## TONIGHT'S GAME

Team USA gets ready for its third game of Group B round-robin play at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship this evening, playing in a back-to-back against Finland.

Tonight's game will be the 20th career meeting between Team USA and Finland at the U18 World Championship. The U.S. holds an 11-2-0-6 (W-OTW-OTL-L) advantage and comes in having won two in a row in the series.

All of Team USA's preliminary-round games will take place at St. Jakob Arena in Basel, Switzerland, home of the Swiss League's EHC Basel. The arena holds 6,700 spectators for hockey games.

## TALKING POINTS

### PRELIMINARY ROUND VS. NORWAY

**Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) recorded three goals and two assists while **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) added a four-goal game as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team downed Norway by a 12-1 final Saturday (April 22) evening at St. Jakob Arena.

### HEAR IT FROM COACH

"We keep saying to the players we've got to keep building, every game is going to be different," said **Dan Muse** (Canton, Mass.), head coach of the 2023 Under-18 Men's National Team. "It was a good game and now we turn the page to get ready for tomorrow."

### NEW LEADER IN THE CLUBHOUSE

With a first-period assist on **Ryan Leonard's** (Amherst, Mass.) goal, U.S. forward **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) notched his 118th point of the season, giving him the most points in a single season in USA Hockey National Team Development Program history. The previous record of 117 was held by NHL superstar **Auston Matthews** (NTDP 2013-15/Toronto Maple Leafs) during the 2014-15 season.

Perreault went on to record a five-point (3g-2a) night, including the game-winning score, and now has 121 points (51g-70a) from 58 games on the 2022-23 campaign. The future Boston College Eagle leads the team in goals (51), assists (70), points (121), shots on goal (198), +/- (+70), game-winning goals (9) and points-per-game (2.09).

Over his two-year tenure at the NTDP, Perreault's 174 points ranks sixth all-time, as he and linemate **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.), who has 177 in fifth place, have a few more games to continue to climb the ranks. The next slot to move up is the 180 point mark, previously set by **Phil Kessel** (NTDP 2003-05/Vegas Golden Knights) and **Cole Caufield** (NTDP 2017-19/Montreal Canadiens).

### BEST SERVED COLD

The IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship is the third international tournament of the season for Team USA, after playing in the 2022 U18 Five Nations in November at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan, and the 2023 U18 Four Nations in Rauma, Finland in February.

Through 11 games, Team USA has amassed an 10-1 record with its lone loss coming to tonight's opponent, a 5-2 finish in Finland back on February 11. The U.S. won the November matchup by a 7-5 final, making tonight's rubber match a deciding third game in the season series.

## TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2023 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 20-30, 2023, in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland. The U.S. enters the tournament off of a silver-medal finish at the 2022 event in Germany. Team USA has 10 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Basel at St. Jakob Arena against Group B opponents Finland, Latvia, Norway and Switzerland. The quarterfinal round will be split between Basel and Porrentruy while both semifinals and medal-round games will all take place in Basel.

Group A consists of Canada, Czechia, Germany, Slovakia and Sweden and they will play their games at Raffeyen Arena in Porrentruy.

## WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which begins Thursday (April 20) and runs through April 30 in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland.

## ADDITIONAL NOTES

### EASY EISY

Team USA forward **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.) netted four goals in yesterday's 12-1 win over Norway, which tied both the U.S. and tournament record for most goals in a single game at the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. **Isaac Howard** (NTDP 2020-22/Michigan State University), who scored four in last year's 8-3 win over Canada, was the most recent U.S. skater to accomplish the feat.

The four scores pushed the University of Minnesota commit's season-long goal total to 65, just seven shy of **Cole Caufield's** (NTDP 2017-19/Montreal Canadiens) NTDP record mark of 72 in 2018-19. Eiserman has added 34 assists on the season for 99 total points as he looks to become the third U.S. skater to eclipse the century mark this year.

### BACK AT IT AGAIN

Every team in the tournament will face a back-to-back gameday in preliminary-round play and tonight's contest against Finland is the opportunity for Team USA.

