Pastor's Message What to do: When a Friend is Considering an Abortion

- · First, listen! You don't need to have all the answers.
- · Ask her about her feelings, thoughts and needs. Do not interrupt.
- · Then ask questions like: How did you feel when you first found out? Did you feel abandoned when he said that? What are your feelings now? What do you think your parents will say or do? In your heart of hearts, what do you really want to do?
- · Ask open-ended questions like, "tell me more..."
- · Interpret and confirm what you think you are hearing: "Did I hear you say..."
- · Pay close attention to her body language. She may show from gestures of discomfort or a lack of eye contact that what she is saying does not actually reflect her innermost feelings, values, or wants.
- · Listen to clues to her needs so you can later bring up helpful ways to address those needs. Listen to her strengths and resources so you can later reflect them back to her, building up her confidence and courage.
- · And pray. [Adapted from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops]

Saint of the Week St. Teresa of Avila

"Prayer is nothing else than being on terms of friendship with God." St. Teresa of Avila was born into a deeply religious family, and from an early age fell in love with the

stories of the saints. She longed to be in a relationship with God like the saints she had read about. She joined the Carmelite order of nuns, but felt even that was not enough. Teresa loved God with a selfless love that called her to carry out acts of self-mortification, humility and penance. Her intense connection with God gifted her with mystical visions of heaven, hell, the angels and Christ himself. Her insights and writings prompted Pope Paul VI to name St. Teresa the first female Doctor of the Church.



KC Corner: The KCs are big believers in growing the Catholic Church along Columbus' with supporting Catholic education. A recent quote states, "If you don't hear
