# FACILITIES



Lamar Baseball boasts the Houston Independent School District's top high school baseball facility. They play on Bill Poland Field located on the Southwest corner of Lamar High School campus near the football and track fields.

In 2011 the baseball field and adjacent areas underwent a major renovation and now feature facilities that allow baseball players to work out year round on a professional quality field.

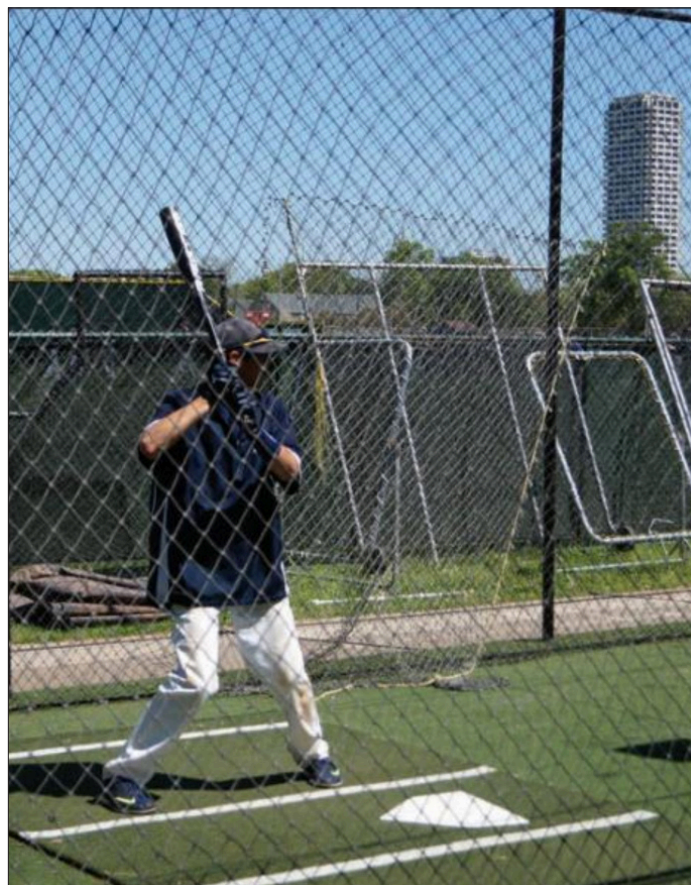
Bill Poland Field features dugouts, 2 bullpens, covered and uncovered cages, restrooms, concessions, seating for fans and a professional scoreboard. The covered 75 ft. batting cages are equipped with portable pitching mounds, four baseball pitching machines, metal halide floodlights and enough room for players to work on all their baseball skills rain or shine.

Bill Poland Field measures 325 ft. down the left field line, 290 ft. down the right field line, and 375 ft. to center field. The left field power alley measures 360 ft. and the right field power alley measures 340 ft. The field playing surface is natural grass (Bermuda).

# Lamar ignores preseason forecasts, turns into state's No. 1 team

*Texans began season unranked but start postseason as 6A's No. 1 team*

Lamar was the ultimate underdog. It returned only two players and lost eight to college teams, including pitchers John Doxakis (Texas A&M), Jimmy Winston (Baylor) and Mark Tindall (Trinity), and catcher Charlie Bartlet (Houston). Now it's expected to topple any and all comers.

The Texans, unranked in the preseason, enter the postseason as Texas High School Baseball's No. 1 Class 6A team after steadily climbing the ranks all season with chemistry and determination. "The senior class took it upon themselves to be as competitive as possible," coach David Munoz said. "The challenge at the start of the year was to play good baseball, and the kids didn't see this as a rebuilding year. They thought we could step up, and we believed we had the pitching and defense to compete."

Munoz prefers the underdog role. It relieves pressure and puts a target on the other guy's back, and everybody wants to bring down Goliath. But he's also proud of their accomplishments and says they understand that rankings create energy and excitement - two things on which they thrive - but they don't win ballgames. That sentiment is courtesy of the leadership of his returners, seniors Owen Holt and Cameron Gibbons.

"We talk about rankings," Munoz said. "The kids bring it up. But Owen Holt sent a group text to the kids saying rankings are great, but it's like trying to have dessert before you eat dinner. 'Let's finish dinner and then have dessert.'"

