

ALBION TIGERS HISTORY

The original Albion Tigers were a member of the semi-pro Central Wisconsin League in the 1930s, attracting players from Madison, Milwaukee, and Rockford and often hosting barnstorming professional teams such as the Kansas City Monarchs and Chicago Giants. The ballclub was forced to disband during World War II, but was re-born in 1946 as an amateur outfit and joined the Home Talent League in 1947. The Tigers have had a long and successful history, with sectional championships and Final Four appearances in 1953, 1957, 1976, 2011, and 2016. The Tigers won their first Home Talent League title in 2016.

Wally Olstad was a Tiger player and manager from the team's rebirth in 1946 until 1985. His teams compiled a 307-295 record in those years, with three Final Four appearances. Wally won Manager of the Year awards in 1976 and 1981, and is truly a Home Talent League legend. The scoreboard and concrete bench in Albion Park are dedicated to his memory. Wally's memory is further commemorated every July with the Annual Wally Olstad Classic, when the Tigers face a Southeast Section rival at Edgerton's Tobacco Heritage Days.
