- Communicate openly and respectfully with players, parents, and league officials, and address any issues or concerns in a timely and constructive manner.
- Respect the decisions and judgments of the umpires, and refrain from arguing, criticizing, or questioning their calls.
- Accept responsibility for the conduct and actions of your players, assistant coaches, and spectators, and ensure that they follow the code of conduct as well.
- Do not use or tolerate any profanity, obscenity, vulgarity, or offensive language, gestures, or signs.
- Do not use or condone any performance-enhancing drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or illegal substances.
- Do not engage in any unsportsmanlike conduct, such as cheating, taunting, trash-talking, or berating opponents.
- Do not place excessive pressure or expectations on your players or emphasize winning over having fun and learning.
