How will we fund construction of the Gathering Space and Childcare/Faith Formation Center?

Romans 12:4-5 For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, 5 so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.

We have the following saved for each project: • Gathering Space (Total Cost \$3.5 million) - \$1.5 million is allocated towards this project through the sale of Holy Cross and other investments. • Daycare/Faith Formation Center (Total Cost \$3.2 million) - \$2 million is allocated towards this project through the sale of the Fitzgerald Center and other investments.

This means, we have to raise \$3.2 million over the next three years, over and above our regular giving, inorder to fully fund the remaining amount for both projects. It is critical for all within the Crucifixion community to participate through prayers, volunteering, and making a financial commitment, in order to make this vision a reality. We ask that you pray for God's guidance throughout this process, as well as the campaign volunteers and entire parish community. Why are we building a catering kitchen instead of a full kitchen?

We have recently received questions about the kitchen that will be included in the gathering

space project. The plan is to build a catering kitchen rather than a full kitchen. A catering kitchen is designed to support smaller events and gatherings by allowing us to reheat, stage, and serve prepared food, rather than cook meals from scratch on-site.

While this type of kitchen will not accommodate large parish events, it is well-suited for frequent, smaller gatherings such as post-Mass fellowship and funeral luncheons, which are catered. Larger events such as roast beef dinner, fish fries, and apple pie making will continue being held in the school cafeteria. (*To Be Continued*.)
