Presenters

Jim Dotseth, Master of Ceremonies, Secretary-Treasurer of the MFCA

Jim was Inducted into the MFCA Hall of Fame in 2010; Chair of the Awards Committee and serves on the Executive Committee and Mr. Football Committee; emcee of the Hall of Fame Celebration since 2010.

Paul Lemke, Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, Glencoe-Silver Lake Assistant Coach

Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee; he is a member of the Executive Committee and Hall of Fame Committee. Paul is a 2009 Butch Nash Award recipient and was selected as the 2018 Assistant Coach of the Year.

Dwight Lundeen, Becker High School

2014 MFCA Coach of the Year. He serves on the Mr. Football Committee, Awards Committee, and is MFCA liaison with the Minnesota Vikings. Becker won the 3A Prep Bowl in 2005, and 4A Prep Bowl in 2014 and 2015. Dwight has 367 wins, which is 3rd most in Minnesota football history. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2009. Lundeen has been the head coach at Becker for 50 years. He started the program in 1970 and continues to coach today.

Dave Nelson, Minnetonka High School, Chairman of MFCA Hall of Fame Celebration

Dave Nelson has coached at both Blaine and Minnetonka and his teams have made several state playoff appearances. He led both schools to state championship titles - Blaine in 1988 and Minnetonka in 2004. Dave served as MFCA President in 2002 and was named State Coach of the Year in 2004. In 2014, he was named MFCA Clinic Man of the Year and was inducted into the MFCA Hall of Fame. He's a member of the Executive Committee, Awards Committee and the Tackle Cancer Committee. Dave was awarded the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Power of Influence Award in 2020.

Presenters

Ron Stolski, Brainerd High School, Executive Director MFCA

1983 MFCA President; 2006 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) national Power of Influence recipient; 2008 Hall of Fame inductee. The 2019 season was his 58th as head coach and he currently ranks 2nd in wins among all Minnesota coaches with 389. He is on several MFCA committees and is chair of the very successful MFC Clinic that was held this weekend here at the Doubletree. In 2010 he was named MFCA Coach of the Year.

Bubba Sullivan, Northfield Head Coach

Bubba has brought several Northfield teams to the state tournament. They were 1997 4A State Champion and Bubba was named State Coach of the Year. He is Chair of the Jerry Kill Power of Influence Committee; member of the Hall of Fame Committee and the Academic All-State Selection Committee.

Scott Tschimperle, Co-Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, Glencoe-Silver Lake Head Coach

2015-2016 MFCA President; Glencoe-Silver Lake was Prep Bowl Class 3A champion in 2008 and runner-up in 2009. Scott is a member of the Hall of Fame Committee and the Executive Committee.



MFCA Code of Ethics

PREAMBLE

One of the distinguishing characteristics of a profession in education may be that its members are cognizant of, and perhaps dedicated to, rendering a service to humanity. As educators who choose to coach football, we must understand that the justification for football is that it provides educational and physical values for those who play the game, and the game essentially belongs to the players who choose to play it. The welfare of the game depends on how coaches live up to the spirit and letter of ethical conduct, and how coaches, as educators, model ethical conduct, and remain mindful of the trust and confidence placed in them by colleagues, players and the public.

PURPOSE

This code of ethics has been developed to protect, promote, and preserve the best interests of the game and the coaching profession. Its primary purpose is to clarify and distinguish ethical and professional practices from those which are detrimental. Its secondary purpose is to emphasize the value of football as an experience that contributes to the overall education of the student-athlete and to stress proper functions in relation to schools, players and the public.

ARTICLE ONE | Responsibility To Players

1. Coaches shall be aware of the tremendous influence they have on the education of the student-athlete; therefore, they shall never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character and integrity.
2. Coaches shall follow or create and enforce a set of training rules for players that reflect the positive values of abstaining from drugs, alcohol and tobacco.
3. Coaches shall never place the value of winning over the safety and welfare of players.
4. Coaches shall not exert pressure on faculty members to give players special consideration.
5. Coaches shall show respect to all players by treating them with integrity and honesty in both verbal and nonverbal behavior, regardless of their role or contribution to the team.
6. Coaches are responsible for their players' actions on the field and must not permit them to perform with the intent of causing injury to opposing players.
7. Coaches shall not seek unfair advantage by teaching deliberate unsportsmanlike behavior to players; they shall instruct players to play within the written rules and within the spirit of the game at all times.

