# TALKING POINTS

### **USA VS. CZECH REPUBLIC**

The U.S. National Under-18 Team squares off against the Czech Republic in its third game of the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament at 7 a.m. ET in Sochi, Russia.

Alex Turcotte (Island Lake, Ill.) scored a pair of goals and Trevor Zegras (Bedford, N.Y.) added a third-period tally as the U.S. National Under-18 Team earned its first victory at the tournament with a 3-2 win over Finland on Thursday.

Turcotte, whose wrist shot from the slot with 4 minutes, 59 seconds to play in the final frame resulted in the game-winner, holds a team-high three goals across the first two games of the tournament.

Turcotte's first goal of the game, which came with less than one second to play in the first period, leveled the score after 20 minutes.

Zegras, who tracked down a loose puck at the edge of the crease before he slotted it into the back of the net, gave the U18s the lead early in the final frame. It marked Zegras' second goal of the tournament.

Finland responded with the extra attacker with 57 seconds to play in regulation, but Team USA staved off the late rush to seal the win.

**Spencer Knight** (Darien, Conn.) stopped 35 of 37 shots to earn the victory.

The Czech Republic enters the Friday tilt with a 1-2-0 mark across its first three games of the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament. The Czechs picked up a 6-3 over Finland in their opener before consecutive losses against Russia (5-1) and Sweden (4-3).

The U.S. National Under-18 Team last faced the Czech Republic at the 2018

Under-18 Five Nations Cup in Kravaře, Czech Republic. Team USA won the group-stage match by a 5-2 final.

Jack Hughes (Orlando, Fla.), who did not travel with the U18s to Sochi, delivered a five-point effort in the victory over the Czechs in November. Zegras and Cole Caufield (Stevens Point, Wis.) also tallied goals for Team USA.

**Cameron Rowe** (Wilmette, Ill.) stopped 15 of 17 shots in the win.

The Czechs posted a 2-2 record in Kravaře. Jonáš Peterek and Adam Raška recorded the two goals in the head-to-head matchup against Team USA.

Michal Teplý, who entered the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament with a team-high 20 points (5-15-20) across all international competitions for the Czechs, delivered a hat trick in a 6-3 win over Finland to kick off the event.

Teplý is ranked 14th among European skaters by the NHL's Central Scouting Bureau.

Lukas Rousek (No. 36), Karel Plasek (No. 38) and Adam Najman (No. 39) round out top-50 European skaters for the Czechs, while Lukas Parik holds the No. 4 ranking among European goaltenders.

### **PLAYER ADDITION**

**Josh Groll** (San Diego, Calif.) will join the U.S. National Under-18 Team for the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament.

Groll is a first-year member of the Chicago Steel (USHL) and owns six goals and 11 points across 35 games. The 5-foot-10, 174-pound forward is committed to the University of Michigan.

# TALKING POINTS CONTINUED ...

### **CENTRAL SCOUTING RANKINGS**

Twenty players currently on the U.S. National Under-18 Team roster and two former NTDP players were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting Bureau's Midterm Rankings for the 2019 NHL Entry Draft.

Players listed as possible first-round selections include forwards **Jack Hughes** (Orlando, Fla.) at No. 1, **Alex Turcotte** (Island Lake, III.) at No. 5, **Matthew Boldy** (Millis, Mass.) at No. 6, **Trevor Zegras** (Bedford, N.Y.) at No. 7, defenseman **Cam York** (Anaheim Hills, Calif.) at No. 12, forward **Cole Caufield** (Stevens Point, Wis.) at No. 15 and defenseman **Alex Vlasic** (Wilmette, III.) at No. 25.

In addition, goaltender **Spencer Knight** (Darien, Conn.) is rated as the topranked North American prospect among eligible goaltenders and **Cameron Rowe** (Wilmette, III.) is rated fourth. Skaters rated in the second round include defensemen **Henry Thrun** (Southborough Mass.) at No. 32 **Draw** 

include defensemen Henry Thrun (Southborough, Mass.) at No. 32, Drew Helleson (Farmington, Minn.) at No. 33, Marshall Warren (Laurel Hollow, N.Y.) at No. 39 and Case McCarthy (Clarence Center, N.Y.) at No. 41. Also rated as second-round selections are forwards Judd Caulfield (Grand Forks, N.D.) at No. 50 and John Beecher (Elmira, N.Y.) at No. 53.

Third-round selections include **Owen Lindmark** (Naperville, III.) at No. 65 and defenseman **Domenick Fensore** (Thornwood, N.Y.) at No. 89.

Forwards **Patrick Moynihan** (Millis, Mass.) and **Michael Gildon** (Plano, Texas) are rated at 102 and 118, respectively, as fourth-round projections. **Danny Weight** (Lattingtown, N.Y.) is rated in the sixth round, 166th overall.

## **TOURNAMENT DETAILS**

Each team will compete in four matchups at the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament. Points will be awarded for regulation wins (3), overtime wins (2) and overtime losses (1).

## **U18 FIVE NATIONS HISTORY**

The Under-18 Four or Five Nations Tournaments are held twice per season. The NTDP's Under-18 teams have placed first in at least one of the events in every season dating back to the 2007-08 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament in Most, Czech Republic.

Team USA claimed its most recent title at the Under-18 Five Nations Tournament in November in Kravaře, Czech Republic.

In total, U.S. National Under-18 teams have won the Four or Five Nations Tournaments 22 times since the start of the 1999-00 season.

# COACHING STAFF AT U18 FIVE NATIONS TOURNAMENT

John Wroblewski (Neenah, Wis.) will lead the U.S. National Under-18 Team at the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament. Associate coach Dan Hinote (Elk River, Minn.), intern assistant coach Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.) and goaltending coach Thomas Speer (Sancsville, Wis.) join Wroblewski behind the bench, while Joseph Bonnett (Colorado Springs, Colo.) has been added to the staff as a team leader.

#### **TEAM USA CAPTAIN**

Matthew Boldy, Alex Turcotte and Marshall Warren will serve as rotating captains for the duration of the 2019 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament.

### LAST YEAR ...

The U.S. National Under-18 Team earned first-place finishes at both Five Nations Tournaments, held in Hämeenlinna, Finland, and Plymouth, Michigan, respectively.

Despite a regulation loss to Sweden and shootout losses to Switzerland and Finland, the U18s claimed a tie for first place after a 3-0 win over the Czech Republic in their final game of the tournament in Finland.

Last year's group of U18s went on to capture the Five Nations title for a second time on home ice in February 2018 at USA Hockey Arena. Team USA defeated Sweden (5-1) and Russia (5-4) before it secured a 4-0 victory over Finland to seal the first-place finish. Team captain and current Buffalo Sabres prospect Mattias Samuelsson accepted the trophy for the U18s.

### **ABOUT THE NTDP**

The pinnacle of amateur player development in the U.S., the NTDP scouts and selects the top 23 players in two age groups (Under-17 and Under-18) to train and develop in a highly competitive two-year program.

The teams (Under-17 and Under-18) face a rigorous domestic schedule, including competition against older, more developed players.

The U17s play a majority of a 60-game junior schedule in the USHL, while the U18s face USHL, NCAA Division I and III opponents. Both squads also compete in several international events each season.

Additionally, the players face a daily routine of off-ice development that includes strength training, crosstraining, cognitive skill testing and academics.
