## 2022 - 2023 USA FENCING IMPACT REPORT

#### **ABOUT THE REPORT**

The purpose of this Impact Report is to highlight our organization's commitment to DEIB through our various initiatives and community involvement. The report hopes to provide transparency and accountability of our actions to enhance access and inclusion in the sport of fencing. The report also reveals areas of opportunity to inform future DEIB programming.

USA Fencing is currently in the process collecting demographic data from our membership. In an effort to provide the most accurate depiction of our membership, we strongly encourage members to respond to the demographic questions. The data collected are used to produce annual reports to the USOPC and steer DEIB programmatic efforts to make fencing a more accessible and inclusive sport.

Through different outreach and community initiatives, I've recognized that our organization and its membership acknowledges the barriers and limitations that prevent people from entering and continuing in the sport. • **ANGEL CITY SPORTS** | Partnership Focus: Introduce the number of parafencing athletes in the city of Los Angeles through clinics and competitions for people of all ages and skill levels who have physical disability or visual impairment.

• **PLAYLA** | Partnership Focus: To launch fencing programs across the city of Los Angeles in preparation for the LA28 Olympic Games. Partnership will launch fencing at 10 parks and recreation sites in the fall of 2023.