ARTICLE TWO | Professional Behavior

1. Coaches shall exemplify the highest moral character, behavior and leadership.
2. Coaches shall display modesty in victory and be gracious in defeat.
3. Coaches shall promote ethical relationships among fellow coaches.
4. Prior to, and following contests, coaches for the competing teams should meet and exchange cordial greetings to set the correct tone for the event.

ARTICLE THREE | Sportsmanship

1. Coaches shall exhibit, model and teach good sportsmanship.
2. Coaches shall exert their influence to enhance sportsmanship by spectators, both directly and by working closely with cheerleaders, pep clubs, booster groups, parents and administrators.

ARTICLE FOUR | Scouting

It is considered ethical to scout opponents only during games and agreed upon scrimmages, and within the designated rules of the conference or section by-laws. The head coach is responsible for the actions of his scouts.

ARTICLE FIVE | Relationships With Game Officials

Coaches shall respect the integrity and judgment of the game official. Coaches shall not indulge in conduct which would incite players or spectators against officials. Public criticism of officials is considered unethical.

The Minnesota Football Hall of Fame honors those unique individuals whose efforts in coaching, administration and promotion of football have been truly outstanding.

Hall of Fame nomination forms are submitted to the Football Coaches Association Officers and Hall of Fame Committee members. The selection committee meets each winter to review the Hall of Fame nominees and make selections.

The Hall of Fame inducts members into one of three divisions:

- 1 The Citation Division** honors support to the promotion of high school football over a long period of time.
- 2 The College Division** honors college football coaches, players, and support personnel who have achieved a standard of excellence over many years.
- 3 The High School Division** honors our football coaching colleagues who have spent the majority of their professional years serving the high school student athletes of Minnesota.

Mike Plinske High School Assistant Coach Bethel University

Mike Plinske was raised in Minneapolis and moved to Canby, Minnesota in 1956. At Canby High School, he lettered in four sports, earning all-conference honors and serving as team captain in football, basketball, baseball, and track and field. He received a football scholarship from South Dakota State University and graduated with a bachelor's degree in Physical Education, English and Biology and a master's degree in Physical Education. As defensive coordinator, Richfield High School finished as state finalist in 1975 and 1977. During his time as a basketball coach his teams were state finalists in 1974 and 1975. Plinske coached 11 All-State football players along with a 1980 Mr. Basketball finalist. In 1986, Plinske retired from coaching in the Richfield Public Schools to follow the athletic endeavors of his two children, Paul and Julia. In 1987 he returned to the grid iron at Minneapolis Washburn High School where he coached Paul to All-State Honors as a running back.

In 1988, Mike was hired as the defensive coordinator at Bethel University in St. Paul. During his 13-year career, he helped turn the program into conference champions. Coaching ten All-Americans, Plinske was named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Division III Assistant Coach of the Year in 1988. His defensive units finished in the top three in Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) in four of his last five seasons. After a perfect 10-0 regular season in 2000, Mike announced his retirement from teaching and coaching.

Mike and Bernie enjoy their retirement with their children and grandchildren while living in Spicer in the summer months and Palm Desert, California in the winter.

