



Concussion Testing for Shaker Heights Youth Hockey Association

Once again, Shaker Youth Hockey Association has partnered with University Hospitals' Sports Medicine Department to offer baseline concussion testing to all SYHA athletes at a significantly reduced rate of **\$30 per athlete**. Normally, the cost is \$250 per test. University Hospitals has greatly reduced the fee through the SYHA partnership and additional costs have been assumed by SYHA and other generous supporters of our hockey program. While the testing is NOT required to play in the SYHA program, it is a tremendous opportunity and families are encouraged to take advantage of it. **PLEASE NOTE: IF YOUR CHILD COMPLETED THE BASELINE TESTING IN FALL 2018, THEN A TEST IS NOT NEEDED THIS YEAR.**

This link will only accept payment and you must follow the instructions below to correctly register your player with University Hospitals. University Hospitals professionals will complete face-to-face baseline concussion testing. Each baseline test will take approximately one hour to complete. University Hospitals has devoted two weeks from **September 23th through October 4th**, to provide these one-hour tests to all SYHA athletes who sign up (Mite through Bantam level). Again, this year University Hospital's is bringing the testing to Shaker Heights from 5 – 8 PM at their location at 3605 Warrensville Center Road. **University Hospitals is using the following on-line scheduling tool to help reserve times for your athletes. For Bantam players 13 and 14 years old, a computerized test will be available October 9th and 10th at the same facility. Please use this link to register your Bantam player. <https://impacttesting.eventbrite.com>. Parents may need to sign a neuropsych consent (titled "NPCConsent"). This is a consent that is specific for neuropsychological services and needs to be completed for each child by the child's legal guardian. Also, parents should know that whomever brings the child for testing will be asked to complete a general consent for medical treatment at the time of check-in at the desk. Lastly, though we encourage parents to take their own child, I know that some parents may need to have someone else bring their child. For those parents, they will need to fill out the other form ("Parent Guardian Consent to Treat Minor Patients"). That only needs to be completed if someone other than the guardian is bringing the child to testing. If we don't have that, UH unfortunately will not be able to complete testing until a parent is contacted by phone to provide a verbal consent on the day of testing. Some of these consent forms may be distributed later, but prior to your child's scheduled testing date if needed.
