A Look Back ... Aug. 24, 2017

The Wildcats and Knights last met at Dowed Field in 2017, the first meeting of the teams in nearly 60 years. The contest marked the first Thursday evening encounter for the Wildcats under Chuck Kyle.

Strong defense won the day for the Wildcats. Shane Hamm made his first start as a Knight, but Saint Ignatius limited him to 104 passing yards, sacking him three times. While an early Hoban field goal took the lead, Kyle Hall found Max Pike for a 34-yard passing score to take the lead at half.

A fumble recovery for a touchdown by lineman Billy Corte and a 48-yard Matt Trickett field goal cemented a dominant opening win for the Cats.

Wildcats Storylines ...

TOUGH ENDING: The Wildcats allowed 21 straight points in the fourth quarter last week, falling to Mentor, 38-31. The Wildcats will look to avoid a loss vs. Hoban and a 1-2 record for the second straight year.

CMIEL CRAZY: The best player on the field last week was Connor Cmiel. Cmiel recorded 283 all-purpose yards, 84 more Mentor's top yardage earner, Ian Kipp. Cmiel returned a kickoff for a touchdown and a field goal block for a touchdown. Cmiel returned a second kickoff return for six at the start of the second half, only to have a block in the back erase it. Cmiel also hauled in a pass for 47 yards. The Wildcats' coaching staff will be looking for ways to get the ball to Cmiel, who will likely be double-covered by Hoban. He'll also play some cornerback, too.

JAMES AND JACK ATTACK: The Wildcats will split the carries at running back on Friday between James Crosby and Jack Welcsh, as they've done in the first two weeks. However, the coaching staff is not afraid to go with the hot hand. Against Mentor, Welcsh had the hot hand, carrying the ball 19 times for 100 yards. A power back with speed, Welcsh is a great runner. Crosby is similarly talented, a tough back who doesn't go down easily. Both will play big roles on offense.

GENERAL GRIFFIN: The Wildcats' field general at quarterback is Griffin Hanna. The senior signalcaller will look to improve on his 105 passing yards from Week 2, when he gutted out several big hits to finish the game. Hanna will need to take care of the ball and navigate the offense down the field against a quick, swarming Hoban defense.

TALENTED TIGHT ENDS: The Wildcats have two gifted tight ends – Sam Daugstrup and Jake Lang. Both Daugstrup and Lang have established themselves as reliable pass catchers for Griffin Hanna, hauling in important passes in the first two games. Both men provide value as safety valves and deep threats. In addition, both men can block well. Daugstrup opened big running lanes for Welcsh and Crosby last week.

THE BIG MEN: Anthony Gerace, Bennett Adler, and Rico Levert have played quite well on defensive line this year. Adler (4.5 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks), Gerace (2.5 tkl, 2.5 TFL, 1 sack), and Levert (1 tackle) all contributed vs. Mentor, and will be important to clogging the middle against Deamonte Trayanum.

SECOND LEVEL STUDS: The Wildcats' linebackers did solidly against Mentor. Aidan Conway tied for a team-leading 5.5 tackles. Aidan Hubbard (4.5 tackes) and Nick Velotta (3.5 tkl, 2 TFL, 0.5 sack) also did plenty. Michael McNamara will return to bolster the unit against Hoban.

NO FLY ZONE: The Saint Ignatius defensive backs enjoyed a great game against Mentor. The Wildcats limited Mentor to 12-of-25 passing for 174 yards and no touchdowns. Charlie Kinzel shined bright with an interception and breakup on a key 4th down late in the game. Merick Hartley also did well, tying for the lead with 5.5 tackles.

CAPTAINS: The four captains for the 2019 season are Griffin Hanna, Jack Welcsh, Nick Schwitzgebel, and Michael McNamara.

<u>ABOUT ARCHBISHOP HOBAN</u>

Learning about the Knights ...

QUICK START: Archbishop Hoban has wasted little time in revving up its title defense. After securing the Division II State Championship, the program's fourth straight title, the Knights bullied Harrisburg and Cardinal Mooney in convincing fashion.

