Although softball experience is helpful, your desire to learn the game and become a positive contributor to the league is even greater. Here is a summary of the responsibilities for a SLZGSL coach.

- Demonstrate Sportsmanship
  - Applaud good plays no matter who makes them encourage your team to do the same.
  - Place the emotional and physical well-being of the players ahead of any personal desire to win.
  - Keep your comments positive. Don't bad-mouth coaches, players, or game officials. Remember your players are always watching and are always in ear shot of what you say.
- Create a fun and safe environment
  - Ensure positive/fair play opportunities for every player.
  - Be enthusiastic and encourage your players to have a good time.
  - Assist other team staff members in fulfilling their roles.
- Learn the rules
  - Read and understand the SLZGSL modified rules.
  - Familiarize yourself with the USA Softball Official rules.
  - Attends staff development meetings, clinics, and other professional activities to improve coaching performance.
- Organize & Conduct well planned practices
  - Practices should be planned so you can focus on skills needed in the game of softball.
  - Provide effective practice drills focusing on fundamentals.
- Teach the Basics
  - Hitting, Throwing, Catching, Fielding, Baserunning are all areas that should be taught.
  - Keep in mind, players will not learn everything in one season much less one practice.
- Be prepared for Game Days.
  - Spend time preparing your line up ahead of game time.
  - Create a warm up routine for your players to follow ahead of games.
  - Work with the team staff so that everyone is on the same page and can help the team be prepared for the game.
