



PSLL Summer Camp Safety Guide

PARENT/PICK UP DROP-OFF

- A standard camp day runs from 8:45am to 2:45pm.
- A half day option is available from 8:45am to 12pm and extended day from 8:45am to 5:30pm.
- Drop off will take place on 16th Street and Ave C. In order to reduce crowding on the field, parents/caretakers will not be allowed past the front gate entrance.
- Please DO NOT enter 16th Street with your vehicle - this causes unnecessary and dangerous traffic and interferes with ConEd's business operations.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

We kindly ask parents to reduce the number of personal belongings that go back and forth between camp and home. Please make sure all personal belongings are clearly marked.

- Bat
- Glove
- Sunscreen
- Water bottle

What Not to Bring:

- Campers should wear closed toe shoes (No flip flops)
- Money
- Toys
- Cellphones
- Video Games

LUNCH AND SNACKS

PSLL will offer the option to pre-purchase ultimate camp lunch on a daily basis

- A wide selection of lunch options (hot lunch and substitutes) will be available and we will continue to offer options to meet dietary and allergy needs.
- Snacks and additional beverages will be available for purchase
- Big Daddi Food Truck disinfected daily.
- Lunch tables and lunch areas disinfected and cleaned before each lunch period.
- All campers and staff will be required to wash/sanitize hands prior to lunch. Hand Sanitizer will be available on every lunch table.
- Staff members wearing gloves will serve food to campers.
- Full day parents may pack a nut-free lunch for their campers
- There will be no lunch or snack sharing amongst campers or staff

Drinking Water

- Each camper will bring their own water bottle (please ensure they are labeled)
- Water stations to be set up throughout the camp for campers and staff
- Hot Day - Occasionally, a summer day brings unseasonably hot weather. Our course of action includes: scaling down activities so that the children aren't overexerted, providing extra water-based fun. Water coolers are placed all around the camp. Lunch tables will be tented to provide ample shade.

WHAT IS A 'Camp Team'?

Campers will be placed into small groups of 5 to 8 called "Camp Teams" with a dedicated instructor that stays together all day, every day during the camper's respective week/s. Think of it as your child's summer team. Each family will be assigned a "home base" which will include: shaded canopy tenting, hand sanitizer dispenser, camp family only dedicated equipment and weekly materials bag.

Missed Camp Days - For missed days due to illness, a camper's family will receive a credit for days missed or make-up days.
