

Tee Ball League Rules (Spring 2025)

Rules that may vary from the Official Baseball Rule Book are highlighted below.

Updated: 4/1/2025

1. Games are 60 minutes in length or three innings, whichever comes sooner. On Saturdays, games cannot run longer than 60 minutes, as we'll have another game after that will need to get started on time. Each team bats through their line-up one time per inning, so each player should get three at-bats per game.
2. The official start time of the game is the start time on the schedule, even if the game starts late. Coaches, after games, please have your players exit the field in a timely manner so the next game can start on time.
3. Scores and standings are not kept.
4. If a player gets out, they can continue to run the bases, unless both coaches agree to not let players continue to run the bases. If there is a disagreement, the official rule is players can continue to run the bases if they get out.
5. Only players on a team's official roster can play in that team's games. All players must be registered to play at Mueller Park.
6. Players may have three pitches maximum from their coach, then put the ball in play off of a tee. There are no strikeouts. Please limit pitches to three to help speed up the game.
7. No stealing. No leadoffs.
8. Defenses can play with an extra infielder, either near second base or having a pitcher on both sides of the coach pitching. Teams do not play with a catcher, for safety reasons. Catcher gear will not be provided for this division. Please do not have any players behind home plate. Outfielders must start at least ten feet behind the base paths. There can only be a total of six infielders, which includes 1B, 2B, SS, 3B, P, and the Extra IF. All other players play in the outfield. No players have to sit out. With eleven players on your roster, it's recommended you have five outfielders in addition to your six infielders. Please do not play with more than six infielders.
9. Please move your players around to different positions each inning.
10. There won't be an umpire. Coaches make calls in the field on outs for their own team when hitting. The team hitting can elect to have base coaches at first, second, and third base. The team in the field can have a coach on the right side of the field and the left side of the field.
11. Runners can advance more than one base on a hit to the outfield. Runners can only advance one base on an overthrow to a base or home plate, or on a hit that stays in the infield. Teams do not have to run station to station, so coaches, teach your fielders to get the ball in quickly from the outfield.
