#### WINTER SPORTS REVIEW

It was a rewarding season for the 296 student-athletes that participated in a winter sport at HHS! Highlights include: - Average team GPA of 3.35 and multi-sport athlete rate of 57%. - Five sports finished in the top 3 in the MEC - gymnastics, boys hockey, boys nordic ski, boys swim/dive (2nd), wrestling (2nd) - Boys Alpine Ski was Section 4 team champions and gualified for the MSHSL state meet. Jackson Reents was the individual section champion, Aaron Herber 2nd place, and Cole Caturia 8th. - 3 skiers gualified as individual competitors for the MSHSL state meet; Josiah Trost in Nordic, Abby Pelava & Katie Nowak in alpine. - Wrestling was Section 3 team champions and qualified for the MSHSL state meet, marking their 3rd consecutive section title and fifth in the last six years. 11 different boys qualified for the individual state tournament (out of 14 weight classes). Six of the 11 were

section champions, five were runner-up, and 3 were all-state. - HHS hosted the first-ever girls wrestling section championships, in which six Raiders wrestlers competed. Two qualified for the MSHSL state meet in two different weight classes; Skylar Little Soldier (1st Place) and Alisha Brown (2nd place). Both were also all-state. - Blake Beissel & Skylar Little Soldier were individual STATE CHAMPIONS in wrestling.

- Kendal Jenkins and John Chorlton were named the 2022 Athena & Apollo winners, respectively, as the outstanding senior athletes.

- Emma McLay, Eddie Peine (ExCEL) and Megan Brown and Ben Witt (Triple A) were recipients of MSHSL awards.

- Tim Haneberg & Josh McLay were named Region 3AAA Head and Assistant Coach of the Year.

- Trent Hanson was named Region 1AA Athletic Director of the Year.

#### HUDL TECHNOLOGY

HHS athletics continues to leverage innovative technology for athlete and team development. 11 different sports programs across all three sport seasons currently use HUDL technology to record practices and games. Coaches can then edit and add voice or drawings to the alldigital video for instructional purposes. Video can be sorted and clipped by offense or defense, by play, by situation, or even by individual player.

We have permanently installed "HUDL Focus" cameras at both McNamara Stadium and the HHS field house. Other sports use portable cameras to record and then upload their video to be used as a teaching tool.
