William Alan Hagen was a resident of the San Mateo area for 54 years. While attending Burlingame High School, he participated in a wide range of activities including the school's Glee Club. His senior year he was Student Manager. He was class valedictorian in 1939, and graduated with honors from UC Berkeley, earning a degree in Political Science.

Our alumnus of the year was a member of "America's Greatest Generation." Mr. Hagen served his country during WW II with the 79th Infantry (Cross of Lorraine) Division, which landed in Normandy on June 13, 1944. He hit Utah Beach on the northwest coast of France seven days after D-Day in 1944 as commanding officer of a medical services company within the 313<sup>th</sup> Regimental Combat Team. As a combat medic, he participated in all major campaigns in Northern France, Alsace-Lorraine, The Rhineland, Central Europe, and through the surrender of Germany in May of 1945.

He was awarded a medal by the British for the Rhine Crossing and received a battlefield promotion by Gen. George Patton Jr. He was captured by the Germans during the drive of Cherbourg, but managed to escape by offering to evacuate wounded German officers to the nearby American field hospital. His expertise was in setting up field hospitals as close to the front lines as possible in order to facilitate treatment of the wounded.

He received both The Croix de Guerre and the Fourragere from the French, and received 4 Bronze Stars for valor, 2 meritorious medals, the Combat Medic Badge, and a Purple Heart. On September 11, 2009, he was named a "Chevalier" of the Legion of Honor by the President of the French Republic in gratitude for "his personal and precious contribution to the liberation of France during World War II." This award, which was presented at the French Embassy in San Francisco, was one of the high points of his life.

Bill served in many civic organizations including: President of San Bruno Chamber of Commerce (2 terms) and member of the Board for 16 years; Director, Executive Board, Foster City Chamber of Commerce; active member of the Democratic Central Committee, and a close friend of the late congressman Leo Ryan.

Our recipient has brought honor to himself, his school and his country and thus it was a privilege to present William Alan Hagen with the 2010 Burlingame High School Alumnus of the Year award in May 2010. His portrait is with the other annual recipients in the BHS Alumni Room at the high school.

We sadly report that Bill died this July. He was buried in the Veterans Cemetery in San Joaquin Valley; a military service was conducted.

He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Jeanne Tisson formerly of Brussels, his two daughters and sons in-law, Diane and Michael Guldbech of Sacramento, Danielle and Patrick Pearce of Tumwater, WA and three sons and daughters in-law, Peter and Adrienne Hagen of Felton; Robert and Terry Hagen of Park River, ND and Paul and Margaret Hagen of DuPont, WA. He also leaves 10 loving grandchildren, 10 great grandchildren, plus a host of close friends residing in both America and Western Europe.

#### 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Thanksgiving Toilet Bowl Game

In probably the longest running annual event to include BHS alumni (primarily from the class of 1974), the Toilet Bowl has been a staple for over 3 1/2 decades. What is the Toilet Bowl? It is an annual football game that originally started back in 1974. Those familiar with the "Little-Big Game" know that this game been played historically on Thanksgiving Day. In 1974 the Little-Big game was moved from Thanksgiving to a Saturday game. Deprived of the legacy of playing on Thanksgiving Day, Mike Poliakoff '74 and Pete Fena '74 decided the varsity players would play their own game on the holiday. Thus began the legacy of "The Toilet Bowl." The tradition lives on with Steve Mahlstedt, Pete Fena and Rusty Knudsen who have steered this event through the last 35 years. This year the first inductee to the Toilet Bowl Hall of Fame was awarded to the legendary Mike Giron '74 who also is a BHS Hall of Fame recipient. The same nucleus of players exists today and the roster is filled out now with players' sons who are now adults. This group has been featured on NBC News and KRON 4 five times in that span and there is a script in Hollywood that is looking to tell the story of this special event. The players in this game represent players and sons from BHS classes of '70 through '08. It is played each year Thanksgiving Day on the field adjacent to the football field. Some 200 plus come out each year for a "mini" BHS reunion to cheer their football heroes on, again and again. The old guys really hold their own against the youngsters although each passing year is more difficult. If you will be in town stop by the field, (from 10noon), for a hello and the famous Toilet Bowl "Bloody Mary." The pride of BHS lives on in this special event.

#### **Yearbook Donations**



Sheilah Dempsey DeBlander sent three yearbooks that belonged to her mother Gladys Cavanagh Dempsey

who graduated from BHS in January 1929. In 1927, Gladys attended the school when it was called San Mateo High School -Burlingame Branch. That yearbook was called "The Elm" and was published by the San Mateo Union High School Print Shop. The 1928 yearbook was called "The Pine Cone" and was the first yearbook issued by Burlingame High School. "The Annual" was issued in 1929. Sheilah also sent a small Handbook for the "Girl's Peninsula Athletic League". The handbook shows that Burlingame High School was in a league of 13 peninsula high schools. Included in the package were several 1928 & 1929 athletic patches from girls' sports. The vearbooks include photos that show the patches stitched to the girls' gym outfits. We were very happy to receive these early items. Thank you, Sheilah.