MIX OF OLD AND NEW: You don't win four consecutive titles without good coaching and a dynamic scheme. Hoban possesses both. The Knights are particularly dangerous on offense, because of not only the team's talent, but its playbook. Hoban operates mainly out of the shotgun, with 4-5 receivers on the field on most plays. However, Tim Tyrrell's offense has borrowed pages from old school playbooks, instituting wishbone and Maryland I formations. On running situations or in the goal line, Hoban will break out a three-back wishbone, with 2 H-backs and a halfback, or the Maryland I with two fullbacks in close and Deamonte Trayanum as the deep back.

HAMMING IT UP: Quarterback Shane Hamm is the leader of a powerful offense. A third-year starter, Hamm possesses both good arm strength and poise in the pocket. In the first half against Harrisburg, Hamm completed 8-of-17 passes for 158 yards. Unafraid to run the ball, Hamm also carries the rock on draws or scrambles.

THE TRAYANUM TRAIN: Running back Deamonte Trayanum is without a doubt one of the best in the state. The catalyst of the offense, Trayanum is a powerful runner with deadly speed. Hoban uses him on power plays, outside runs, and in passing situations. Trayanum caught a swing route for a score in the red zone against Harrisburg and ripped off TD runs of 25, 34, 63, and 74 yards vs. Mooney. Trayanum is strictly an RB this year after playing both ways in 2018.

CLARK, FOX, AND MORE: Hoban has a lot of weapons on offense. Alabama commit Caden Clark is a man to watch at tight end. Clark can line up in the slot, next to the tackle, or as an H-back. Clark is a deep threat and strong on slants, screens, and drags. Brayden Fox is a deep threat at wideout, scoring a long TD on the first play of the year. Also look out for WRs Jared Mealy and Kharion Davis.

WATCH THE GUARDS: Hoban graduated several offensive linemen, but the unit is still very good. Pay particular attention to the guards – the Knights love to pull the guard to the playside to pave a running lane for Trayanum.

DEFENSIVE SCHEMING: Against an offense like the Wildcats, the Knights typically employ a 3-4 philosophy with three down linemen, two linebackers near the line of scrimmage, and two 'backers (or a backer and a defensive back) about 5 yards back. Hoban likes to pull out the blitz, especially delayed blitzes on passes.

COVERAGES: Hoban employs a Cover 2 base coverage (corners in the flats, 'backers in the middle of the field, 2 deep safeties). Against Harrisburg, Hoban called man coverage a handful of times. To confuse quarterbacks, Hoban will mix in Cover 6, a mix of a Cover 4 and Cover 2 scheme with the free safety covering half the field deep, and a corner and safety responsible for the other deep half.

GAME PREVIEW

WILDCATS LOOK TO END HOBAN'S LENGTHY WIN STREAK

Over the last four seasons, Archbishop Hoban has dominated Northeast Ohio. The Knights have won four state championships – two in Division II, two in Division III. Only three teams have defeated the Knights since 2015.

The last team to do so? The Saint Ignatius Wildcats. Since the Wildcats bested the Knights on August 24, 2017, Hoban has won 31 straight games.

A strong all-around effort will be needed to topple the Knights and end the winning streak.

Hoban enters with a 2-0 record, outscoring its two foes by a combined score of 91-12. The Wildcats bring in a 1-1 mark, fresh off a tough 38-31 defeat at Mentor due to a 21-0 Cardinals run.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. HOBAN DEFENSE

The #1 key for the Wildcats vs. the Knights? Get Connor Cmiel the ball.

Both Loyola Academy and Mentor blanketed Cmiel in double coverage, but he still found a way to haul in lenghty passes of 80 and 47 yards. Cmiel also made a huge impact on special teams with two touchdown returns, showcasing his speed and elusiveness.

Quarterback Griffin Hanna will be looking for Cmiel early and often. Hanna enjoyed success on the ground with a rushing score and some scrambles, but was limited to 105 passing yards. Hanna showcased grit by fighting through big hits.

