

In 1978, 15 men participated in the very first IRONMAN triathlon on the bustling streets of Honolulu, Hawaii. IRONMAN consists of a 2.4-mile swim, a 112-mile bike and a 26.2-mile run, in succession. This event serves as one of the many qualifying events across the globe for the IRONMAN World Championship in Kailua-Kona, Hawaii every October.

In the bucolic college town of Madison, Wisconsin visitors can enjoy walks through the downtown area and the University of Wisconsin campus. State Street is a bustling small-town destination, providing a range of restaurants, shops, and galleries. The Madison Saturday farmer's market gives athletes and their supporters yet another way to enjoy this rural location with big-city culture.

The one-loop swim takes place in Lake Monona in downtown Madison. Spectators will have a panoramic view of the swim from the Monona Terrace, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. The bike course takes riders 16 miles out of town before beginning two 40-mile loops in rural Dane County. The course offers many tough climbs and turns throughout, but athletes will get a lift as they pass through the crowds at the Verona Loop Festival.

Spectator support on the run course is legendary among the IRONMAN race circuit. Athletes will complete two loops, including downtown Madison, the University of Wisconsin campus, Camp Randall Stadium, State Street and the scenic path alongside Lake Mendota.

PARKING & SHUTTLE

Parking is available at the Alliant Energy Center on Sunday, September 10. There is an \$8 parking fee (cash or card is accepted). Complimentary shuttles will run between the Alliant Energy Center and the intersection of S Fairchild St and W Main St, from 4 AM to 1 AM (Monday). Shuttles will run approximately every 15 minutes during peak times and every 20 to 30 minutes during "slower" times.

There will also be a complimentary shuttle for spectators to view the bike course. The shuttle will circle between Verona Loop Festival and the intersection of S Carroll St and E Wilson St. These shuttles will run from 8 AM to 5 PM approximately every 20 to 30 minutes.

CELEBRATION DAY

The IRONMAN Wisconsin Celebration Breakfast will be on Monday, September 11 from 8:30 AM to 10 AM in the Monona Terrace Ballroom A, B, C & D. Admission is free for everyone; breakfast is free for athletes. Please do not remove your athlete wristband prior to the function, as it is your athlete identification. Food tickets will be available for purchase for friends and family at the Information Tent during IRONMAN Village hours and also at Celebration Day.

The IRONMAN Wisconsin Awards Ceremony will begin at 9:30 AM. Awards will be given to the top five finishers in each age group (male and female). The 2024 VinFast IRONMAN World Championship Slot Allocation/Rolldown will begin immediately following the Awards Ceremony.
