Saint of the Week
"For Jesus Christ, I am prepared to
suffer more still." Saint Maximilian
Kolbe is most known for his
ultimate sacrifice. As a prisoner in
the World War II Concentration

Camp, Auschwitz, this unknown Catholic priest saw unbelievable horrors. As a punishment for a prisoner's attempted escape and a lesson to those remaining, ten men were chosen to be taken to a cell and starved to death. As one of the men was being taken away he cried out, "My wife! My children!" Maximilian Kolbe stepped forward to take this man's place. Every time the soldiers came to check on the men, Kolbe could be seen kneeling in the center of the cell, leading the other men in prayer. After being starved and deprived of water for two week, only Kolbe and three others remained alive. These remaining four were put to death by lethal injection. Maximilian Kolbe exemplifies what it means to take up the cross and suffer with Christ. None of us are asked for this kind of sacrifice, but being a disciple always demands some kind of sacrifice. We are challenged to set aside our own needs and wants to lovingly serve the needs of others. His Feast Day is August 14.

I have been hampered with diminished feeling in my left leg and arm making walking a real challenge.
