NCHC FACTS AND FIGURES

- Entering the final weekend of the regular season, the Penrose Cup and three home-ice playoff spots have already been settled, but the final home-ice playoff spot is still to be decided. No. 12/13 Western Michigan has the inside track, sitting in fourth place with a four-point cushion over No. 19 North Dakota. The Broncos can clinch home ice by earning two points at rival Miami this weekend (a win, a tie and 3-on-3 overtime/shootout win, or two ties), as WMU holds the tiebreaker with North Dakota by virtue of their 3-1-0 record against UND this season. Should the Broncos fail to get at least two points in Oxford, that would open the door for the Fighting Hawks, who need to secure at least five points at home against Omaha to have a chance at home ice and extending its first-round home-ice streak. North Dakota has hosted a first-round conference series for 16 straight seasons, the longest such streak in the country. The last time UND was on the road for the first round of its conference tournament was the 2002 WCHA Playoffs when they played at Minnesota. Penrose Cup champions and top-ranked St. Cloud State, No. 3/3 Minnesota Duluth and No. 6/6 Denver have all already locked up home ice for their NCHC Quarterfinal series next weekend. The Bulldogs need to earn two points or have Denver drop two points to secure the No. 2 seed for the NCHC Tournament. (tiebreakers on page 18)
- Top-ranked St. Cloud State won its second straight Penrose Cup and third in six years by winning the 2018-19 NCHC regular-season championship. The Huskies are the only NCHC team with three Penrose Cups, while they become the second NCHC team to win back-to-back Cups (North Dakota in 2014-15 and 2015-16). The Huskies enter the final weekend of the regular season with a chance to set some NCHC regular-season team records. SCSU sits on 56 conference points with six more points possible (max of 62) against rival Minnesota Duluth this weekend, while the record for most conference points is 59 (North Dakota in 2015-16 and Denver in 2016-17). That UND team also set the record for conference wins with 19, meaning the Huskies need to sweep to match that mark, while the 2016-17 Denver squad had the fewest losses in conference play with only three. SCSU only has two losses in NCHC play so far this season.
- No. 6/6 Denver heads into its Gold Pan rivalry with Colorado College on 19 wins this season. DU needs just one more to reach the 20-win plateau for the 18th straight season. The Pioneers' streak of 17-straight 20-win seasons is the longest active streak in the NCAA. Boston College holds the next longest active streak (9). The NCAA record for consecutive 20-win seasons is held by Michigan, which had 25 from 1987-2012. A win (or tie) vs. CC would also lock up the Gold Pan for Denver for a rivalry-record fifth straight season. DU has won the Gold Pan 13 times previously (in 25 years).
- Entering the final weekend of the regular season, the NCHC scoring race is very tight, but it's almost assured the champion will come from St. Cloud State. In conference-only scoring, SCSU holds the top four spots, led by senior Patrick Newell's 26 points. He and Denver senior Jarid Lukosevicius are tied for the NCHC goal-scoring lead with 12 goals. - Colorado College split its second straight NCHC series, earning a 3-1 win last Friday against North Dakota, before falling on Saturday, 2-1. With Friday's win, the Tigers have now taken at least one point off of a nationally ranked opponent in each of their last four weekend series.
- Freshman defenseman **Bryan Yoon** scored a goal and had an assist in Friday's win over UND. It was only his second goal of the season, but both goals have been game-winners, with his other goal coming way back on Oct. 20 against New Hampshire. He now ranks second among NCHC rookie blue liners in scoring with 20 points, one back of Miami's Derek Daschke, while his 18 assists tie for second among all NCHC freshmen and lead rookie blue liners.
- In their 13 victories this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 goals (1.54 goals against per game), but have given up 74 goals in their other 21 games (3.52 gapp).

