

Dakota Alliance Soccer Club wants to ensure that tournament games are fair, positive and enjoyable experiences for ALL players, parents and spectators involved. A soccer game should be friendly and unifying - a spirited social and athletic occasion for players, coaches, referees and spectators.

To clarify expectations of coach conduct, we jointly expect ALL coaches to conform to this code of conduct at DASC Events:

- Before, during and after the game, you are responsible for the sportsmanship of your players. If one of your players is disrespectful, irresponsible or overly aggressive, it is the coaches responsibility to take the player out of the game at least long enough for him/her to calm down.
- Before, during and after the game, you are responsible for the conduct of the parents of your team's players. A parent that becomes abusive or disrespectful towards the referee, other players, or officials, is your responsibility. You may be asked to assist in calming down and/or removing the parent from the facility.
- Before, during and after the game, you are responsible for the conduct of the spectators rooting for your team. A spectator that becomes abusive or disrespectful towards the referee, other players, or officials, is your responsibility. You may be asked to assist in calming down and/or removing the spectator from the facility.
- Before, during and after the game, you are expected to treat the referee, the opposition and tournament officials with respect.
- You are expected to remember that this is a youth sports event. Any abuse or foul language will not be tolerated, and may result in your removal from the facility.