Tight ends Sam Daugstrup and Jake Lang will also be important in the passing game, as will wideout Henry Cook. All three are good blockers, too.

Running back Jack Welcsh reached the century mark with 100 rushing yards last week, and he'll look to repeat the feat. James Crosby also played well, displaying his will in fighting through tackles.

Hoban will likely combat the Wildcats with a 3-4 philosophy. The Knights typically have three linemen in the 3-point stance with two linebackers at the line of scrimmage. Two other players typically stand 5 yards back as 'backers. Hoban's front 6-7 will adjust based on the strong side.

Michigan State commit Devin Hightower is the top playmaker on D. Last week, Hightower picked off a pass and took it 32 yards to the house.

As far as coverages, Hoban usually employs a base of Cover 2 (corners in the flats, linebackers in the middle, two deep safeties). To switch things up, Hoban will play Cover 6 (a variation of Cover 2 with a corner and safety covering one half of the field and a safety responsible for the other half) and the occasional man coverage scheme.

Hoban does like to blitz, so the Wildcats' offensive line will have to be smart in pass protection.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. HOBAN OFFENSE Few offenses in Ohio have the combination of star power and brilliant schemes that Hoban boasts.

Shane Hamm returns for his third season as the starting quarterback, winning every start since the first of his career in 2017 against the Wildcats. The 5'11, 190 pound signalcaller did not play Saint Ignatius last season. Equally adept at throwing and running, Hamm is a great dual-threat QB.

Deamonte Trayanum may just be one of the best backs in the state, if not the nation. The 6'3, 230-pound Arizona commit found the end zone on rushes of 25, 35, 64, and 73 yards vs. Mooney. The senior is a strong runner who rarely goes down on first contact. His speed is deadly, too.

Caden Clark may be the team's best utility player. The Alabama commit can line up in the slot, line of scrimmage, or as an H-back. Hoban uses him on screens, short passes, deep balls, and as a blocker.

Brayden Fox is a deadly deep threat. The 6'3, 205-pound junior burned both Harrisburg and Mooney on long balls, using his size to leap over opposing defensive backs.

Other wideouts to watch include Jared Mealy and Kharion Davis, as Hoban does not lack for speed or catching ability at wide receiver.

Hoban's offensive line is young, but quite effective. The guards often pull on run plays, punishing opponents with bruising blocking. The unit has gelled well so far.

Hoban's playbook mixes old and new. The base offense is a spread, running out of the shotgun with 4-5 wideouts. But Hoban will use a wishbone (2 H-backs, 1 halfback) or the Maryland I formation (2 fullbacks, 1 deep back).

The Wildcats will counter with the 3-3-5 defense, though the Wildcats will have creative new looks.

Bennett Adler, Anthony Gerace, and Rico Levert have done well on the defensive line this year. Adler, in particular, is enjoying a breakout start to the season.

The big news for the defense is the return of Michael McNamara. The captain is a critical cog of the defense at linebacker. His return is big news.

Aidan Conway, Aidan Hubbard and Nick Velotta have held the line in his absence. All three will remain heavily involved in the game plan.

The secondary did well last week, with Charlie Kinzel leading the way with an interception and a key pass breakup. Free safety Merick Hartley is also off to a great start.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Declan Mangan will lead the Wildcats' kicking game this week. All eyes will be on Cmiel after his big week, but Hoban will likely avoid him.

Charlie Durkin will handle Hoban's kicking game.

MENTOR RECAP

IN AN INSTANT CLASSIC, THE CARDS OUTLAST THE CATS

In what might have been the final game between legendary Northeast Ohio coaches Steve Trivisonno and Chuck Kyle '69, the Cardinals squeaked by with a win in a thrilling ballgame that lasted nearly three hours.

While Saint Ignatius entered the fourth quarter with a lead, Mentor scored 21 points in the final stanza to best the Wildcats, 38-31, on Friday at Jerome T. Osborne Sr. Stadium in a game that many will remember for a while.

The loss undoubtedly stings for the Wildcats, sending the team to 1-1 on the year. But positives abound from the win. Most notably, Connor Cmiel delivered one of the most thrilling performances by a Wildcat in recent memory.