- Denver picked up five points at Omaha last weekend, earning a 4-1 win on Friday for its 15th straight win over the Mavericks, before settling for a 3-3 overtime tie on Saturday. DU then earned the extra point with its second 3-on-3 overtime goal this season. Denver secured home-ice advantage in the first round of the NCHC playoffs with last weekend's results, marking the fifth-straight season DU will host an NCHC Quarterfinal series.
- Denver is one win shy of its 18th consecutive 20-win season. The last time the Pioneers missed the 20-game threshold was 2000-01 when the team finished 19-15-4 under George Gwozdecky. The Pioneers' streak of 17-straight 20-win seasons is the longest active streak in the NCAA. Boston College holds the next longest active streak (9). Denver has the second-most wins in the NCAA since the beginning of its streak with a 444-214-76 record, trailing only North Dakota (449-232-72)

• Miami was swept at Minnesota Duluth last weekend, dropping 4-2 and 6-5 decisions. The RedHawks dropped all four games to the Bulldogs in the regular season this year. The five goals scored in Saturday's 6-5 loss marked a season high in conference play for the RedHawks, despite the defeat, and their most since a 6-0 win over Colgate back on Oct. 27.

• Freshman defenseman **Derek Daschke** (21 points in 34 games) is Miami's first defenseman with 20 points in a season since Matthew Caito had 21 in 2012-13. After an assist at UMD last weekend, Daschke leads all NCHC rookie blue liners in scoring with his 21 points (6g, 15a).

• Miami has allowed 30 or more shots on goal in 22 of its last 25 games, including both games at Minnesota Duluth last weekend, something that only happened twice in its first nine games this year.

• After splitting its last three series, Minnesota Duluth finally completed a sweep, downing Miami by 4-2 and 6-5 scores last weekend. The Bulldogs also completed a regular-season series sweep of Miami, winning all four meetings. With the sweep, UMD secured home ice for the NCHC Quarterfinals for the fourth straight season and fifth time in six years of the NCHC's existence.

• UMD allowed seven goals to Miami last weekend, with four coming on the power play. Prior to last weekend, the Bulldogs had only allowed nine power play goals all season, but the RedHawks went 4-for-7 on the man advantage in the series. UMD dropped to second nationally on the penalty kill at 88.5 percent (100-of-113), trailing Air Force (88.7%).

• Freshman forward **Noah Cates** scored two goals against Miami in Friday's win for his first career multi-goal game, while he also added an assist for a career-high three-point night. The Philadelphia Flyers draft pick now has five points (2g, 3a) in his last three games.

Newell led the top-ranked Huskies to an unbeaten February and the Penrose Cup as NCHC regular-season champions, totaling 10 points in six games to help SCSU go 5-0-1 during the month. His 10 points and 1.67 points per game both led the NCHC, while he tied for fourth in the conference with four February goals and tied for second with six assists. Newell notched points in four games, including three multi-point outings, while firing 23 shots on goal and leading the entire NCAA with a +11 plus/minus during the past month.

Newell opened February with three points in a sweep of Miami, tallying a goal and two assists. The following weekend, Newell notched a career-high four points in a 5-4 OT win against Colorado College on Feb. 9. He scored the game-tying goal and the game-winner in overtime, while also dishing out two assists to earn First Star and NCHC Offensive Player of the Week.

Newell capped February with a three-point effort to complete a sweep of Omaha. He scored a goal and two assists in the Feb. 23 5-0 shutout to clinch SCSU's second straight Penrose Cup.

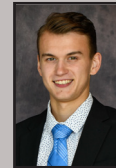

Copeland picked up his second NCHC monthly honor of the season after compiling six points in seven February games, to tie for the NCHC rookie scoring lead during the month. He more than doubled his season goal total in February, potting five goals to tie for the NCHC rookie lead during the month and tie for third nationally among freshmen, after entering with four goals all season. Copeland put 16 shots on goal and posted a +3 plus/minus in February with two blocked shots.

Copeland notched an assist on Feb. 8 in a 2-2 overtime tie at St. Cloud State. He then did the rest against Western Michigan on Feb. 22-23. Hrenák backstopped the Huskies to the Penrose Cup while posting a 4-0-1 record in net in six starts. The L.A. Kings draft pick compiled a .930 save percentage during the month, while his 1.61 goals-against average was second in the conference and ninth nationally in February. Hrenák racked up 120 saves in his six appearances during the month, posting one shutout, while his .900 win percentage led the NCHC and ranked second nationally in February.

