TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team meets South Korea in both team's second game of the 2018 Para Hockey Cup. Puck drop is set for 7 p.m. ET with a streaming link available on HockeyTV. com and period updates available on @usahockey on Twitter.

The 2018 Paralympic gold (U.S.) and bronze (South Korea) medalists both met Canada in their respective tournament-opening games. South Korea fell to the Canadians, 7-0, on Sunday night (Dec. 2) while the U.S. shut out the hosts, 3-0.

- TALKING POINTS -

THE SERIES VS. SOUTH KOREA

The U.S. and South Korea are meeting for the 14th time in Para Hockey Cup tourrnament history. The two teams have competed in eight consecutive Para Hockey Cups. A win tonight would maintain Team USA's pristine record (13-0-0-0/W-OTW-OTL-L) against South Korea.

The two teams last met in the final preliminary round game of the 2018 Paralympic Winter Games where the U.S. claimed an 8-0 victory over the Paralympic hosts. **Brody Roybal** (Northlake, III.) tallied five points, **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) scored three times and **Steve Cash** (Overland, Mo.) registered his U.S. record 10th Paralympic shutout.

LAST GAME: USA 3, CAN 0

In its tournament-opener last night, the U.S. blanked Canada, 3-0, as Farmer tallied a goal and an assist and **Kyle Zych** (South Hadley, Mass.) scored his first goal in his national team debut. Steve Cash made nine save to secure the shutout and **Rico Roman** (Portland, Ore.) scored Team USA's third goal. For the full game recap, visit teamusa.usahockey.com/2018parahockeycup.

20 IN 21

With its 3-0 win last night over Canada, the U.S. has now won 20 of its last 21 games in tournament play. Since its championship game loss to the Canadians in 2013, the U.S. has reeled off a 17-3-1-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record that includes four tournament titles (2015, 2016 (Jan.), 2016 (Dec.), 2017).

FIRST GOAL, FIRST WIN

Yesterday's game saw U.S. forward **Kyle Zych** (South Hadley, Mass.) score in his national team debut. Following the game, U.S. head coach **David Hoff** (Bottineau, N.D.) presented Zych with the scorer's goal puck while Hoff himself was honored by U.S. general manager **Dan Brennan** (Colorado Springs, Colo.) with the game puck for securing his first win as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

Over the last four years, the United States has skated to a 43-4-1-3 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in all competitions over the last four years that includes a Paralympic gold (2018), two world championship medals (gold - 2015; silver - 2017), four-straight Para Hockey Cups (2015, 2016 (Jan.), 2016 (Dec.), 2017), the 2016 IPC Pan-Pacific Championship and the 2018 Turin Para Ice Hockey International Tournament.

Additionally, since 2009, Team USA has reached eight consecutive gold-medal game berths at the Paralympic and World Championship level. In those gold-medal game appearances, the U.S. has posted a 6-2 record while claiming three Paralympic gold medals (2010, 2014, 2018) and three world championship gold medals (2009, 2012, 2015). Its two losses came in world championship play (2013, 2017).

2019 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM ROSTER UNVEIL TOMORROW

Today, USA Hockey unveiled that it will announce the preliminary roster for the 2019 U.S. National Junior Team tomorrow that will compete in the 2019 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Vancouver and Victoria, B.C., from Dec. 25, 2018 - Jan. 5, 2019. The announcement will take place on on NHL Network's "NHL Now" during the 4-6 p.m. ET window.

LEADING TEAM USA-

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.), USA Hockey's Northern Plains District Coach-In-Chief and assistant coach of last year's gold medal-winning 2018 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, is in his first season as head coach of the 2018-19 U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. This will be Hoff's third season with Team USA after making his debut in the 2016-17 season.

Josh Pauls (Green Brook, N.J.), who has helped the U.S. capture the gold medal in the last three Paralympic Winter Games (2010, 2014, 2018), is serving as captain of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. In addition, two-time Paralympic gold medalists (2014, 2018) **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) and **Rico Roman** (Portland, Ore.) have been named alternate captains.

Pauls begins his 11th season with the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and his second as team captain while Farmer is entering his seventh season with the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and his second as an alternate captain. A Purple Heart recipient and U.S. Army Veteran, Roman is serving as an alternate captain for the first time as he begins his eighth season with Team USA.

THIS AND THAT

Yesterday's game was **Josh Pauls**' 49th in tournament history, establishing a new U.S. record for most games by a U.S. player ... Additionally, **Declan Farmer** extended his goal (29), assist (35) and point (64) totals with a goal and an assist yesterday ... The U.S. enters the event as four-time defending champions having won the 2015, 2016 (Jan.), 2016 (Dec.) and 2017 events ... Seven players on Team USA hold military backgrounds from the U.S. Army and U.S. Marines, including three U.S. Army veterans in alternate captain **Rico Roman** (Portland, Ore.), **Jen Lee** (San Francisco, Calif.) and U.S. Army Ranger **Josh Hargis** (Colorado Springs, Colo.) and four U.S. Marines in **Ralph DeQuebec** (San Pedro, Calif.), **Travis Dodson** (Deming, N.M.) **Luke McDermott** (Westerlo, N.Y.) and **Josh Sweeney** (Portland, Ore.) ... **John Vanbiesbrouck**, USA Hockey's assistant executive director of hockey operations, visited Team USA on Friday (Nov. 30).

LAST SEASON: 15-1-0-0

Last season, Team USA skated to a 15-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record that included an unprecedented third straight Paralympic gold medal and first-place finishes at both the 2017 World Sled Hockey Challenge and the 2018 Turin Para Ice Hockey International Tournament. In the first-time ever Paralympic gold-medal game meeting between the U.S. and Canada, the U.S. came from behind to defeat Canada, 2-1, in overtime for its fourth overall Paralympic gold medal (2002, 2010, 2014, 2018).

USA HOCKEY HAPPENINGS

30 AMERICAN OFFICIALS IN 11HF COMPETITION

USA Hockey announced that that 30 American officials have been selected to serve as referees or linesmen for International Ice Hockey Federation events in 2018-19.

American officials will take part in 18 IIHF events this season, including the IIHF World Junior Championship, the IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, and the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. 2019 U.S. NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM

The U.S. National Junior Team will take part in the 2019 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship Dec. 26, 2018 – Jan. 5, 2019, in Vancouver and Victoria, British Columbia. The U.S.enters the event having medaled in three-straight World Junior Championships for the first time in U.S. history after earning gold in 2017 and bronze in 2018 and 2016.

USA HOCKEY'S NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Founded in 1996, USA Hockey's National Team Development Program began operations in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and remained there until the summer of 2015. The full-time program is composed of two squads, the U.S. National Under-18 Team and U.S. National Under-17 teams, which compete in the USHL as well as against international and collegiate competition.

The Under-17 Team competes in the United States Hockey League and also participates in three international events annually. The U.S. National Under-18 Team's schedule includes games against NCAA Division I and III opponents, USHL teams as well as competition in three international tournaments.

USA Hockey Arena, home of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, is a two-sheet facility with regulation ice (85x200) in the main arena and Olympic-size ice (100x200) for the secondary sheet. Acquired by the USA Hockey Foundation on April 1, 2015, the facility has added 20,000 square feet to the property that included a 9,800-square-foot workout facility, additional offices and a conference center. In total, the facility encompasses 170,000 square feet with the main rink providing 3,504 seats for hockey games and 4,500 seats for other performances and events. Accompanying the facility is the USA Hockey Summer Drive-In, which has three large screens that show first-run double-features seven nights a week, as well as CJ's Brewing Company.