The game featured wall-to-wall action from start to finish. The excitement began nearly immediately, on Mentor's second drive of the game. The Cardinals tossed an interception to Charlie Kinzel. Just a couple of minutes later, the Wildcats found a way to get a touchdown. Nick Schwitzgebel fell on a loose ball in the end zone, giving Saint Ignatius the lead.

The Cardinals did not take long to respond. Mentor QB Ian Kipp found a seam on the first play of the drive and exploited it for a 70-yard gain. A couple of plays later, Mentor's talented running back Brian Trobel found paydirt on a short touchdown run.

On the ensuing kickoff, Cmiel took a kickoff to the house, as he was barely, if ever, touched en route to an 85-yard return. The Cats led, 13-7.

Mentor's offense answered the call to score. Trobel punished his way to paydirt, firing up the middle and breaking tackles en route on a 16-yard run.

Following a stalled Wildcats' drive, Mentor marched down the field. The Cardinals settled for a 33-yard field goal, extending their lead to 17-13 with 9:10 left.

The Wildcats responded with a punishing, physical drive. Relying on Jack Welcsh, the Wildcats marched down the field. Griffin Hanna carried the ball into the end zone on a 1-yard designed quarterback run to end it. The Wildcats decided to go for two, and Hanna passed to Lang for a 21-17 lead, which stood at half.

On the opening kickoff of the second half, Mentor kicked to Cmiel. The senior found a seam, made a man miss, and found the end zone. However, the great return was negated by a penalty

Nevertheless, the Wildcats got 3 points, as Declan Mangan hit a 20-yard field goal.

On Mentor's next drive, a third-down sack by Bennett Adler forced a Mentor field goal. Once again, the Saint Ignatius special teams stepped up. Merick Hartley blocked the kick and the ball found Cmiel. He dashed down the Saint Ignatius sidelines past an unsuspecting

Mentor special teams unit, dashing 80 yards to paydirt. After the extra point, the Wildcats led by two scores, 31-17. It stayed that way until the fourth.

Facing fourth and goal from the 1-yard line early in the fourth, Mentor turned to Trobel. The senior bounced off a would-be tackler and forced his way into the end zone. The clutch run started Mentor's 21-0 run.

Just two minutes later, Mentor tied the game after a Saint Ignatius turnover. Trobel pounded the rock in from the 5-yard line to make the Wildcats pay. With 9:16 to play, the game hung in the balance.

After an unsuccessful Wildcats' drive, Mentor scored on its third straight drive. At the end of an 8-play, 67-yard drive, Kipp scored his first touchdown of the day. The junior pushed his way into the end zone from two yards out, giving the hosts a 38-31 lead.

On the ensuing Wildcats' drive, Griffin Hanna took a big hit on a huge sack by the Cardinals, forcing him out of the game. Hanna was examined and cleared, but the Wildcats could not convert a 3rd and 12 without him in the game. The Cats punted it back to the Cards.

Mentor managed to pick up two first downs before the Saint Ignatius defense shut them down. Burning the team's remaining two timeouts, the Wildcats stopped the Cardinals on third and fourth downs on an Emmett Hanna tackle of Trobel and a Charlie Kinzel pass deflection.

With 45 seconds to play and no timeouts from the Saint Ignatius 31-yard line, the Wildcats faced quite a challenge.

On the first play of the drive, Cmiel made a huge appearance. The senior caught a pass from Hanna and rallied 47 yards down the field. Suddenly, the Wildcats had 1st and 10 from the Mentor 22-yard line.

After an incompletion, Hanna lofted a pass to Jake Lang in the end zone on the nearside boundary. Lang hauled in the pass, but his knee touched the white line before he had full possession. The Wildcats' fans did not like the outcome, but the official made the correct call. Lang was out of bounds, though not by much. A few inches, and Lang scores a game-saving touchdown. (And, yes, the Wildcats would have gone for two instead of trying to tie it, Coach Kyle said.)

