TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team will take on Czechia today in its sixth of seven preliminary round games at the 2022 IIHF Men's World Championship in Tampere, Finland. The game will air live on NHL Network in the U.S.

THE SERIES VS. CZECHIA

The U.S. and Czechia have met 16 previous times in the IIHF Men's World Championship and the U.S. holds a 6-2-1-6-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) advantage. The teams last met in 2018 with the U.S. earning a 3-2 win in the tournament quarterfinals on May 17. Team USA has won the last three meetings in the series. Four of the last five meetings between the two teams have been in the quarterfinals with the other in the bronze-medal game. The last meeting between the squads in the preliminary round came in 2007 with the Czechs gaining a 4-3 win. Nine of the last 12 meetings have been decided by a single goal.

ROSTER NEWS

Forwards **Ryan Hartman** and **Matt Boldy** arrived in Finland Sunday late morning, skated late yesterday afternoon and are both in the lineup today. **T.J. Tynan**, who arrived late Friday night (May 20), was in the lineup for Team USA's 12:20 game against Sweden on Saturday (May 21) and contributed two assists, including one on the game-winning overtime goal. Defenseman **Nick Blankenburg** suffered an injury and is back home in the U.S.

SWAYMAN BACK IN GOAL

Jeremy Swayman is the expected starter in goal for the third straight game for the U.S. Swayman had a 17-save shutout in his world championship debut on May 19 in a 3-0 triumph over Great Britain. He then made 20 saves on 22 shots in backstopping the U.S. to a 3-2 overtime victory over Sweden on May 21 and was also credited with an assist in the game-winning goal. Swayman is the second ranked netminder in the world championship with a 0.96 goals against average and .949 save percentage. He played college hockey at the University of Maine and previous to that competed for the Sioux Falls Stampede in the USHL.

THREE-POINT NIGHT

Forward **Adam Gaudette** was in on all three Team USA goals in Saturday's (May 21) 3-2 overtime victory over Sweden. He scored the game-winner with :12 left and also tallied Team USA's first goal of the game. The former Hobey Baker Award winner also assisted on Nate Schmidt's second period power play marker.

STAN WONG

Stan Wong, one of Team USA's two athletic trainers and a beloved figure of players and staff alike, is working his 52nd international event for a U.S. hockey team. This year marks his 15th straight men's world championship. He has also served as a trainer for five Olympic teams, 20 national junior squads, 10 Deutschland Cup teams and for Team USA at one Youth Olympic Games and one Winter World University Games. Wong was inducted into the

QUICK BITS

U.S. defenseman and captain **Seth Jones** is averaging 27:12 of ice time a game, three minutes more than any other player in the world championship. Fellow defenseman and alternate captain **Nate Schmidt** is third in the world championship at 24:06 of ice time per game ... **Adam Gaudette** and **Kieffer Bellows** each have three goals in the world championship, three behind tournament leader Rasmus Asplund from Sweden ... Team USA's power play is ranked ninth in the world championship at .238, while its penalty kill is fifth at .827 ... Team USA is the home team today, will wear its blue jerseys and occupy the right bench ... **John Vanbiesbrouck**, assistant executive director for hockey operations at USA Hockey, spoke earlier today at the IIHF International Coaching Symposium on development, particularly in preparing players for the NHL. Vanbiesbrouck is one of the top American netminders of all-time and played 20 seasons in the NHL. **Ken Martel**, technical director of USA Hockey's acclaimed American Development Model, is here in Tampere and also a presenter at the Symposium, which began yesterday. **Dan Brennan**, who works with USA Hockey's coaching education program and is also the general manager of the gold medal-winning 2022 U.S. Paralympic Sled Hockey Team, is attending the symposium, as is **Chuck Gridley**, coach-in-chief from USA Hockey's New York District ... The U.S. has won four of its first five games in seven of the last 10 world championships, with the only exceptions 2016, 2014, 2011 ... The U.S. is playing at 16:20 for the fourth time in the tournament and is 3-0 in its first three games with a 16:20 start time ... The U.S. enters play today tied for third in Group B with Czechia. With a point in today's game, the U.S. will clinch a spot in the tournament quarterfinals ... The top two teams in Group B will remain in Tampere for the quarterfinals, while the third and fourth seeds will travel to Helsinki to play their quarterfinals ... U.S. assistant coach **Don Granato** has a connection to the Hughes family. Granato is coaching Luke Hughes here in Finland; coached Quinn Hughes for one year when he was a head coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program; and Granato's sister **Cammi Granato**, currently an assistant general manager of the Vancouver Canucks, played with Ellen Hughes (mother of Quinn, Luke and Jack Hughes) on the U.S. Women's National Team ... Team USA assistant coach **Jeff Blashill** is handling the U.S. penalty kill, while assistant coach **Don Granato** is guiding the power play ... The U.S. has outshot each of its first five opponents.

FLY LIKE AN EAGLE

Defenseman **Luke Hughes** scored the game-winning goal in overtime on May 16 vs. Austria on a breakaway and celebrated by flapping his arms wildly like a bird. When asked after the game about his "celly," the 18-year-old, who is the youngest player on the squad, said said his teammates call him, "Eagle," so he was "just giving them what they want a little bit."