Hrenák opened with back-to-back wins, allowing only one goal in each game of a sweep of Miami Feb. 1-2, compiling 36 saves in the series. The next weekend, he turned aside 23 shots in a 2-2 overtime tie against Colorado College on Feb. 8. He then closed out February by surrendering only one goal in a sweep at Omaha to clinch SCSU's second straight Penrose Cup. After 22 saves in a 4-1 win Feb. 22, he stopped all 30 shots a night later to record his seventh career shutout, earning First Star of the Game. He also claimed NCHC Goaltender of the Week.

NCHC HONORS 113 STUDENT-ATHLETES ON 2018-19 ACADEMIC ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM, WHILE RECORD 52 RECOGNIZED AS DISTINGUISHED SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

While student-athletes in the National Collegiate Hockey Conference (NCHC) continue to perform well on the ice, many of them are also performing well in the classroom as 113 NCHC student-athletes earned NCHC Academic All-Conference Team honors for the 2018-19 season, the conference unveiled Tuesday, Feb. 19. Among the 113 honorees, 52 were also named NCHC Distinguished Scholar-Athletes for their exceptional academic accomplishments, the most in the conference's short history.

To be eligible for the NCHC Academic All-Conference Team, a student-athlete must compile a 3.0 cumulative grade-point average or better while having completed at least one academic year at his current institution. Student-athletes that have accrued a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better are honored as NCHC Distinguished Scholar-Athletes, in addition to Academic All-Conference. The 52 Distinguished Scholar-Athletes are by far the most recipients since the NCHC switched to its current criteria for the Distinguished Scholar-Athletes/Scholar-Athlete Team in 2015-16, topping the old mark of 39 from 2016-17. The 113 members of the Academic All-Conference team are the third-most in the NCHC's six seasons.

Of the 52 student-athletes to be tabbed NCHC Distinguished Scholar-Athletes, 30 of them have posted a GPA north of 3.7, including five with a 3.9 GPA or higher. Omaha led all NCHC schools with 11 Distinguished Scholar-Athletes, including eight of them having a GPA above 3.7 (also tops in the NCHC). Denver had nine student-athletes earn the honor, while North Dakota is home to eight recipients and Western Michigan saw seven Broncos collect Distinguished Scholar-Athlete accolades.

Among the 113 NCHC Academic All-Conference Team members, seven schools placed at least 13 student-athletes on the team, led again by Omaha with 19 representatives. Colorado College and Western Michigan were tied for second among the NCHC teams with 16 honorees, while Denver saw 14 Pioneers recognized. Miami, North Dakota and St. Cloud State all produced 13 Academic All-Conference Team members.

While freshmen and first-year transfers are not currently eligible for the NCHC Academic All-Conference Team or Distinguished Scholar-Athlete recognition, those freshmen and transfers that achieve a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better at the conclusion of the 2018-19 academic year, will be added to the Academic All-Conference Team by the NCHC over the summer. Similarly, any freshmen or transfers who compile a 3.5 GPA or better will be named an NCHC Distinguished Scholar-Athlete.

The 2018-19 NCHC Senior Scholar-Athlete Award, chosen from senior Distinguished Scholar-Athletes, will be announced at the NCHC Awards Celebration on Thursday, March 21 in Saint Paul, Minn. on the eve of the NCHC Frozen Faceoff.

JULIE & SPENCER PENROSE MEMORIAL CUP

Awarded to the NCHC regular season champion, the Julie and Spencer Penrose Memorial Cup (right) serves as the league's crowning achievement. The Cup is named after Julie and Spencer Penrose, who were tremendously successful in the business world and did much of it in Colorado Springs in the early 1900s. The couple made much of their money in the copper industry, which is why the trophy includes copper stars on it. The Penroses also set up the El Pomar Foundation, which still today helps pay for amateur sports and other non-profits, including the NCHC office located in the Copper Building next to the Penrose House on the grounds of the Penrose compound in Colorado Springs. The El Pomar Foundation has also issued grants for the Penrose Cup, medallions for each individual champion and the NCHC's annual Post-Graduate Scholarship. St. Cloud State won its second straight Penrose Cup this season and third overall, after also winning it in the NCHC's inaugural season (2013-14). North Dakota has won two Penrose Cups (2014-15, 2015-16), while Denver is the only other team to win it (2016-17).



