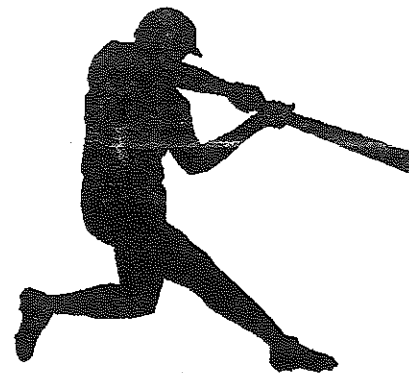
The Outsiders Rebound From A Bad Loss To Defeat The Scorpions

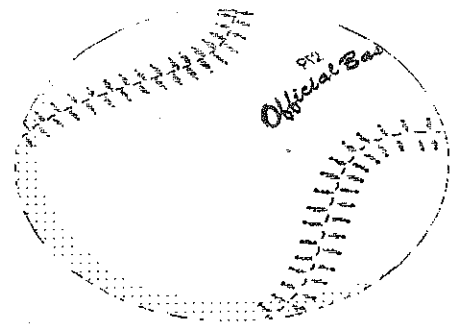

Black Magic and Ike Maleh Shut Out Los Hermanos 4-0

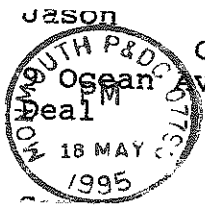