WHO KNEW

The first-ever McDonald's restaurant in Finland opened in Tampere, Finland, in December of 1984. The 1985 IIHF World Junior Championship – which began in late December of 1984 and finished in early January 1985 – was played in Finland that year with games in Helsinki, Turku, Espoo and Vantaa. Team USA was based in Helsinki. Art Berglund, who led USA Hockey's international hockey program back in those days, caught wind of the new McDonald's and canceled practice one day so the players and staff could make the journey from Helsinki to Tampere to try out the American icon. Media learned of the adventure and were present to capture the visit. Team USA also visited a Finnish glass factory on its way back to Helsinki. The 1985 U.S. National Junior Team featured U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame players Brian Leetch, Mike Richter and Craig Janney.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP IN FINLAND

Team USA is 21-3-0-26-4 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time in the men's world championship in games played in Finland. The last time Team USA played in Finland was in 2013 when it went 5-1-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) before moving over to Stockholm for the tournament semifinals and medal games where it ultimately earned a bronze medal.

EXHIBITION VS. CANADA

Team USA played Canada on May 11 at the Helsinki Ice Hall in its lone exhibition game in advance of the 2022 IIHF Men's World Championship, with Canada coming out on top in a shootout, 4-3. The U.S. got goals from **Riley Barber**, **Kieffer Bellows** and **Karson Kuhlman** in what was a back-and-forth affair. Both teams had power plays in the five-minute three-on-three overtime, but couldn't convert. Canada won the shootout, 2-1. **Strauss Mann** and **Jon Gillies** split time in the U.S. net. Mann stopped all 11 shots he faced in the first 30 minutes of the game, while Gillies had 13 saves on 16 shots in 35 minutes of action.

HOSTING THE U18 WOMEN'S WORLDS

USA Hockey stepped up to fill the void and ensure the IIHF U18 Women's World Championship will be staged in 2022. The event, which was originally slated for Sweden in January was canceled initially by the IIHF due to COVID concerns, but will now be played June 6-13 in Madison and Middleton, Wisconsin. LaBahn Arena, home of the University of Wisconsin's highly successful women's ice hockey program, will serve as one venue, including for the medal games, and Bob Suter's Capitol Ice Arena will also host games. The venue is owned by NHL player Ryan Suter.

VETERAN COACHING STAFF

Team USA has the good fortunes of having a veteran coaching staff with head coach **David Quinn** and assistant coaches **Jeff Blashill**, **Don Granato** and **Mike Hastings**. Quinn, the former New York Rangers head coach, was the bench boss for the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Hastings, who the last two seasons has been tabbed the Spencer Penrose Trophy recipient as the NCAA Coach of the Year, is the head men's ice hockey coach at Minnesota State University and was an assistant coach for the 2022 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Blashill just finished a seven-year run as head coach of the NHL's Detroit Red Wings and Granato is the current bench boss of the NHL's Buffalo Sabres. In addition, **Mike King** returns for the second straight year as Team USA's video coach for the IIHF Men's World Championship.

FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES

U.S. Ambassador to Finland **Doug Hickey** was at Team USA's game vs. Finland on May 16 and presented the U.S. Player of the Game Award to defenseman Luke Hughes in an on-ice ceremony following the contest ... **HEARD AT THE RINK THE MORNING OF MAY 16** -- U.S. equipment manager **Brock Bradley** was sharpening skates jamming to music from Duke Ellington and Louis Armstrong, when **Alex Galchenyuk** walked by, commented how he liked the music, and said it was something you'd hear in the Olive Garden (an Italian restaurant chain headquartered the U.S.) bathroom. Galchenyuk, who hopes one day to have his own olive farm, adds extra virgin olive oil to most things on his plate at team meals ... Stories in the U.S. around the rising cost of a gallon of gas are frequent with the average price today at \$4.48/gallon. Americans have nothing to complain about, however, if comparing the price to what Finns pay, which today averages \$8.84/gallon ... The team benches at Nokia Arena were modified on May 15 to give the coaching and training staff more room behind the player's bench. The original configuration was so tight that coaches/training staff essentially had to remain in the position they took to start a period ... **Thomas Bordeleau** scored shorthanded against Latvia on May 13, the first shorthanded marker by a U.S. player in the men's world championship since **Derek Ryan** accomplished the feat on May 11, 2018, in a 13-1 win over Korea. Ryan also had a power play goal in the contest ... The U.S. took May 14 largely off. The players explored downtown Tampere for a couple hours in the afternoon on what was a beautiful day in Finland's third largest city (next to Helsinki and Espoo) Nine different players found the scoresheet in Team USA's 4-1 win over Latvia on May 13, including four of the team's six defensemen ... Team USA scored at even strength, shorthanded and on the power play against Latvia on May 13 ... The U.S. arrived in Helsinki on Sunday, May 7, at 10:30 a.m. after an eight-and-a-half-hour flight from Chicago, and practiced at the Malmi Arena daily through Tuesday, May 10. Malmi is one of 60 neighborhoods in Helsinki. Team USA played one exhibition game, that coming on Wednesday, May 11, against Canada at Helsinki Ice Hall **Adam Gaudette** won the 2018 Hobey Baker Memorial Award as the top player in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey while playing at Northeastern University ... The U.S. has medaled in four of the last eight IIHF Men's World Championships, its best stretch since 1931-47 ... **Alex Galchenyuk** regularly arrives at team meals with a bottle of extra virgin olive oil under his arm. Galchenyuk, who has played 10 years in the NHL, enjoys adding EVOO to virtually anything on his plate ... **Thomas Bordeleau** made his long-awaited IIHF debut May 13 vs. Latvia. He was selected to both the 2020 and 2021 U.S. National Junior Team, but had COVID issues both years that prevented him from playing in the IIHF World Junior Championship ... U.S. netminder **Strauss Mann** says the three words the best describe him are dialed, curious and purposeful ... **Risto Talvio**, who works full-time as a security officer at a nuclear power plant in Eurajoki, Finland, is Team USA's host here in Tampere. Talvio has served as team host for U.S. teams in all international tournaments in Finland since 1984 ... Team USA massage therapist **Peewee Willman** and his girlfriend Hannah are expecting the couple's first child in two months ... **Stan Wong** is one of Team USA's two athletic trainers. He is in his 20th season supporting U.S. teams on the international stage with this his 15th IIHF Men's World Championship. Wong, who retired as athletic trainer for the Florida Panthers in 2002, was inducted into the PHATS/SPHEM Hall of Fame in 2015 ... U.S. general manager **Ryan Martin** arrived in Tampere on May 17 and is here for the duration of the world championship. Martin is the assistant general manager of the NHL's New York Rangers ... Seventeen of the guests of Team USA players/staff arrived the morning of May 19 in Finland and are here for the remainder of the tournament ... Among some of the popular dining spots for Team USA players/staff -- Hook, Stefan's Steakhouse, Don Franco and Masu Asian Bistro ... Team USA defenseman **Luke Hughes** has two brothers who play in the NHL -- Jack with the New Jersey Devils and Quinn with the Vancouver Canucks. Luke was drafted by the Devils and is likely to join his brother Jack in Newark, New Jersey, in the not too distant future. He currently plays collegiately at the University of Michigan and is eligible to compete for Team USA at both the August and December/January IIHF World Junior Hockey Championships ... **Jon Merrill** has four young daughters, all six years of age or younger.

FROM PREVIOUS GAME NOTES (PART 2)

Forward **Thomas Bordeleau** is one of the first out of the lockerroom in advance of games and to start periods, and hangs out at the "back of the line." When **Kieffer Bellows** comes out of the lockerroom, he and Bellows chest bump as part of a regular routine. Shortly before the team begins its walk to the ice, Bordeleau goes from a standing position and leaps with both feet straight up into the air. He's been "jumping" he says for the last couple of years ... **Piet VanZant** and his wife Missy, who arrived on Thursday, were out for a run yesterday on a beautiful day in Tampere. VanZant is the head athletic trainer for the Detroit Red Wings ... Team USA massage therapist **Peewee Willman** has regularly taken advantage of the free bikes the team hotel has available to explore the city. Willman, who has his own practice in Hannover, Germany, was the massage therapist for the rock band Depeche Mode's world tour back in 2017-18.

LEADERSHIP TEAM

Seth Jones (Frisco, Tex.) is the captain of the 2022 U.S. Men's National Team with **Nate Schmidt** (St. Cloud, Minn.) and **Austin Watson** (Ann Arbor, Mich.) serving as alternate captains. Jones, who has played nine seasons in the NHL, is competing in his sixth international tournament for the U.S., including two previous men's world championships. He served as captain of the gold medal-winning 2012 Under-18 Men's National Team and as an alternate captain of the gold medal-winning 2013 U.S. National Junior Team. Schmidt, who has played nine years in the NHL, is making his international debut, while Watson, who has represented Team USA at both the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship and IIHF World Junior Championship previously, has played eight seasons in the NHL.

LUKE HUGHES -- AMONG YOUNGEST EVER

Luke Hughes is the 6th youngest player ever to compete for the U.S. in an IIHF Men's World Championship. His brother Jack is the youngest ever and other brother, Quinn, is the seventh youngest.

U.S. captain **Seth Jones** recorded his sixth multi-point game in IIHF Men's World Championship play on May 13 in Team USA's 4-1 win over Latvia. Jones had a power play goal in the contest and also ignited a two-on-one shorthanded rush up the ice which ended with his feed to **Thomas Bordeleau** who scored. Jones was 19-years-old in his IIHF men's worlds debut in 2014 and led Team USA in points with 2-9--11. His 11 points were the most by a blueliner in the tournament and he earned the Directorate Award as the top defenseman in the world championship and a spot on the Media All-Star Team. He also played for Team USA in the 2015 men's worlds and recorded four points on a goal and three assists.
