**Big Sky – January 26 - 30, 2022**

Great amenities include full buffet breakfast each day, five hot tubs, pool, exercise room, large comfortable gathering room for our wine and cheese party and free internet/wifi.

Depart Boise on a luxury, 56 passenger touring bus, early morning Wednesday, January 26. Stop in Idaho Falls to stretch and purchase lunch at a local Sub/sandwich shop (self-pay). Snacks, beer wine and water provided.

Arrive Cmon Inn, Bozeman, MT early evening, check in, join us for a club sponsored wine and cheese party at their beautiful gathering room, dinner on your own at a local (walk to) restaurant including an Outback Steak House, Local favorite BBQ restaurant or burger or sandwich shops.

**Thursday**, January 27, 2022. Depart hotel on the bus (time to be determined) for skiing all day at Big Sky Resort, Mt (Bigskyresort.com). Big Sky participates in the IKON ski pass for those of you that have that pass. Big Sky is regarded as one of the premier mountains in the USA with exciting terrain for all levels of skier. We plan to arrange Mountain Host tours for those that are interested. Lunch on your own. Return about 4pm to hotel. Bus ride downtown for dinner (on your own) and return.

**Friday**, January 28, 2022. Depart hotel on bus (time to be determined) for skiing all day at Bridger Bowl (Bridgerbowl.com). Bridger Bowl is a local mountain similar to Bogus Basin and or Brundage Mountain. Always a crowd favorite with fun terrain. Depending upon interest, we can try and arrange for a tour with a mountain host if available. Return from mountain around 4pm. We are arranging for the bus to take those that wish downtown Bozeman for dinner (on your own) about 6pm and return us to the hotel 8-9pm, final details determined closer to the trip.

We need: Two sun shades, three tables, three chairs, covers, banners. Clear dispensers, tents, table cloth, tape, coffee pot. Kim will pick up the coffee pot, Cliff will get a bucket of coffee. Kim will get there at 11:00 on Sunday. Saturday 1:00 pm meet at the shed. Lynda moved that Kim can spend \$100 on raffle prizes. Sue seconded. Motion carried. Paul donating rumba. Brad Wilson coming at 2:30. Meeting at 2:00.

Print 10 copies of last year's minutes. Lynda will break up the announcement.

**Greenbelt Wine Bike Brewery Tour,** September 19. 3pm.

**Winery Bike Ride** September 26. 11:30. Places do not like big groups and are asking for payment up front. People need to bring snacks if they want some. Four wineries.

**Weiser River Trail** October 2. Detour is completed. Wide tires. 5 people signed up. Sandra will do a flyer.

**Ski Swap – Jane Gabbert – November 5, 6 and 7.** Are we giving away free raffle tickets for the movie at the ski swap? We have a Bogus ski pass, a ski chair, and a Sun Valley trip to raffle. Steve will get a big picture of the chair. \$1.00/ticket. Steve will be responsible for the money. Four people for each three-hour shift. Two for the booth and two for stuffing bags. Sign-up sheets at the brunch.

McUs has requested that we move skis in and out of the operation and he needs about 12 people on the floor.

**Warren Miller – November 18,19 & 20** – Egyptian contract. They will wave the deposit and the insurance requirement. Warren Miller wants to be indemnified with an insurance certificate. The Egyptian has been completely remodeled. Paint, sound, lighting. New ticketing system. They will take over the beer and wine sale. They replaced the carpet and plan to digitize the marque.

The rent went up a little and the charges went up from about \$7,000 to \$7,700.

They have a \$2 facility fee, \$1.50 service fee and a 3% credit card. Larry ran a proforma, if we have the same attendance as in the past, we are not too far off. ~\$14,000 net. The new Cofl ski coach wants to be involved, but Larry is not sure what they want to do. Maybe provide discounted tickets. The Egyptian has a couple of provisions for the pandemic if there are restrictions by the city or the state, we can cancel and get everything back. We are responsible for social distancing and masks. We might need to hire security. We should mention we will follow the city or state guidelines. Warren Miller is 50% of ticket sales with a minimum of \$4,000. \$15, \$13 and \$10 ticket price. Let's go \$18, \$15 and \$12 for Cofl. Provide the coach with a promo code. All tickets go through the Egyptian.

