

# **Tournament Overtime Policy**

This applies to Playoff Games only!

If a game is tied at the end of regulation, there will be a 5-minute sudden death overtime period played. The first team to score will be the winner.

If a game is tied at the end of the 1st overtime period, a second 5-minute sudden death overtime period will be played. The first team to score will be the winner.

If at the end of the 2nd overtime the game remains tied, there shall be a 3-man shootout.

If at the end of the 3-man shootout the game remains tied, there shall be a sudden death shootout until a winner is determined.

Teams must rotate through their entire line up of forward and defensemen before they can repeat a shooter. Teams can switch goaltenders at anytime during the shootout.

The first and second overtime periods will be played 4 on 4. If a team incurs a penalty, this will cause the team to play (short) 4 on 3. Should that team incur another penalty that would make them be down two men, the non-offending team would be allowed to place a 5th player onto the ice thereby making the game a 5 on 3. Once the penalties have expired, the game would revert to 4 on 4.
