**Trip Planning for 2021/2022**

**Camping trip – August 27-29, 2021, Sue** – We have 30 people registered. We need 30 to make the numbers. Sue will ask Doug to verify that everyone at camp is a current member. Hook ups are first come, first serve. Do not put your tent next to a hook up stanchion.

**Sun Valley** – Second full week of 2022. They want to give us the week of 9-16. This is the second week.

**Big Sky – January 26 - 30, 2022**

Doug Baker is leading this trip. Doug is doing research. Global Travel has not been responsive. The new hotel is C mon Inn, Bozeman, MT. By the freeway vs. downtown. Free large room for wine and cheese and can bring our own alcohol and snacks. Five hot tubs and walking distance to a couple restaurants. Bus would be available for two nights to take us downtown. Does not include ski passes. Ski Bridger Bowl one day, Big Sky two days. Board approved this trip. Wednesday is a travel day, ski Thursday – Saturday, Sunday return to Boise. Lodging for the bus driver, but no tip. For the bus to Bridger, watch the driver s time. They are on the clock. Full breakfast. \$50/person for beer, wine, snack, bus driver tip. \$570 and \$778/person.

**Snowmass – January 29-February 5, 2022**

ISC trip. Price covers only the room. ISC has agreed to fill 10 rooms. Sign up through the ISC link on our website. Unless you buy the True Bogus pass, you do not get the Powder Alliance add-on.

**Dolomites/Athens -February 25 – March 10- 2022**

The trip is Full at 42, and Jeffrey is collecting the third round of payments. He needs another \$1,000/person. He paid the first deposit of \$2,500 and the hotels. He is going to buy the airfare mid-June. The airfare is the down payment. Paul will work with Jeffrey on airfare. The hotel knows they need slots.

Hot Tub Add-on. We can use the hot tub at flat rate of \$30.00 for 1 hour or \$40 for 1.5 hrs. The tub is semi-private, water is at 104 degrees, has jets and bubblers and seats 10-12 persons.

Grounds and Shelters, include the Bonfire Pit, volleyball, horseshoe pit, badminton, picnic tables, etc. There appears to be a \$25.00 charge for 1 hour.