The results indicate they understand the process - and know when it's time to eat. Without a marquee Division I player - Holt's headed to Harvard for football and Gibbons signed with Blinn - the Texans (25-2-1) one-upped last year's club, equaling its win total before the playoffs and going undefeated in District 18-6A en route to their first title since 2013.

"It was good to win it this year," Munoz said. "It was unexpected, but the kids have done a great job going game-to-game, and it's not easy. I know people say it's HISD, but it's not easy going 14-0. 'It's never easy to run your district.'"

The Houston ISD doubt underlines the big question - were the Texans tested enough? Munoz says yes. He doesn't believe HISD baseball is as bad as people think, and regardless, their non-district slate, with games against Coppell, Georgetown and Brenham, prepared them for playoff competition. "Our non-district schedule was brutal," Munoz said. The Texans possess the most important tool for postseason success - pitching depth. Pitchers Jacob Millender, Michael Streitman and Lawrence Sandoval are the consistent starters, Barron Brown and Jacob Rothenberg are effective relievers, and Holt loves closing close contests. Together, they produced eight shutouts and three one-run performances.

Millender fanned 15 in a 3-0 win over Bellaire on April 21. He's a 6-4, 215-pound righthander with a 90 mph fastball who Munoz expects will end up playing Division I baseball. "He's very projectable," Munoz said. "He's a big kid, throws hard, and has a great curveball."

Not shabby at the plate. The Texans swing it, too. Holt, a vocal leader who mans first and bats cleanup, boasts a .396 batting average with 22 RBIs and five home runs, and Gibbons, a shortstop and leader by example, is hitting .400 batting third. Holt and Streitman, a pitcher/DH hitting .457, pace the team in two-out RBIs. Second baseman Chris Gutierrez, the leadoff batter, is hitting .400 with just four strikeouts in 96 at-bats. "Between Gibbons and Gutierrez ... we've got close to 200 at-bats, and they have less than 10 strikeouts combined," Munoz said.

Pitching, clutch hitting, solid defense - that's why they're a consensus No. 1.

Not only are they Texas High School Baseball's No. 1, they're the top-ranked team in the Texas High School Baseball Coaches Association's 6A poll - and fifth in MaxPreps' Excellent 25 national rankings. Now it's time to play like favorites in their favorite time of the year. Lamar opens the playoffs in a bi-district series with Cypress Falls, beginning at 5 p.m. Friday at Cy-Fair. "I'm hoping we play good baseball," Munoz said. "Everybody in Cy-Fair plays the game well, so we're going to have to have our 'A' game. If we continue to do the things we've done all year, in three games, hopefully pitching will give us an advantage."

# Unbeaten Shawnee (Okla.) at No. 1, Lamar (Houston) leads four new teams in Super 25 baseball rankings

*Texans began season unranked but start postseason as 6A's No. 1 team*

Shawnee (Okla.), the No. 1 team in the Super 25 baseball rankings for three consecutive weeks, punched its ticket to the state 5A tournament. The Wolves, who are 37-0 and have won 49 games in a row over two seasons, were led to the tournament as Kade Self drove in four runs in a 13-3 defeat of Altus in the 5A Region 1 final to advance to the state tournament. Talon Phillips went 2-for-5 with two runs and two RBI in a 6-4 10-inning defeat of Altus in the regional. There were some changes this week, the biggest was the inclusion of Lamar (Houston) to the rankings at No. 12. The Texans improved to 28-2-1 as they swept Cypress Falls (Houston) 4-0 and 1-0 in a 6A bi-district playoff. Jacob Millender threw a 10-strikeout two-hitter in the first game and Michael Streitman threw a six-strikeout two-hitter in the 1-0 win.

The other new teams: No. 22 Mosley, Lynn Haven, Fla., which advanced to the 6A regional semifinals with a 9-0 defeat of West Florida (Pensacola) on Tuesday as Bret Robertson homered and had three RBI; No. 23 Calvert Hall (Baltimore), which improved to 23-2 Tuesday as it defeated Archbishop Spalding (Severn, Md.) ; and No. 24 Puyallup, Wash., which is 19-2 after Michael Spellacy had an eight-strikeout three-hitter and drove in four runs in a 12-1 win Tuesday vs. Auburn Riverside (Auburn) in the first round of the West Central Tournament.



