On Friday morning, we were greeted by a strong WNW breeze of 14–18kts and most competitors gladly accepted their 3rd on board. We had 3 races back-to-back-to-back in the big waves, with a slight break for lunch on the water. After the dust had settled, the B–66 was in the lead after day one with B–12 also in the hunt. Faring less well were the B–111 (ripped sail) and the B–1 (broken sidestay), all but confirming the rumor that your sailing falls off a cliff once you experience matrimony (though, on a personal note, it was a unique treat to get to sail with both my mom and mother-in-law at the same time). After the RC blew the three horns signaling a cancellation, a congratulations were in order for Ben on the national championship, and to the B–12 and B–18 for representing Beulah in the top 5. The next regatta on the docket is the C Invite on Nagawicka, where I'm sure we'll once again be well represented!

The Summer Solstice occurred on Tuesday, June 21. The longest daylight hours in a day, 15 hours – 21 minutes. The tilt of the earth towards the sun is at its maximum which means the sun has reached its maximum journey northward above the equator. It is also the furthest North the sun appears along the Western horizon at sunset.

The total "wobble" of the earth's axis in relationship to the orbit around the sun is approximately 46 degrees; 23 degrees North of the Equator to 23 degrees South of the Equator.

Bar Closet

The CO2 tanks in the bar closet is the driver that provides the pressurized gas propelling the beer through the line from the keg up to the beer tap and into your waiting burgee glass. The two gauges you see on the tank provide a reading of the gas in the tank usually up to 3,000 psi and the operating pressure to the tap up to 60psi.

According to Dr. Draft, these pressures are significant enough to cause concern if the tank were to tip over and damage the regulator. This could turn the cylinder into a missile.

The tanks have been chained to the plywood backing against the wall in the bar storage room to prevent this from happening.



Security Cameras

Four (4) new security cameras have been installed on the interior of the LBYC Clubhouse. These replace a system on loan from the Greeson's. One camera is located in the Kitchen, Foyer, Dining Room and Bar. The master control panel and monitor are located in the LBYC Office and has the capability of recording the activity in the club for

approximately a month. There is a capability of downloading an event to a thumb drive, but the normal activity will run a continuous loop erasing and recording activity.

The new cameras are wired back to the office control panel above the suspended acoustic tile ceiling.

Tennis Courts

The sprinkling system which conditions the clay playing surface of the tennis courts is composed of seven heads sub-divided into two (2) zones. During the night, once at midnight and again at 4:00AM these heads water the courts for 20 minutes a head location. In the heat of the summer an additional third watering is done at Noon. This is done seven days a week, although the Noon cycle is omitted on the weekends.

The sprinkler heads at the end of the line tend to accumulate debris which ultimately affects the spray pattern and operation of the impact sprinkler head.

To prevent this various screened cages have been sunk in the channel where the system draws water from the Lake. Currently there is an acrylic filter assembly filled with pea gravel that weights the intake filter below the water line and provides a debris filter. Recently several tennis sprinkler heads have filled with debris and stopped working properly. The filter basket will be removed from the channel, cleaned and filled with fresh pea gravel. Filters should be cleaned on an annual basis.
