

Greg Kampe-Over 45 years as a head coach. This year he led Oakland University to an upset win over Kentucky in the NCAA tournament. In the 2nd Round, he lost to North Carolina State in overtime. I have been going to coaching clinics for over 60 years and I can tell you he is one of the best clinic speakers I have ever heard. You will learn a ton from Coach Kampe

Doug Gottlieb-New coach at UW-Green Bay. Outstanding broadcaster who has worked for ESPN, CBS, Turner Sports and Fox Sports. He hosted one of the most popular podcasts in America. He is very controversial. Coaches will have a chance to ask him questions the last ten minutes of his presentation.

Donte Jackson-Milwaukee born and head coach of Grambling State. In 2024, he led the Tigers to their first SWAC tournament championship in program history and their first ever NCAA Division 1 men's basketball tournament. One of the best young coaches in America.

Sharif Chambliss-UW-Wisconsin assistant coach. He was a great high school player out of Racine, Wisconsin. He scored over 1107 points in his college career where he played for Penn State and Wisconsin. In all my years of coaching, I don't think I have met a better guy than Sharif Chambliss. He is one of the best!

Tara Van Derveer-Recently retired as Stanford University's women's basketball coach, she is the all-time winningest coach in women's college basketball history. She will appear by "zoom" for a one-hour session.

High School Coaches-We have a tremendous line-up of high school coaches, many of whom have won state championships.

Two Former Mr. Basketball's from Wisconsin

Sam Hauser and Brandin Podziemski, both of whom had outstanding NBA seasons. Sam played a huge role in the Boston Celtics NBA Championship. Brandin was 1st Team on the NBA Rookie Team and plays for the Golden State Warriors. The WBCA is so proud of both of these young men!

Priorities of the WBCA

The three most important priorities of the WBCA are the following: (1) The implementation of the shot clock in the state. 27 states have it at the present time. WBCA Girls All-Star Games 2024

The 42nd annual WBCA Girl's All-Star games were held on June 26, 2024 at JustAGame fieldhouse in Wisconsin Dells. Thanks to everyone for their efforts in making these All-Star Games the very best. This year the participants did a great job of representing their schools and communities. The WBCA appreciated the conduct of everyone in making the games a success. They did an outstanding job in raising money for our charities. Those charities being: MACC fund, Camp Waubeek, Ronald McDonald House of Madison, Garding Against Cancer, and Hometown Heroes. Moneys donated to these organizations will be used to help disadvantaged children and used in treatment for young cancer patients throughout Wisconsin and the world.

We would like to recognize the top fund raisers this year for their efforts in raising money for our charities. Top fundraiser was Sydney Whitehouse from Green Bay Notre Dame High School with \$7802. Our second-place fundraiser was Olivia Fietz from Fall River High School with \$5000.

We did have the inaugural 3-point contest this year. We had 2 representatives from each team in the preliminary round on Monday night. That was narrowed down to the top 4 by points. Then on Wednesday at the half time of the Division 3 game we had the semifinals with the top 2 making the finals. The finals were held at the half time of the Division 2 game. The two in the finals were Adrianna Gonzalez from Indian Trail High School and Madolyn Haffner from Gresham High School. Madalyn prevailed by the score of 17 to 16. Congratulations to all the girls who participated in this inaugural event.

Here is the recap of the five games played this year.

Division 5 Game: The South defeated the North by the score of 78 to 52. The South was led by Coryn Fromm from Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah with 29 points. Coryn knocked down 5 three-pointers. The North was led by Mackenzie Tarman from Turtle Lake with 12 points.

Division 4 Game: A dominating first quarter helped the North score an 80-68 win over the South in the Division 4 Girls All-Star Game. North raced to a 31-9 advantage after one quarter, helped by 10 points from Paris Opelt of Neillsville, who finished with a game-high 20 points. Ashley Chilson from Regis added 13 points and Emily Cooper of McDonell Central added 12 points. Three players hit double figures for the South. Lindsey Schadewalt of New Glarus and Erin Knowles of Boscobel tied for team-high honors with 13 points, while Westfield's Carly Drew added 12 points.

Division 3 Game: The North Division 3 girls All-Star Team topped the South 63-48. Molly Janke of Ellsworth led three players in double figures with 21 points. Alyssa Wirth of Altoona chipped in with 12 while Lucy Belisle of Saint Croix Falls scored 10. Gracie Gopalan from Waupun was the top scorer for the South with nine points.

Division 2 Game: After a slow start, the North Division 2 girls team pulled away for a 56-37 win over the South squad. Notre Dame's Sydney Whitehouse scored a game-high 17 points. Addison Pytleski of Green Bay Southwest added nine points, including seven in the second half. McFarland's Hailey Testolin led the South team with 9 points.

Division 1 Game: The South dominated the Division 1 girls All-Star Game, posting a 94-51 victory. Adriana Gonzalez of Kenosha Indian Trail led all scorers with 24 points, while Verona's Reagan Briggs added 21 points. Alayna West of Madison La Follette chipped in with 17 points for the South squad. Germantown's Lucy Leininger was the only North team member to reach double figures, scoring 14 points.

Book Bits

Over the years, I have taken to a love of reading. Those of you who also enjoy reading can appreciate what it does for people, including giving you the chance to read from a different perspective, learn new ideas and become inspired. I have read several books that applied directly to coaching and in this Book Bits section, I take portions from books that I read and hope it can apply to you in some way.

These are excerpts from *Know Yourself as a Coach* by Denny Kuiper, specifically the “2nd Quarter, Examine Yourself as a Person.”