The Alumni Association sends a big thank you to **Robert "Bob" Durkee '51** who donated two BHS yearbooks for our collection.

He sent a 1948 "Panther Tracks" and a 1951 "Hi-Life" which was patterned after Life Magazine's format. Before this issue could be published, the school had to receive permission from Life Magazine and submit a comprehensive layout of the proposed cover design. There were also other restrictions that needed to be observed. That year Burlingame upset San Mateo in a roaring "Little-Big Game", students suffered through disaster drills, Vic patrolled Carolan Avenue, the price of a "Blimp" hot dog was raised to 30 cents, it snowed in the Bay Area for the first time in 37 years, all "the boys" came out in suede shoes, jackets, and pegged pants, and all "the girls" came out after the boys.

Here are some prices from the menu - Cream of Corn Soup - 10c, Salads - 15c, One Lamb Chop with French Fried Potatoes - 45c, Hot Roast Beef Sandwich with Gravy - 25c, Fresh Apple, Apricot or Coconut Cream Pie 5c extra on lunch. Some of the people who signed the menu that day were: Don Bruns '42, Avlon Thoman '41, Paulamae Eder Jones '40, Barbara Jean Dalton Bird '40, Dorothy Beggs Holbrook '41, Ruthanne Langford '41, Joan Selby Burdet '41, Robert Gothan '41, Marguerite Buerkel Graves '40, and Reese Cropley '40.

On July 17, 2010, the Ukiah High School Class of 1960 honored **Robert K. Cannon** '45, at their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Reunion. Lewis M. We have an update on **Dr. Malin Dollinger**'s professional career. He was a member of BHS Class of **1953**. After his undergraduate education at Stanford and medical degree at Yale, he took a residency in internal medicine at the University of California Hospital system in San Francisco, and a three-year fellowship in medical oncology at the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York City. He was subsequently on the full-time staff

at that institution, and then spent one year in the private practice of cancer medicine in Pasadena, California. He was then Director of Oncology at UCLA/Harbor General Hospital in Torrance, CA. From 1971 to 1994 he was in the full-time private practice of cancer medicine in Torrance, CA. As an experienced cancer specialist, he has been practicing cancer medicine since 1968. He has taken care of thousands of patients with all forms of cancer, and is trained in internal medicine and medical oncology. He also taught at USC School of Medicine as a Clinical Professor of Medicine, where he worked with physicians training to be cancer specialists. He was subsequently in the private practice of medical oncology in Rolling Hills Estates, CA, with a focus on second opinions until April 2007. Although he closed his practice office, he continues to assist cancer patients with discussion and advice regarding understanding their cancer. discussion of treatment plans in effect and contemplated, and consideration of further management and treatment. He coauthored a book for the public, "Everyone's Guide to Cancer Therapy", by Dollinger, Rosenbaum, and Cable, sold across the USA and in many foreign countries as an educational tool for the general public. This was first published in 1991, and is now in its 5th edition published (2008).

His sophomore to senior years were complicated because he didn't study enough with special education teachers. In those days they didn't have an interpreter and American Sign Language and he didn't listen very carefully in classes. He didn't believe he would ever graduate from BHS. He actually was a member of the class of 1972 but needed to attend BHS for a 5th year in order to graduate. He attended Burlingame High's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and his 30th class reunion. He was married for 8 years and then divorced in 2001. He has 2 daughters (21 and 18 years old) and a 1year old granddaughter. Another grandchild was born in May. He worked for HP's general legal division for 16 years and was a pressman for 13 years at the S.F. Chronicle. He was laid off from the newspaper in July of 2009. Now he has time to enjoy every day. He can relax at home, go to casinos, and vacation in Hawaii and Virginia Beach. He participated in bowling tours for 20 years with a high game of 269! Jonathan H. "Butch" Norton '76 left BHS and kept banging on his drums. In 1980 he was accepted to California Institute of the Arts in So. Cal. where he majored in percussion. A year later, an album emerged, "Beautiful Freak," and a new band called "EEL'S" was formed in Butch's garage. There was a frenzy of activity and a serious buzz about the new project. A year later (1995) the EEL'S were the first band signed to the new Dreamworks record label and "Beautiful Freak" came out to critical worldwide touring. acclaim. Videos, television and all that stuff ensued. In 2000, after 5 records, Butch left to work with Rufus Wainwright on the "Poses" record/tour soon to be followed by a twoyear stint with Tracy Chapman on her "Let It Rain" world tour. Butch has worked on numerous movie soundtracks and has a busy career as a session drummer/ percussionist in L.A. He is proud to be Lucinda Williams' drummer for the last three years and overjoyed to have been nominated for his first Grammy last year for the work he did with her on her last album "Little Honey." Butch is currently in the studio with "Lu" working on her next record. Butch and Lynn have two boys, Nathan and Nicholas, ages 16 and 12. Nathan is a SAG card-carrying actor who has been acting on stage and TV since he was 8 years old. He has been on "ER", "Six Feet Under", "Touched By An Angel", "Just Shoot Me", "Without A Trace", just to name a few. Nicholas started a passion for filmmaking at the age of 9 and is busy burning up the computer at home with his stop animation and Youtube film projects. 