On the next play, Hanna found Welcsh for a beautiful completion inside the 10-yard line. Alas, the referee threw a flag for a holding call on the right side of the Wildcats' line. The devastating penalty spelled the death knell of the comeback, pushing the Cats back to the Mentor 40-yard line. The last pass of the game fell incomplete on the turf thanks to a stiff pass rush.

The Cardinals walked out of the JTO with the 38-31 win, dropping the Cats to 1-1.



Dowed Field will be the location of the third game of the season for the Wildcats, as they will battle the Knights on Friday, September 13. This is just the fourth meeting all-time between the two schools.

The field is named after Monsignor Richard Dowed, who had convinced Archbishop Edward Hoban of the need for the school in 1953, and obtained the land that is now used as the school's campus. Dowed's impact on the school was so great that there is award given out every year in his honor to the student in each grade level who best exemplifies the ideals of service, spirit, and leadership.

In 2013 the turf was redone in order to feature Hoban's newly designed logo, and new goalposts were put into place. The field is home to the football team, as well as the boys and girls soccer, lacrosse, and track and field teams.

The Knights have had plenty of success in recent years, as the football team has captured four straight OHSAA state championships. Under head coach Tim Tyrell, the Knights won Division III titles in 2015 and 2016 before moving up to Division II and winning crowns in 2017 and 2018.

The Knights will look to tie the Wildcats' record of five consecutive state championships this year. Hoban will be competing in Division II this season for the third year in a row.

Wildcats open season with tough loss at home to defending state champion **Hoban Knights**

PARMA - The Saint Ignatius Wildcats battled until the end, but Hoban held on to win for the Knights.

The Knights drove into field goal range on their first drive, but Danny Scelza and other Cats blocked a field goal. The Wildcats took possession at the Knights' 42-yard line but could not take advantage of the opportunity. Pat Otter's punt hemmed in Hoban at its 16-yard line at the 7:02 mark of the first.

The first big play occurred with just over two minutes left in the first quarter. Patrick Delahunty found Nigel Drummond II in the flat. Drummond galloped 59 yards to place the Wildcats deep in Knights territory. The hosts could not take advantage of the opportunity. The Knights blocked a would-be 48-yard field goal with 25 seconds left in the quarter.

On Hoban's next drive, they scored with 9:31 in the second, as Jordan Mick found Matt Blanchard in the end zone for a 21-yard touchdown. After the extra point the score was 7-0.

The Wildcats and Knights traded punts. With six minutes left in the half, after a 16-yard screen pass to Jack Welcsh. Delahunty and Luke Cooper connected for 19 yards. Two plays later, Welcsh scored. Rory McConville's extra point tied the contest at seven with 3:14 left in the half.

With the wind swirling at Byers Field in the first half, the Knights turned to the ground game, using 3-back sets in the second half. Mixing in play-action passes to Caden Clark, Hoban's offense started to move down the field. Hoban finished the drive with an off-tackle run for 21 yards and six points by Deamonte Trayanum. The extra point made the score 14-7.

Early in the fourth quarter, on a 4th and 1 play, the Knights ran outside, with Trayanum rolling 43 yards to the end zone. The extra point stretched Hoban's advantage to 21-7.

A break went to the Wildcats on a punt. A Hoban player accidentally touched the punt, and the Wildcats dove to grab it. A Saint Ignatius player emerged with the ball at the 27-yard line. The Knights stood strong. Hoban blitzed and notched back-to-back sacks, preventing the Wildcats from taking advantage of the turnover.

After the Wildcats' defense forced a Hoban punt, the Wildcats' offense took over deep in its own territory with 5:30 remaining. Connor Cmiel caught four passes in a row from Delahunty to march down the field. The Wildcats completed the drive with 4:19 left. Delahunty dashed to paydirt on a 9-yard scramble up the middle for six. McConville tacked on the extra point to narrow the deficit to 21-14.

The Wildcats did well on defense. Cornerback Jett Elad and linebacker Tommy Eichenberg shined. Elad and Eichenberg finished with 10 and 8 tackles, respectively, along with a combined 4 tackles for loss.