Chapter 5 What Defines You?

Coaches sometimes define themselves by wins and losses or their title as coach. They thrive in an environment where they are the center of attention, where conversation is about their profession, and where anything outside that realm seems a distraction. What coaches do is important. They teach young people many life skills. Do not take yourself too seriously and do try to cultivate the whole person rather than simply the coach. Coaches need to broaden their sphere of interest, invest in relationships with people outside the field of sport, and in themselves, valuing the person as well as the coach.

Chapter 6 Are You Healthy?

You cannot be a successful coach for a long period of time unless you are healthy. Health, both physical and emotional, affects coaching performance.

Look at your physical well-being. Are you getting enough sleep? Are you eating properly? Are you exercising?

Emotional issues surface in the coaching ranks frequently because the position is under public scrutiny. Begin your day with five minutes of quiet introspection, sit still, close your eyes, and relax. Focus on your breathing and let the world become simple and peaceful.

Healthy people create healthy programs. Ask yourself as a coach, “Would I want to play for me?”

Chapter 7 What’s Your Motivation?

As a coach you are in a position of power and control. You make decisions that affect the lives of people on your team. For that reason, it is important to understand the motivation that influences those decisions. As a coach you are not always going to act on unselfish motives. You are human. What you can do is recognize your motivation, understand why that motivation influences your responses, and do your best to ensure that your responses are appropriate.

Some things to consider that will help you recognize your motivations:

- What triggers your thoughts and feelings? Where are you internally? Are you responding to what is actually going on or to what the event triggers in you?
- Whose needs are being met? Are you considering your players’ needs, the team’s needs, the program’s needs, or only your own needs?

“Working With The Table Crew”

As we prepare for the 2024-2025 season, we must think about the unexpected. We have all been in situations where the table crew may be inexperienced. As a result, problems occur during the game and officials are caught in an uncomfortable position. This occurs at nearly every level of play.

It may be a last second shot when time has run out but the horn failed to sound. Or, communication is lacking with the scorer and fouls are recorded before you even report the foul. Or the shot clock operator was pulled from the stands as the result of someone not showing up. I have seen it all throughout my forty plus years of officiating.

Regardless of the experience level of the table crew, officials are responsible for their mistakes. Our goal is to minimize the impact the table crew can have on the game by having both table management and clock awareness. We can do this in the following ways.....

PREPARATION

- Assume that your table crew will have a level of inexperience
- Assume that your table crew may make a mistake
- Assume that someone in your crew may miss the mistake

By assuming that these things may occur, you can be at your very best in the event that a problem develops. Be aware of rules pertaining to correctable errors, foul administration, scoring and timing regulations, live and dead ball situations, time outs, technical fouls and alternating possessions. In addition, report to the table 10 minutes before the game to avoid having to start the game with a technical foul due to a lack of game preparation.

INFORMATION


Keep in mind that the information that you provide to the table will need to be tailored to the level of basketball that you are officiating. At all levels, you need to remind the table that they are a part of your team.

Politely introduce yourself to all table personnel and ask if they have any questions that you can answer.

When discussing game procedures, be sure that your comments are not condescending. If you are working with a veteran table crew, ask them how you can assist them in certain situations.

COMMUNICATION

As you have heard numerous times, communication is essential in establishing good table management and clock awareness skills. That communication begins in your pre-game conference where you discuss last second shot responsibility, eye contact, free throw confirmation, fouls/bonus, timeouts, warnings, technical fouls, throw-ins, team control, substitutes, correctable errors and the alternating possession arrow.

When people are considering a relationship or doing business with you, one of the first things they want to know is whether or not they can *trust you*.

Trust can mean different things to different people.

In his book *Coach Wooden's Pyramid of Success*, with Jay Carty, Coach Wooden wrote about four qualities (**sincerity, honesty, reliability, integrity**) which when

combined, I believe, do a great job of defining the personal traits needed to be trustworthy. Here's Coach's thoughts:

Sincerity: *We cannot become successful unless we interact with others. Sincerity is the mortar that binds together the blocks of friendship, loyalty, cooperation and team spirit.*

Sincerity may not make a friend, but it will keep one. It often takes a while to be validated, but once a person knows that our word, character and steadfastness have withstood the test of life, a firm friendship can be established and maintained.

Honesty: *Honesty is doing the things that we know are right and not giving in to the temptation to do the things that we know are wrong. Honesty must occur at all times, in both thought and action. Honest people stay on the narrow way, regardless of the consequences.*

A dishonest act is an attempt to deceive someone. It is possible to be so deceptive that we even deceive ourselves. We do this when we want to justify a lie because of circumstances or as payback when someone has been dishonest with us. Dishonesty – no matter the reason – destroys our credibility, ruins our reputation and costs us our self-respect.

Reliability: *When we are reliable, others know that they can depend on us. They know that we will make the effort to do our best, whatever the situation might be. Reliability earns the respect of those around us.*

Capability doesn't have anything to do with reliability. Some people don't have as much capability as others have, but they make up for their lack by being reliable.

Integrity: *Integrity in its simplest form is purity of intention. It's keeping a clean conscience.*

Purity of intention is really a reflection of the heart. The heart of a person with integrity always wants to do what's right, once he or she is sure what "right" is.



Below is a defensive drill from Matt Driscoll of the University of North Florida.


Defense

2 on 2 Double Contest




The ball is passed back and forth or passed down to the players. Defenders are moving on the flight of the ball.


