TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. opens play in the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship today against Latvia in its first of four preliminary round games. Team USA has medaled in five of the last seven World Juniors, including gold in 2021 and 2017. The U.S. won all four of its preliminary round games in the 2022 World Juniors, before losing to Czechia in the quarterfinals. The U.S. has won its opening game of the World Juniors in eight of the last 10 tournaments. Today's contest and all Team USA games in the World Junior Championship will air live on NHL Network with Stephen Nelson, Dave Starman and Jon Rosen calling the action.

TALKING POINTS

U.S. VERSUS LATVIA

The U.S. and Latvia have met on just three previous occasions in the IIHF World Junior Championship with Team USA winning all three contests. In the last meeting between the two squads in 2017, **Clayton Keller** scored twice to lead the U.S. to a 6-1 win in preliminary round play.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

Defenseman **Luke Hughes** (Canton, Mich.), who is representing the U.S. on the international stage for the third time in seven months, is the captain of the 2023 U.S. National Junior Team. He was part of the 2022 U.S. National Junior Team and also played for the U.S. in the 2022 IIHF Men's World Championship. Hughes had a goal and five assists in six games at the 2022 World Juniors, and also four points, including a goal and three assists in the 2022 Men's World Championship. Forward **Red Savage** and defenseman **Sean Behrens**, both who were part of the 2022 U.S. National Junior Team, are serving as alternate captains.

THE JOURNEY TO DATE

The U.S. began its 2023 World Juniors journey with a week-long camp in Plymouth, Mich., at USA Hockey Arena with 32 players looking to gain a spot among the 25 credentialed players each team is allowed to have at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship. Team USA is utilizing the Moncton Wildcats lockerroom for the tournament, which rivals many NHL lockerrooms for space and amenities ... Goaltender **Andrew Oke**, defenseman **Seamus Casey** and forward **Noah Laba** are not dressed today ... **Tage Thompson**, who helped the U.S. to a gold medal in the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship and is the second leading goal scorer in the NHL, popped in via Zoom to share some thoughts with Team USA following its dinner on Friday (Dec. 23) ... **Stan Wong**, who is an athletic trainer for the 21st straight year with the U.S. National Junior Team, filled in for Santa Claus on Saturday night as "Stanta Claus" and distributed gifts to Team USA players. His commentary throughout the night had the players and staff in tears.

TEAM USA AT THE WORLD JUNIORS

Entering the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championship, the United States holds a 152-10-6-119-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time record in world junior championship play. Most recently, Team USA won all four of its preliminary round games in the rescheduled 2022 World Juniors before falling to Czechia, 4-2, in the quarterfinals. The U.S. won gold at the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship in Edmonton, Alberta, after earning a silver in 2019 at Vancouver and Victoria, British Columbia. To date, Team USA has earned 13 podium finishes, including five gold medals (2004, 2010, 2013, 2017, 2021), two silver medals (1997, 2019) and six bronze medals (1986, 1992, 2007, 2011, 2016, 2018). The United States has medaled in five of the last seven tournaments including three gold medals (2013, 2017, 2021). The United States celebrated a successful decade from 2010-2020, collecting seven medals in 10 years. The three gold medals that decade (2010, 2013, 2017) were only matched by Finland. Five U.S. players have been named MVP of the World Junior Championship, including **Zach Parise** (2004), **John Gibson** (2013), **Casey Mittelstadt** (2018), **Ryan Poehling** (2019) and **Trevor Zegras** (2021).

ABOUT THE STAFF

ABOUT VANBIESBROUCK

John Vanbiesbrouck is serving as general manager of the 2023 U.S. National Junior Team, marking his fifth straight season serving in the capacity. The 2007 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee has previously represented the United States as a player on nine occasions, including one Olympic Winter Games (1998), two Canada Cups (1987, 1991), four men's world championships (1985, 1987, 1989, 1991) and two world junior championships (1982, 1983). A full-time employee of USA Hockey, Vanbiesbrouck began his duties as assistant executive director of hockey operations for USA Hockey on June 4, 2018. His responsibilities include oversight of all of USA Hockey's international efforts, including its men's, women's and sled programs as well as the National Junior Development Program.

ABOUT PECKNOLD

Rand Pecknold is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time in 2023. He has twice been part of U.S. coaching staffs, including for the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team which earned a silver medal in the 2018 IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and the U.S. Men's National Team that competed in the 2017 IIHF Men's World Championship. Pecknold is in his 29th season as head coach of the Quinnipiac University men's ice hockey team in 2022-23 and has his team among the nation's top teams again this season. He guided the 2021-22 Bobcats to a 32-7-3 overall record, as well as the school's eighth NCAA tournament appearance and its sixth ECAC Hockey regular-season championship. Pecknold, who was the Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the top coach in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey in 2016 and is a four-time finalist for the honor (2022, 2013, 2005, 2002), began the 2022-23 season with a record of 581-332-100 and is currently tops among all active NCAA Division I coaches in career victories.

BEST OF BEST

USA Hockey has an all-star group of assistant coaches, including NCAA Division I head coaches **Pat Ferschweiler** (Western Michigan University) and **Reid Cashman** (Dartmouth College). **Nick Fohr**, one of two head coaches at the USA Hockey National Team Development Program, is also an assistant coach. The U.S. also has **Jared Waimon** from the Tampa Bay Lightning as goaltending coach; **Shawn Roche** from Quinnipiac University as video coach; and **Will Morlock** from Michigan State University as strength and conditioning coach.

TEAM USA AMERICAN HOCKEY DEVELOPMENT TIES

USA HOCKEY'S AMERICAN DEVELOPMENT MODEL

The American Development Model, now in its 13th season, is USA Hockey's nationwide player development program for youth hockey associations. It's based on age-appropriate, age-specific competition and training for boys and girls, beginning with their first steps onto the ice and carrying them through age 18 and beyond. The ADM places a heightened emphasis on skill development and long-term athlete development principles, providing a blueprint for the best possible youth hockey experience.

At the younger age levels, it looks like fun and constant motion in small spaces. The ADM encourages station-based practices, small-area games and cross-ice competition to deliver more repetitions, more puck touches and more skill development per hour of ice time. It provides the most efficient, most engaging development path for children, keeping them both in the game and on a path toward their full potential.
