TODAY'S GAME

Team USA gets ready for a semifinal matchup against Slovakia after winning their first five games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

Today's game will be the 12th career meeting between Team USA and Slovakia at the U18 World Championship, but they have never squared off later in the tournament than the quarters.

All of Team USA's games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 World Championship will take place at St. Jakob Arena in Basel, Switzerland, home of the Swiss League's EHC Basel. The arena holds 6,700 spectators for hockey games.

TALKING POINTS

QUARTERFINALS VS. CZECHIA

Team USA advanced to the semifinals of the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship on Thursday with a 4-1 victory over Czechia at St. Jakob Arena. The U.S. saw four different goal scorers, with **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) notching the game-winner. **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.), **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Will Vote** (Arlington, Mass.) also found the back of the net for Team USA.

HEAR IT FROM COACH

"We're proud of our guys. Every game is going to be tough at this point," said **Dan Muse** (Canton, Mass.), head coach of the 2023 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team. "We loved how the team stuck to our plan and continued to attack, and kept playing our game. It's a great win and we are excited for the semifinals on Saturday."

FIFTY BURGER

With the game-winning goal in Thursday's 4-1 quarterfinal win over Czechia, forward **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) brought his season total to 50 total tallies, the third player to hit that mark at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program this year after **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.).

Leonard's goal total ranks tied for ninth all-time in a single season at the NTDP, alongside current Flyers forward Kieffer Bellows, who notched 50 in 2015-16.

The future Boston College Eagle has now found the back of the net in 12 of his last 13 games played, including each game at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. His seven goals in tournament play ranks second among all skaters, one behind teammate Eiserman.

MORE MOORE

Forward **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) picked up an assist on the final Team USA goal Thursday afternoon to extend his point streak to seven straight, including each game at the U18 World Championship.

The lightning-quick forward has four goals and three helpers through the first five games of the tournament. The goal scoring sneaks him into the top-10 among all skaters, while the seven total points ranks t-14th.

In total, Moore has 31 goals and 73 points on the campaign, one of seven Team USA players averaging more than a point-per-game.

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2023 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 20-30, 2023, in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a silver-medal finish at the 2022 event in Germany. Team USA has 10 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Basel at St. Jakob Arena against Group B opponents Finland, Latvia, Norway and Switzerland. The quarterfinal round will be split between Basel and Porrentruy while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Basel.

Group A consists of Canada, Czechia, Germany, Slovakia and Sweden and they will play their games at Roffeisen Arena in Porrentruy.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which begins Thursday (April 20) and runs through April 30 in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

ON THE VERGE

U.S. defenseman **Cole Hutson** (Barrington, Ill.) comes into the semifinal matchup with a 65 points (9g-56a) in 59 games played for 2022-23. With two games remaining in the tournament, if Hutson collects another point he will become the National Team Development Program's all-time single-season leading scorer by a defenseman, surpassing Cam York's 65 from the 2018-19 season.

The Chicago-area native collected an even 42 points (8g-34a) in 42 games with the U.S. National Under-17 Team this season before producing 23 points (1g-22a) in 17 games with the U18s.

The 5-foot-8 blueliner has racked up 18 points, all assists, over his last 10 games played. His nine points in U18 World Championship play leads all defensemen in the tournament.

VOTE-ING FOR DEPTH

Team USA rosters seven of the top-14 scoring leaders at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Championship, showcasing the depth and talent of its roster. Forward **Will Vote** (Arlington, Mass.) has placed himself onto that list with seven points (1g-6a) through four games of action.

Vote netted the extra insurance tally to make it a 4-1 game late in regulation on Thursday, his first score of the tournament, and 16th of the season. The Boston College commit has collected points in each of his last four games, including a two-point game against Switzerland and a three-point effort against Norway in the preliminary round.

SPEED KILLS

The International Ice Hockey Federation is tracking player speed on ice throughout the tournament, and USA forward **Carter Slaggert** (South Bend, Ind.) is on top of the list.