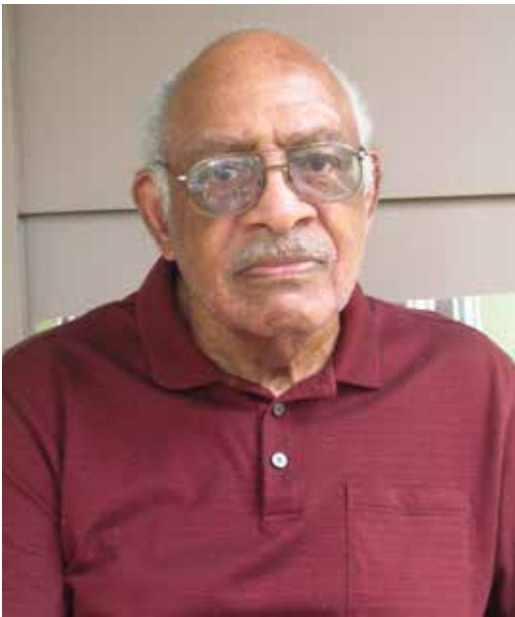

Dave currently serves on the Executive Committee of the Association, is on the statewide AllStar Committee, and has been in a leadership role for the MFCA coaches for over three decades.

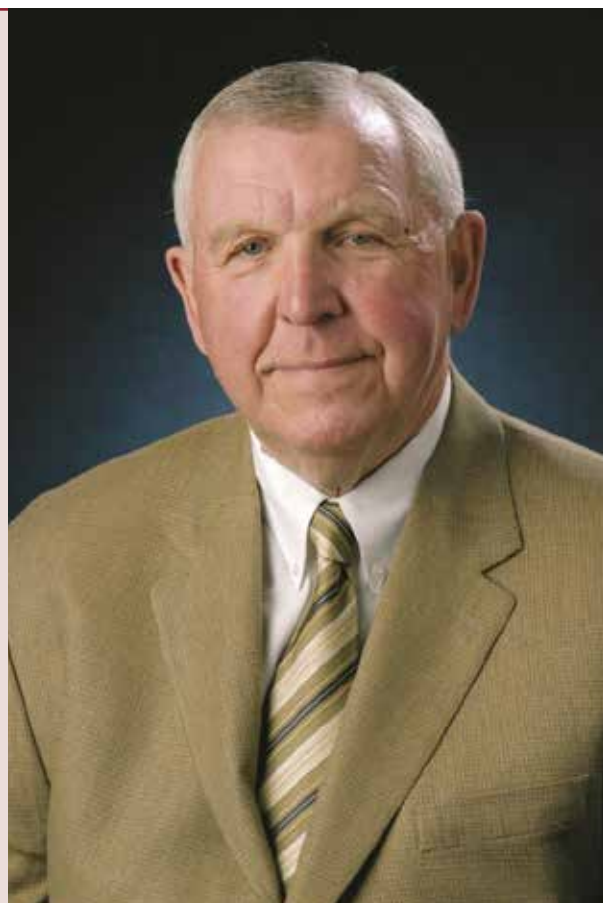
Dave and his wife, Caroll, live in Ham Lake, Minnesota. They have three children and six grandchildren.

He was a proud graduate of South High school and Gustavus Adolphus College and a lifelong educator in the city of Minneapolis. His work as part of the MFCA clinic is legendary and he will never be replaced. In honoring "Swannie," we remember his sense of humor, his quick wit, his engaging charm, and, most importantly, his tireless efforts on behalf of students and coaches. He was one of our finest – a true 'Keeper of the Game.'



Jerry Kill Power of Influence Award



Steve "Jippy" Jipson is a 1980 graduate of Graceville High School, where he participated in football and wrestling. After high school he attended Willmar Ag School and started working for Clinton Ag Service in 1982, where he stayed for fourteen years. He then became a maintenance worker at Holy Trinity Hospital in Graceville which eventually became Essentia Health. At Holy Trinity, all of the Nuns enjoyed having him around, especially Sister Mary Joseph who absolutely adored him. In 2015 he took on a new job as Grounds/Maintenance Assistant at the Graceville Public School and after two years took on the role of Grounds/Maintenance Supervisor.

Jippy's coaching career began as a Junior High football at Graceville in 1999. He then moved to assistant football coach for Clinton-Graceville-Beardsley (CGB) in 2001. After three seasons, he was promoted to Co-Head coach where the Wolverines earned a state runner-up trophy in 2008 and were undefeated state 9-man champs in 2012. Steve took over the football program on his own in 2018. His awards include six time Pheasant Conference Coach of the Year, three time Section 3 9-man Coach of the Year, and Co-Head 9 Man State Coach of the Year in 2012.