In 22 previous back-to-back's this season, the U.S. Under-18 Team is 19-3-0, outscoring their opponents by a combined 114-52 margin in those games.

### SPECIAL SPECIALS

After each team has played two games at the IIHF U18 World Championship, Team USA sits atop both ends of team special teams rankings, sitting in both first place in power-play percentage and penalty killing.

After going 2-for-3 on the power play last night, with both goals scored by **Cole Eiserman** (Newburyport, Mass.), Team USA's power play is up to 50.0%, converting on six of their 12 opportunities. Eiserman has three PPGs through two games, while **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.), **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) and **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) have each added one on the unit headed by assistant coach **Chad Kolarik** (Abington, Pa.).

The penalty kill, led by assistant coach **Anthony Walsh** (Burr Ridge, Ill.) is the last remaining perfect PK in the tournament as the U.S. has killed all eight man-down situations. Helping the kill is the fact that Team USA has just 16 penalty minutes assessed to them, tied for second-fewest in the tournament.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Team USA captain **Zach Schulz** (South Lyon, Mich.) came to Switzerland with just seven points, all assists, on the season, but after an assist yesterday has found his name on the scoresheet in both games so far at the U18 World Championship.

The 6-foot-1, 189-pound defenseman scored his first goal of the campaign off a firm wrister late in the third period in the U18s 7-1 win over Latvia to begin pool play. He followed that up with a helper on **Cole Eiserman's** (Newburyport, Mass.) third-period power-play score yesterday to give him points in back-to-back games for the third time this season. Five of Schulz' nine points this season have come from international play, while the University of Wisconsin commit also registered an NCAA assist in a game at Adrian (Mich.) College back on January 24.

### PRELIMINARY ROUND VS. LATVIA

**Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) scored two goals and **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) and **Cole Hutson** (Barrington, Ill.) added three points each as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team topped Latvia, 7-1, to open preliminary-round play on Thursday (April 20) at St. Jakob Arena.

### PRE-TOURNAMENT VS. CZECHIA

**Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) had two goals and two assists and **Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.), **Cole Hutson** (Barrington, Ill.) and **Carey Terrance** (Akwesasne, N.Y.) added three points apiece as the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team skated past Czechia, 9-2, in their lone pre-tournament game ahead of the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

### NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Seventeen members of the 2023 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were named to the National Hockey League Central Scouting's Final Rankings ahead of the 2023 NHL Draft, set to take place June 28-29 at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee.

**Will Smith** (Lexington, Mass.) was the highest-rated Team USA player and maintained his third overall ranking from the mid-season report in January. **Ryan Leonard** (Amherst, Mass.) sits in the fifth overall spot for North American skaters, while **Oliver Moore** (Mounds View, Minn.) is eighth overall and **Gabe Perreault** (Hinsdale, Ill.) rounds out the top-10 in the 10th slot.

Forward **Danny Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) ranks in the top-32, indicating a possible first-round selection in the draft, at 22nd overall. **Carey Terrance** (Akwesasne, N.Y.) followed at 38th overall, up 12 spots from the mid-term list.

A trio of defenseman appear next on the final rankings, as **Paul Fischer** (River Forest, Ill.) sits at 58th, followed by **Drew Fortescue** (Pearl River, N.Y.) right behind at 60th and **Brady Cleveland** (Wausau, Wis.) in the 64th slot.

**Beckett Hendrickson** (Minnetonka, Minn.) climbed up the rankings significantly to 67th overall after he sat 94th in January's mid-term rankings. Following Hendrickson is **Aram Minnetian** (Woodcliff Lake, N.J.) at 78th and **Zach Schulz** (South Lyon, Mich.) at 96th.

Team USA continued its representation with **Will Vote** (Arlington, Mass.) at 145th, **Salvatore Guzzo** (Old Tappan, N.J.) at 196th and **Ryan Fine** (Center Moriches, N.Y.) rounding out the skaters at 200.

In the cage, a pair of U.S. goaltenders were ranked highly among North American netminders as **Trey Augustine** (South Lyon, Mich.) finished at third and **Carsen Musser** (Sherburn, Minn.) sits eighth in the final Central Scouting listing.