The University of Notre Dame commit has been clocked at 37.77 kilometers per hour, the equivalent of just over 23 mph, in his time on the ice. Slaggert showcased his speed as he raced in behind the defense to score a shorthanded goal in Team USA's 12-1 preliminary-round win over Norway, his lone point of the tournament.

1-800-TEAM-USA

With the fourth goal scored on Thursday, Team USA brought its all-time team scoring total to 800 goals at the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

Overall, the U.S. has outscored its competition by an 800-316 margin in 155 career games played in the history of the tournament. They have garnered a total of 91 goals over Czechia, the most against any specific country, and their 16 career wins over the Czechs again marks the most of any country.

Team USA holds just a slight 77-72 goal advantage over Russia in 21 all-time matchups, the closest goal differential of any national opponent.

SHOOT YOUR SHOT

Team USA put 52 shots on net in their 4-1 quarterfinal win over Czechia en route to a 52-12 advantage in shots on goal over the Czechs.

The U.S. has outshot its opponent in every game of the U18 World Championship thus far, gaining a total 186-99 advantage through their first five games. They attempted a tournament-high 61 shots in their 12-1 preliminary-round win over Norway.

Slovakia advanced in the quarterfinals with a 3-2 win over Finland, but they allowed 56 shots from the Finns to get to goaltender Samuel Urban.

SERIES HISTORY

Team USA has squared up with Slovakia on 11 previous occasions before this afternoon's game, but none have come past the quarterfinal round.

The U.S. lost their first two games to Slovakia in the 1999 and 2000 tournaments by 6-5 and 4-1 finals, respectively. Since then, Team USA has reeled off nine consecutive regulation wins, seven in the preliminary round and two quarterfinal victories, in 2007 and 2014.

In the 11 games played, the United States holds a 73-25 advantage in goals. In the latest meeting, Team USA won a 12-5 contest on April 19, 2019 in the preliminary round, en route to winning a bronze medal. Cole Caufield and Jack Hughes each scored four goals in that win.

THE OTHER SIDE

On the other side of the bracket, the squads from Canada and Sweden will match up in the other semifinal game.

The Swedes have matched Team USA by sweeping their Group A opponents in preliminary-round play, and captured their fifth win with a 6-1 quarterfinal victory over Latvia late Thursday evening.

Canada's lone loss is their 8-0 defeat against Sweden in the group stage in their first game of the championship. Since then, they have posted wins of 8-0 over Germany, 4-3 over Slovakia, 8-3 over Czechia and they advanced in the quarterfinals with a 7-3 final over host Switzerland.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Seventeen members of the 2023 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting's Final Rankings ahead of the 2023 NHL Draft, set to take place June 28-29 at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee.

Will Smith (Lexington, Mass.) was the highest-rated Team USA player and maintained his third overall ranking from the mid-season report in January. **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) sits in the fifth overall spot for North American skaters, while **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) is eighth overall and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) rounds out the top-10 in the 10th slot.

Forward **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) ranks in the top-32, indicating a possible first-round selection in the draft, at 22nd overall. **Carey Terrance** (Akwasasne, N.Y.) followed at 38th overall, up 12 spots from the mid-term list.

A trio of defenseman appear next on the final rankings, as **Paul Fischer** (River Forest, Ill.) sits at 58th, followed by **Drew Fortescue** (Pearl River, N.Y.) right behind at 60th and **Brady Cleveland** (Wausau, Wis.) in the 64th slot.

Beckett Hendrickson (Minnetonka, Minn.) climbed up the rankings significantly to 67th overall after he sat 94th in January's mid-term rankings. Following Hendrickson is **Aram Minnetian** (Woodcliff Lake, N.J.) at 78th and **Zach Schulz** (South Lyon, Mich.) at 96th.

Team USA continued its representation with **Will Vote** (Arlington, Mass.) at 145th, **Salvatore Guzzo** (Old Tappan, N.J.) at 196th and **Ryan Fine** (Center Moriches, N.Y.) rounding out the skaters at 200.

In the cage, a pair of U.S. goaltenders were ranked highly among North American netminders as **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) finished at third and **Carsen Musser** (Sherburn, Minn.) sits eighth in the final Central Scouting listing.
