TONIGHT'S GAME

Team USA is set to square up with Czechia for the second time at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The U.S. took the preliminary-round battle by a 6-2 Final Sunday afternoon.

Team USA has played Czechia 18 times in tournament history, skating to a 14-2-1-1 record. The United States has won all three prior semifinals matchups, the latest a 4-1 win in 2018.

All of Team USA's games will take place at Fanatec Arena in Landshut, Germany, home of the DEL2's EV Landshut. The arena holds 4,448 spectators for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS -

QUARTERFINAL VS LATVIA

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team used a hat-trick from **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) to take down Latvia, 13-3, Thursday evening at Fanatec Arena. **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.), **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.), **Frank Nazar** (Mount Clemens, Mich.) and **Seamus Casey** (Fort Myers, Fla.) all pitched in three points apiece to help the U.S. advance to the semifinals against Czechia.

HEAR IT FROM COACH

"I was proud of our guys, they were ready to go," said head coach **Adam Nightingale** (Cheboygan, Mich.). "The big thing for us is we want to play team hockey and they did a great job of that tonight. It's time to get a good day of practice tomorrow and be ready for Czechia on Saturday."

MASSACHUSETTS MADE

The U.S. has received exceptional play from a pair of underage forwards from Massachusetts. **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) netted the game-winning goal against Czechia in the preliminary round and added an assist against Germany before grabbing his first career IIHF hat-trick in the quarterfinal win over Latvia. He began the feat by gloving a Latvian clearing attempt and firing a shot in late in the opening period, used a power move towards the net for his second score and got his third off a set-up from teammate **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) midway through the third.

Since being inserted into the lineup against Germany, Smith has picked up a pair of multi-point nights. He found the back of the net twice in the final preliminary win over Germany and added a pair of helpers in the win over Latvia. With the two goals, Smith became the 17th U17 forward to score 30 goals at the NTDP, joining current teammates **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.) and **Frank Nazar** (Mount Clemens, Mich.), who did it last season.

MOVING UP THE RANKS

Defenseman Lane Hutson (North Barrington, III.) recorded a pair of assists against Latvia to give him six points, all helpers, in the tournament. Combined with his five assists in the 2021 championship, Hutson now has the fifth-most assists of any USA skater in the history of the tournament, skating in the fewest games of anyone with at least 11.

MICHIGAN TO MINNESOTA

USA forward Logan Cooley (Pittsburgh, Pa.) pulled off "The Michigan" lacrosse-style goal midway through the opening period of Team USA's quarterfinal win over Latvia. The University of Minnesota commit has recorded at least a point in every game of the tournament, including three with multiple points, and is tied atop the team's scoring with seven total points (3-4--7).

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2022 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 23 - May 1, 2022, in Landshut and Kaufbeuren, Germany. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a fifth-place finish at the 2021 event in Texas. Team USA has 10 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Landshut at Fanatec Arena against Group A opponents Canada, Czechia and Germany. The quarterfinal round will be split between Landshut and Kaufbeuren while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Landshut.

Group B consists of Finland, Latvia, Sweden and Switzerland and will play their games at Erdgas Schwaben Arena in Kaufbeuren.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air 11 total games throughout the tournament, which begins Saturday (April 23) and runs through May 1 in Landshut and Kaufbeuren, Germany.

NHL Network will broadcast the United States' first preliminary game against Canada on Saturday (April 23) at 3:30 p.m. ET (delayed broadcast/available live on ESPN+). All other Team USA games will broadcast live on NHL Network.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN

Five separate Team USA players are tied for the team lead in points with seven, showcasing the team's depth. Rutger McGroarty's (Lincoln, Neb.) six goals leads the team and he added an assist for seven total points. Isaac Howard (Hudson, Wis.), with a four-goal performance in the opening game, has seven. Frank Nazar (Mount Clemens, Mich.) and Cutter Gauthier (Scottsdale, Ariz.) both had three-point nights agains Latvia to get to the top of the leaderboard and Logan Cooley (Pittsburgh, Pa.) the team's leading scorer in points-per-game during the regular season, has reached the mark as well.