Besides football, Jippy served as the head softball coach from 2000 - 2008, during this time he lead the CGB Wolverine softball team to their best season ever with a 4th place finish in the 2004 State A Softball Tournament. He was also named the Section Coach of the Year.

The 2018-2019 CGB students dedicated their high school annual to Coach Jipson and in it they said: "to cite all of the contributions he has made to the school and community would take too long so we will describe him in three words.....dedication, selfless, and leadership"

For **DEDICATION**, it was stated, no matter the sport or outlook Jippy consistently put forth the time and effort to ensure that athletic programs represented the CGB community with the highest standard.

When it came to **SELFLESS**, Steve unfailingly put the needs of others before his own no matter what the circumstances may be. Whenever praise and credit came to himself he always directed it to the rightful owner..... the kids. While receiving cancer treatments he was at every practice and game until the first playoff game, when it was just too cold, and it tore him apart because he, "needed to be there for the kids".

As a **LEADER**, Jippy, helped a generation of young athletes as well as the adults he worked with. He understood the importance of teamwork, communication, a solid work-ethic, and humility. These qualities not only served his players well as athletes, but as adults and community members.

As one former player stated, "Steve taught us humility, responsibility, and selflessness. His service to the community will be remembered as he impacted generations beyond his own." After winning the 9-man championship in 2012, the athlete stated; " we may have "DID IT" on that day, but Steve "DID IT" in life"

His message to the players: "Remember...Slant to Power, Arizona, stay eligible, and Attack, Attack, Attack"! "Now, go home and eat some soup"!

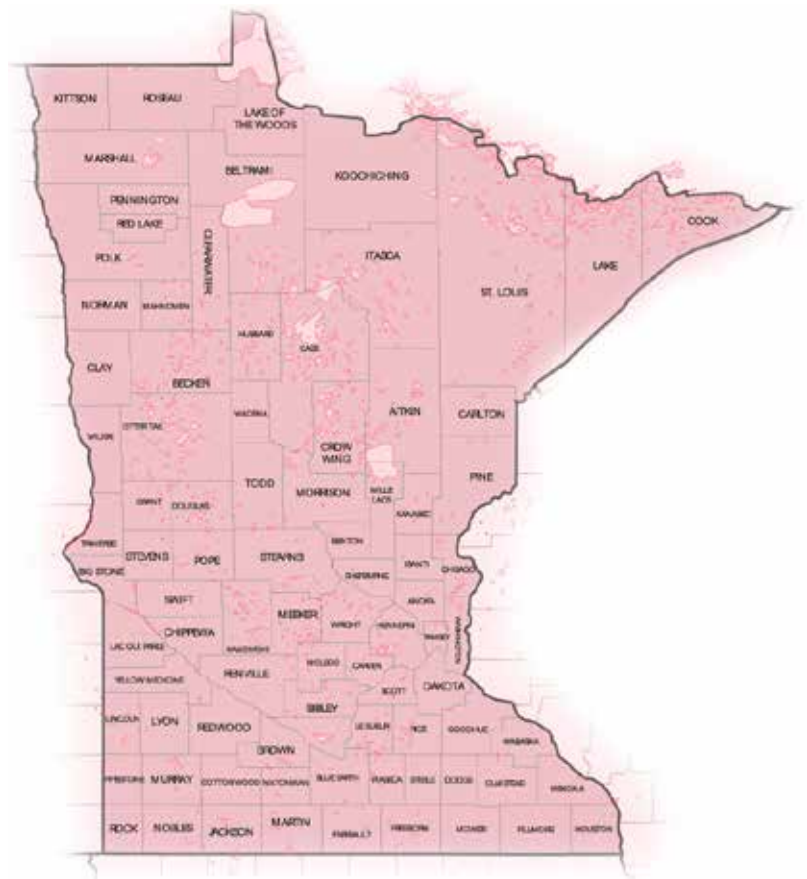