# A WINNING TRADITION

Lamar Baseball has a rich history of producing well-trained players with a strong work ethic. Through the years, many different colleges and universities have signed Lamar players.

Rice University has experienced a wealth of success with former Lamar baseball players. Kenny Baugh ('98), Hunter Brown ('98), and Nick Martin ('98) each had outstanding careers at Rice. After Rice each was drafted by major league baseball teams: Baugh by the Detroit Tigers, Brown by the Seattle Mariners, and Martin by the Chicago Cubs. More recently Jeff Niemann ('01), Joe Savery ('04) and Anthony Rendon ('08) played for Rice and have gone on to play for major league teams. In 2011, Rendon was the No.6 draft pick by the Washington Nationals and in 2013 made his major league debut.

Princeton University has an established history of signing Lamar players. Former pitcher Christian Staehely ('04) and Seattle Mariners draftee, started the Princeton tradition followed by Adrian Turnham ('05), Brandon Englert ('06), Noel Gonzales-Luna ('06), and Sammy Gonzales-Luna ('12).

Virginia's College of William and Mary has recruited several Lamar players. Twin brothers Jon and Will Rhymes ('01) had stellar baseball careers with the Tribe. Will was drafted by the Detroit Tigers in 2005 and made his major league debut in 2010. In 2012 he played for the Tampa Bay Rays. Outfielder Ben Guez ('05) is currently playing with the Colorado Springs Sky Sox, a Milwaukee Brewers class AAA affiliate. Most recently James Williamson ('05) played for William and Mary and was the captain of the 2009 Tribe, Zach Pearson ('15) is a sophomore at William and Mary this season.

Yale University recruited David Toups ('11) and Chris Lanham ('12). John Fallon ('14) was recruited by Harvard University to play for The Crimson. His freshman year John was named the Ivy League's Player and Rookie of the Week. Fallon hit an incredible .706 (12-for-17) to lead the Crimson to a 4-1 record (3-1 Ivy) over the week of action at home. John slugged .824 with an OBP of .700 and never struck out in his 17 at bats, while drawing two walks. Fallon brought in nine runs and scored six more runs himself, adding three stolen bases to his stat sheet.

These are just a few of the schools that have recruited Lamar Baseball players, and numerous other schools have recruited Lamar players as well. In the words of one college coach, Lamar players "know how the game should be played."

A two-way player at Rice University and standout on the mound at Lamar High School, John Williamson was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the 2015 MLB Draft. The Cubs drafted a handful of college arms with bullpen experience and their 23rd pick from Rice provides the athleticism the Cubs like in their pitchers. At Rice John played in 53 of the team's 59 games, either as a pitcher, outfielder or designated hitter. He logged 20.1 innings on the mound over 15 appearances, finishing with a 3.98 ERA and holding opposing hitters to a composite .218 batting average. Williamson averaged 8.9 strikeouts per 9.0 innings and maintained a 3.3-to-1 strikeouts-to-walks ratio. He also hit .284/.352/.312 playing the outfield and DH.

Ian Gibaut became the first Tulane player selected in the 2015 MLB Draft when the Tampa Bay Rays picked him in the 11th round. The right-hander has a mid-90s fastball with a developing slider that helped him pick up nine saves as a junior in 2015. Tulane coach David Pierce said the 6-foot-3, 230-pound Gibaut "has to continue to redefine his body, but there is one thing that separates him from so many people in the country, and that's because he has a power arm," Gibaut posted a 3.11 ERA with 51 strikeouts over 27 appearances and 46.1 innings as a junior. Gibaut made a strong impression as a freshman in 2013 with 12 saves and 38 strikeouts over 40.2 innings. A forearm injury as a sophomore limited him to 10 appearances and one save.

2015 Trinity graduate and Tiger pitcher Matt Tindall signed to play professionally with the Los Angeles Angels organization. In 2015 he also helped the Tigers reach the Division III College World Series for the first time in program history. He started in the World Series in an elimination game against Salisbury College pitching 7.2 innings with 10 strikeouts and no walks in the Tiger's 9-1 win. The win made him the first-ever winning pitcher at the D-III College World Series for Trinity. He was elected to the 2015 NCAA Baseball Championships All-Tournament team and was named 2015 All-SCAC Honorable Mention this season. For his career at Trinity he finished with a 3.39 ERA, getting 103 strikeouts and allowing only 81 hits.
