develop in a competitively relaxed setting.

Our Expectations for Coaches

- Insist that your players & fans demonstrate good sportsmanship toward the opposing team and the officials.
- Insist that all of your players demonstrate grace in winning & dignity in losing.
- Do not teach, tolerate, or allow taunting of other teams, "trash talking," or foul language at any point.
- LEAD BY EXAMPLE: Compliment good plays by opposing players and do not get confrontational with officials, coaches, players, or fans.

Mandatory Reporting Policy

• All coaches who are a part of Hall County Parks & Leisure are responsible to report any reasonable suspicion or knowledge of abuse to minors, including inappropriate touching, sexual or physical abuse, child endangerment, or neglect to Hall County Risk Department or an Immediate Supervisor or League Director.

 All Coaches are subject to this and is a mandatory policy to agree to once becoming a coach for Hall County Parks & Leisure

Zero Tolerance Policy

- The Zero Tolerance Policy is in effect for the entire season.
- This includes all coaches, athletes, and fans.
- Anyone that is ejected from a game is
 automatically ineligible to be at the next
 game. Further suspension will be reviewed and
 decided by HCPL staff.
- A second offense will result in a suspension for the remainder of the season.
- Coaches are responsible for their team's parents.

Background Checks

- We will require all coaches are on teams complete a full background check through NAYS.
- Go to <u>www.nays.</u>org and create your coaches profile where it says register.
 - Page1: Fill out all required information to create an account and select youth sports coach.
 - Page 2: Fill out all required information and select what age group that you will be coaching.
 - Page 3: Select Hall Co. Parks & Leisure for affiliated organization, once selected, Select NAYS coach at bottom of page.
 - Once steps are completed, go back to dashboard and press Background Check. We will pay for background check itself but will be unable to pay for any additional trainings that NAYS offers.
 - Once background check is selected you may checkout and submit consent to have the background check take place.

Bench Rules

- Only approved coaches or scorekeepers will be allowed in the bench area.
- Each team is allowed one head coach, one assistant coach, and a scorekeeper to be present in the bench area.
- Anyone that does not have a BGC on file with HCPL will not be allowed in the bench area.

- Week of November 28th Game Schedule Begins (Rec 4th-8th)
- Game schedule will go through 12/20 and then break for Christmas and New Years (will resume after the first of the year).

Recreational League Philosophy

It is important that the fundamentals of the game are taught in a way that allows for participants to learn and develop in a competitively relaxed setting.

Game Time Layout

- Games will be scheduled on 1 hour, 15 minute time blocks
- Games will be 1 hour.
- The time blocks will be as follows:
 - Weekdays
 - × 5:45-7:00
 - × 7:00-8:15
 - × 8:15-9:30

Saturdays

- × 9:00 10:15
- × 10:15 11:30
- × 11:30 **-** 12:45
- × 12:45 2:00
- × 2:00 3:15
- × 3:15 4:30
- (this could be extended if needed)

Game Schedule Outline

- Game schedule will begin the week of 11/13.
- K-3rd Grades should conclude by Mid-February
- 4th-8th Grades should conclude by the end of January or early February

Recreational League Outlines

K – 3rd Grade

- Will play primarily on Saturdays until older age groups finish games. They could possibly conclude with a few week day games if needed.

4th – 5th Grades

- Will play weekday games on a Tuesday/Friday Set-up.

6th-8th Grades

- Will play Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, or Friday.

Uniforms

- NBA replicas will be used for all Recreational League teams.
- Elite teams must supply their own uniforms, but must adhere to the uniform stipulations set forth by HCPL. No taping of numbers are allowed. (See Complete Rules and Regulations for details)
 - Legal Numbers 0-5 or any combination of it.
- Home teams will wear the white/light side of their jersey. Away teams will be the darker side.

- New Rule; Teams can start the game with four players. There is no grace period, game time is game time.
- K-5th Grade Boys will use a 28.5 basketball; 6th-8th Boys will use a 29.5
- For all divisions, the scoreboard will remain on regardless of the score (no resetting of score).
- After the 3rd quarter has elapsed and there is a 30-point lead by a team the clock will run continuously except for injuries & timeouts (see mercy rule).

- K-1st − 3 point arc press in effect
 - Players will have 15 sec. from the time the ball is in-bounded to break the three-point line.
 - Defense can come out after the ball breaks the three-point line.
- 2nd-3rd Half court press in effect
- K-3rd Fast break rule
 - No passing up court to gain advantage, dribbling fast breaks are allowed.
- K-3rd Correctable violations in the backcourt.
 - If a ball does role out of bounds in the backcourt, it will result in a turnover.

- Half Court Press − 2nd − 3rd Grades Only
- One coach is allowed on the court for Kindergarten and 1st Grade.
 - Coaches must stay between the time lines.
 - No coaches under the basket at anytime.
- Full Court Press 4th 8th Grade Rec and All Elite
 - If one team gains a 15 point advantage, they will not be allowed to full court press (Recreation League Only)

• Overtime:

- No overtime in the Recreational League.
- Elite Only 2 minute overtime. If the game is still tied after the two minute overtime, the game will finish with a sudden death overtime. First team to score will win. Free-throws do count as a scoring play.
- Elite League will follow this format until there is a winner, regardless of the time limit.
- Teams in overtime will only receive one timeout. NO timeouts will be carried over from regulation. No timeouts in sudden death overtime.

- Free throw players can move on release
- 3-Point Shots
 - Will count for all age groups
 - If fouled while attempting a 3 point shot, they will receive 3 free-throws

Equal Playing Time

- Players must play one full quarter in the 1st half (10 minutes required) and part of a quarter in the 2nd half of the game (5 minutes required).
- Although this is our baseline rule, we encourage that all players get as much playing time as possible and that it done equally across all players.