NCHC TOURNAMENT/FROZEN FACEOFF

The NCHC Tournament will consist of four quarterfinal series on the first weekend following regular-season play (March 15-17, 2019). The four higher seeds will host the four lower seeds in a best two-out-of-three format. Seed #1 will host Seed #8, Seed #2 will host Seed #7, Seed #3 will host Seed #6, and Seed #4 will host Seed #5. The winners of the four quarterfinal series will advance to the NCHC Frozen Faceoff at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. for the two semifinal games on Friday, March 22. Semifinal games will be reseeded based on the final regular-season standings. The winners of the two semifinal games (4:08/7:38 p.m. CT) will then meet in the Championship Game (7:38 p.m. CT) on Saturday, March 23 for an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, while the two losers from the semifinal games will face each other in the third-place game (3:38 p.m. CT) earlier in the day. The 2018 Frozen Faceoff was named Visit Saint Paul's Event of the Year for 2017-18. A new Frozen Faceoff logo (above) was unveiled in September.

Order of Tiebreakers for NCHC Tournament Seeding

Seeding of teams for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by the final NCHC standings at the end of the regular season. If two or more teams are tied for the regular-season championship, they shall be considered co-champions.

The Penrose Memorial Cup shall be awarded and positions for the NCHC Tournament determined, according to the following procedure. Shootout results (other than the accumulation of points as a result of shootouts) will not be used to help break ties in the standings for the NCHC Championship Trophy and playoff seeding.

1. If two or more teams are tied in the standings and all teams have played a balanced schedule against one another (equal number of home and away games between all teams tied), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by the team with the best NCHC regular-season winning percentage among the games played against the other teams tied in the standings. If any of the teams tied have played an unbalanced schedule against any other team tied this criterion will not be used and the following criteria will apply;
2. If not determined by (1), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by the greater number of NCHC regular-season wins;
3. If not determined by (1) or (2), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be the team with the best NCHC regular-season winning percentage among the games played against the other teams tied in the standings, regardless of the schedule being balanced among the teams tied;
4. If not determined by (1) or (2) or (3), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by comparison of total goals for and against each team in contests between (among) the other teams tied in the standings in NCHC regular-season play;
5. If not determined by (1) or (2) or (3) or (4), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by comparison of the winning percentages of the teams tied in the standings against the remaining highest ranked NCHC teams, successively, until the determination is accomplished or all NCHC regular-season contests have been considered;
6. If not determined by (1) or (2) or (3) or (4) or (5), the seeding for the NCHC Tournament shall be determined by the flip of a coin.

In the case of ties among three or more schools, the criteria will be used in order until the top team is separated from the pack. At that point, the process will begin anew to break the "new" tie with all remaining teams. In other words, when a four-way tie becomes a three-way tie, the three-way tie is treated as a "new" tie and the process begins with the first criterion.

Head-to-head tiebreakers for this season:

- UMD wins tiebreaker over Denver for #2 seed (they split regular-season series, 2-2-0, but UMD will finish with more wins as DU can only get a max of 13 wins and UMD already has 14).
- WMU wins tiebreaker over Denver for #3 seed (they split regular-season series, 2-2-0, but WMU wins the tiebreaker on aggregate goals, 13-11).
- WMU wins tiebreaker over North Dakota for #4 seed (WMU won season series, 3-1).
- Omaha currently holds tiebreaker over Miami for #7 seed (they split regular-season series, 2-2-0, but Omaha wins the tiebreaker on aggregate goals, 12-11). Miami could win the tiebreaker if they both end on 21 points, but Miami does it via split and Omaha does it via two ties and a 3x3 OT/shootout goal. Then Miami would have 6 wins and Omaha 5. But if equal on wins, Omaha wins the tiebreaker.
