

Saint of the Week: It is difficult to decide on one thing to focus on when I think about St. Pope John Paul II. Being a Youth Minister, I feel it would be an injustice to not mention his extreme love and attention to the youth. His most notable gift the vouth to is

establishment of the annual World Youth Day which takes place in a different country of the world each year. This event has drawn millions of youth, setting the record in 2015 of over six million people. Throughout the years, Pope John Paul II has had beautiful messages for young people, encouraging them to take on the mission of Christ. "Dear young people, let yourselves be taken over by the light of Christ and spread that light wherever you are."

Pastor's Message:

Euthanasia / Physician Assisted Suicide (PAS):

The Pain & Suffering Myth – While past generations had to grapple with the issues of extreme pain in end-of-life issues, that no longer is the case. With Hospice and Palliative Care and now, a large variety of pain medications, modern medicine allows patients to die peacefully and free of pain. In a report from the Netherlands, only six percent mentioned pain as the only reason for choosing euthanasia. The choice should be how much medicine to use to balance pain and lucidity.

From the Bedside:

From my personal experience, the last days are often a "healing" process, not physically, but one that is with family / friends, God, and with oneself. Families have the option to come together. Those who have felt estranged from God frequently see things in a new light. A sense of peace / reconciliation comes about as a person reviews their life, of what and who has really mattered. Those families that have participated in a "soft" Euthanasia, have an extreme sense of guilt, "killing my loved one." The founder of the hospice movement, Dame Cicely Sauners, stated: You matter because you are you. You matter to the last moment of your life, and we will do all we can to help you die peacefully, but also to live until you die.

From the Respect Life Committee

Did you know that 87% of abortions are committed by unmarried women? Men have a profound impact on a woman's pregnancy. In fact, the most influential person to a pregnant woman is the father of her baby. This is why men need to step up and take responsibility for the children they have helped create rather than stay silent. "No Uterus, No Voice" is anti- Gospel messaging.

Women are more inclined to end their pregnancies when they believe they will face single parenthood. The abortion industry does not want to empower men to take ownership of their relationships, nor their baby, because when that happens, the probability of their partner aborting plummets and so does their profit margin. According to the America First Policy Institute, the United States is home to 24 million fatherless children. One in every three pregnancies in a fatherless home ends in abortion.
