### **BCMBA Board Meeting March 1, 2022**

### **Executive Report 2**

#### 1st Vice President

From the time after the last board meeting had many informational e-mails which is standard this time of year as BCMBA and the sport is looking to get back to traditional program dating back to 2019. Sent out an educational/historical e-mail to Lower Mainland presidents regarding local Interlock regions (which are three (3). This is to aid in local communication and begin planning for local associations to begin scheduling of games for non-single season league where appropriate. Other regions within the province have local meetings which current BCMBA directors help in planning.

#### **Committee Report 12**

### **Risk Management**

Speaking from the position of the BCMBA Risk Committee Chair I would like to make note of a recent social media/spam email disinformation campaign promoted by individuals associated with Baseball BC members and directed at some of our BCMBA volunteer Board of Directors. Said Baseball BC members, likely include PBL and BCMBA member Associations as well as the campaign began with parents, friends and associates of some of the players affected by how their particular LSO had not managed certain declaration dates at the 15U AA division. Eventually the disinformation made it out to other media outlets and even to our own PSO.

Grant Butler, BCMBA president asked the affected directors to not reply to the unsolicited emails and it was pointed out very clearly to the BCMBA member Associations involved that the BCMBA Board of Directors are bound by the members Rule Book and contents within and that BCMBA Board of Directors abide by the rules set out within. At one point Grant requested the support of the new PBL Executive Director to have the PBL group in question cease the spam campaign. His request was summarily excused leading BCMBA to believe there no longer a single point of contact for the PBL.

Personally, and as a longtime volunteer in baseball as a whole, I have had multiple personal attacks directed at me over the years, but this recent campaign of spamming and directed email attacks was different in that the group of people were misinformed and did not understand where the problem began with in the first place and had little or no regard to limitations and/or solutions contained within said Rule Book was taken.

What is truly disappointing is that the communications spread to other association representatives and the baseball community as well in an effort to put pressure on BCMBA to "do the right thing". The solution to the issue at hand was brought forward through due process as set out in the Rule Book by way of an Article-XX rule change, motioned, seconded, discussed, voted on and carried by the BCMBA Board of Directors. The LSO's involved were made aware via messaging to the entirety of the BCMBA membership.

Given the amount of misinformation and confusion perpetuated by the spam campaign it will be interesting to see how long it takes for the actions, time and efforts of the BCMBA volunteers to be recognized in a mature manner. At this time I know of one piece of communication recognizing the positive result of the BCMBA process. Unfortunately it did not take any responsibility for the spam campaign or the misinformation.

As our governing PSO, Baseball BC, has recently adopted Safe Sport policies, and due to parts of the actions noted above being in contravention of the Social Media Policy (see link below) I am recommending to the BCMBA Board of Directors that the issue as described above be forwarded to Baseball BC for review.