Warren Miller contract being reviewed by Jim Hovren. They are going to handout cards with a QR code and now you fill them out online. Warren Miller magazines on the Bogus Basin ski club table. 10 large posters, 20 medium, 50 small and 400 flyers. We can do additional posters at a cost. We can reproduce flyers on our own. We have \$1,000 deposit at signing and \$4,000 seven days prior to the event. We can cover that. We can delay 30 days and reschedule and then cancel.

Our liability insurance will give us a rider, typically at no extra charge.

They will supply the media, blue ray disc or digital. Will that work with the Egyptian. John and Vicki will help with marketing. We will all be on the email string. Need volunteers at the event. Bogus Basin Ski Club table.

They offered us 35% of the gross proceeds. On the sale of alcohol.

No banners on the stage. If we put banners on the stage, we want Bogus Basin Ski Club as one of them. 36" wide, 48" tall. Plastic corrugated. Order two. Bogus will not give us the ski pass. They will give one each night. Susan Saad will check. We need a volunteer to coordinate volunteers.

We can promote Kasandra as Mrs. Idaho. Would she like to announce the matinee on Saturday? Would she like to be a volunteer coordinator? Larry sends a letter with a booth reservation form on October 1.

**Holiday Party** – Gowen Field, December 4, Reserved for 200 people. We can invite Primetimers and Vertigals. \$400 venue cost. They set up and cleanup. Grilled chicken \$10, scalloped potatoes \$1.75, desserts \$3. Waiting for a price on prime rib. Estimating \$40 plus a band.

**Shed Ramp** – TBD John has everything we need. John will bring the beer and fire up Big Bertha.

#### **Outdoor Paint and Guzzle– TBD**

There is space for 10 attendees. Charge \$25 per person to cover all costs (canvas, paints, expert instruction, smiles, fun, two beverages). Kim asked the board for up to \$100 to supplement this event. This would be broken down into: Beer (open to suggestions) (thinking a 12-pack would do), Box o Wine (white), a non-alcoholic beverage.

### **Addendum 3 – Lynda Clark email September 17, 2021**

Board, It is being recommended (in an email to Lynda from Larry Crockett) that we cancel Warren Miller Film festival again this year because of the current levels of the COVID variant. We do not want to have a super spreader event, and we all know how tight the Egyptian theater is...especially the lobby area. We have not signed any contracts, and would need to send very nice letters explaining our concerns to both John Schaffer at WM/Outside Inc, and Elliot at Egyptian. Larry is recommending we promote an on-line release/viewing like we did last year. I would like your input/vote to cancel.

### **Follow up to Addendum 3 – Lynda Clark email September 19**

All, It's pretty much agreed by all to cancel the Warren Miller Film Festival for this year.

HOWEVER -- Kim Dewit suggested to try a drive-in or some other type of outside venue again this year. We need to remember COST for the film is either \$4000 + flyers, OR 1/2 of ticket sales + flyers, whichever is greater. So, let's do a little math here.

Film \$4000

Flyers - \$500

Printing flyers - \$500

Drive in Fee \$1000 (guessing for drive-in fee)

TOTAL - \$6000

We would need 200 cars at \$30 per car to make the \$6000 to break even. Figuring 2 people per car so each person is \$15. We could charge more, \$35 or \$40 per car - AND we would take the money at the gate so no extra fees. The Terrace Drive in is 20 Miles from Boise and people use their car radio / stereo for sound --> 104.7 FM --> So no bad speakers that you hang on the window. From Terrace Drive web site, they are open to leasing out the venue to show other movies, see below. Should we at least call and get a price for the venue? how many cars fit in the venue? and if we can sell Beer which might be a bad idea as --> people would probably just bring their own beer like we all did in high school.

We would also need to see if there is a way to MC from the movie booth - for announcements from Natalie and have Brad Wilson give overview of Bogus Basin this year at the break time.

We could just simplify - no booths, no beer, if weather permits, sell raffle tickets from car to car. We could ask Bogus if they would give away free ski pass each showing. We could have some door prizes. We would need to decide for 2 or 3 nights. No Matinee, of course. It could still be a way to kick off the winter season!

Let's at least have a review. Kim is checking on pricing already.