ON THE BOARD

A pair of defensemen in **Charlie Leddy** (Fairfield, Conn.) and **Tyler Duke** (Strongsville, Ohio) recorded their first points of the championship in the team's 13-3 quarterfinal win over Latvia. Leddy picked up an assist on Team USA's first goal of the game and added a second on a beautiful tic-tac-toe passing sequence that ended in a **Cutter Gauthier** (Scottsdale, Ariz.) goal to kick off the scoring in the middle frame. Duke helped set up a breakaway goal from **Frank Nazar** (Mount Clemens, Mich.) with less than a minute to play in the second period.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Team USA announced its leadership group in advance of the round-robin games. Rutger McGroarty (Lincoln, Neb.) will captain the squad while Ryan Chesley (Mahtomedi, Minn.) and Cutter Gauthier (Scottsdale, Ariz.) will serve as alternate captains for the tournament. Chesley and McGroarty are returners from last year's team that finished in fifth place, while Gauthier is making his IIHF debut as a player.

"The team voted me in and it means the world to me," McGroarty said after the apointment. "It's a great group of guys. But there are a lot of leaders on our team who aren't wearing a letter, too. For me, I just have to stay true to who I am."

"It's a huge honor to wear a letter for your country. It's something special and something I've never done before," said Gauthier. "It's a pretty cool opportunity and I'm looking forward to it."

PRELIM VS. GERMANY

Rutger McGroarty (Lincoln, Neb.), Cole Spicer (Grand Forks, N.D.) and Will Smith (Lexington, Mass.) all scored twice as Team USA skated past Germany, 10-2, Tuesday night to sweep preliminary-round play at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

PRELIM VS. CZECHIA

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team used four second-period tallies and a pair of goals from captain **Rutger McGroarty** (Lincoln, Neb.) to beat Czechia, 6-2, and open the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship with back-to-back wins. Goaltender **Tyler Muszelik** (Long Valley, N.J.) turned aside 35 Czech shots on the afternoon to pick up his first IIHF victory in net.

PRELIM VS CANADA

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team used a four-goal, one- assist performance from Isaac Howard (Hudson, Wis.) to top Canada, 8-3, Saturday evening in its opening game of the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. Howard's four goals tied the tournament and U.S. record for most goals in a single game at the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship.

PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. FINLAND

The U.S. used six unanswered goals from six different scorers to push past Finland, 6-1, in its final pre-tournament game ahead of the 2022 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship. **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) surrendered a goal 1:46 into the game and then stood tall to turn pitch a clean sheet the rest of the way, finishing with 26 saves. **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.), **Ryan Chesley** (Mahtomedi, Minn.) and **Logan Cooley** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) netted first-period goals while **Jimmy Snuggerud** (Chaska, Minn.), **Devin Kaplan** (Bridgewater, N.J.) and **Cole Spicer** (Grand Forks, N.D.) collected second-period markers for the U.S. in its final tune-up game.

PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. SWEDEN

Team USA got goals from **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) and **Isaac Howard** (Hudson, Wis.), but the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team fell to Sweden, 3-2 in a shootout, Monday evening at Erdgas Schwaben Arena in Germany in its first of two pre-tournament games ahead of the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Fifteen players on the Team USA roster were named to the NHL Central Scouting midseason rankings, released on January 12, including eight skaters ranked in the top-85 of all North American skaters. Logan Cooley (Pittsburgh, Pa.) leads Team USA at number two overall, while Cutter Gauthier (Scottsdale, Ariz.), at number six, and Jimmy Snuggerud (Chaska, Minn.), at number eight overall, cracked the top-10. Isaac Howard (Hudson, Wis.) came in at number 12, with Frank Nazar (Mount Clemens, Mich.) and Rutger McGroarty (Lincoln, Neb.) followed close behind at 17 and 18, respectively. The defensive triumvirate of Ryan Chesley (Mahtomedi, Minn.), Lane Hutson (North Barrington, Ill.) and Seamus Casey (Fort Myers, Fla.) all placed themselves in the top-32 skaters. Devin (Bridgewater, N.J.) followed as the 65th ranked skater, followed by Charlie Leddy (Fairfield, Conn.) at 84 and Marek Hejduk (Parker, Colo.) at 110. Cole Spicer (Grand Forks, N.D.) entered the rankings at 122nd while Seamus Powell (Marcellus, N.Y.) at 166 rounded out Team USA's ranked skaters. Forward Cruz Lucius (Grant, Minn.) received a limited viewing (LV) ranking, having not played enough games at the time of the rankings.

In the cage, Tyler Muszelik (Long Valley, N.J.) was ranked as the fifth-best draft-eligible goalie in North America.

Aside from the five 2005 birth-year players on the roster, forwards **Charlie Stramel** (Rosemount, Minn.) and **Gavin Brindley** (Estero, Fla.), along with defenseman **Hunter Brzustewicz** (Washington Twp., Mich.) are not age-eligible for this year's draft as they are born after the September 15 cut-off date.
