



Fury Need **Scholarship Guidelines**

1. The applicant(s) must openly demonstrate a good faith need for financial assistance, both in the application itself and during follow up discussions with the Fury Club Director. This could include a required disclosure of certain financial information, if requested. All efforts will be made to keep all information discussed and submitted to the Fury Club Director and/or Compassion Fund strictly CONFIDENTIAL.

2. A “good faith” need for financial assistance should include, but not be limited to, any unexpected and unforeseen financial circumstance arising outside the control of the minor applicant or the applicant’s family (e.g., sudden parent job loss, family member medical emergency, financially unable to afford, etc.). For example, seeking a Fury Need Scholarship because a player is engaged in a second travel sport should not qualify, except under extraordinary circumstances.

3. To ensure objectivity, a “good faith” need for financial assistance and/or whether extraordinary circumstances exist shall be determined in the first instance by a non-Compassion Fund committee of 3 persons, one of whom shall be the Fury Club Director. The Club Director Advocate shall appoint two (2) other persons at his sole discretion, who must be experienced in travel sports and who may or may not be a current or past member of Louisville Fury. A majority vote will approve the application for signature by the Advocate and submission to the Compassion Fund. Committee members will be required to sign an agreement to keep all information CONFIDENTIAL.

4. Scholarship requests may be awarded in whole, or in part, or denied, as stated in the Application Instructions.
5. These guidelines may be amended by Louisville Fury at any time, with or without notice to any applicant, subject to advance approval by the Compassion Fund.
