The Mayo High School ONE ACT PLAY cast will be competing in a State Tournament Performance on Friday, February 9th, 2024. In an effort to help you better understand the Pep Bus arrangements, school excused absences and parent permission slips, the following information is presented.

NOTE THIS SCHEDULE IS TENTATIVE BASED ON RESULTS OF EACH MATCH**

Cost for the bus will be \$20 per person payable to Mayo HS. Each student will also be required to purchase a **State Tournament Ticket for \$15.00** in order to gain admittance to the venue. Bus tickets will be sold in the Activities Office until Thursday, February 8th at 3:30. To ride the Pep Bus, the permission form below must be signed and returned to Mrs. Zollner. Students must purchase a bus ticket in order to ride the bus. **All students riding the Pep Bus to the Performance must return on the bus. Students may not leave the state tournament venue or facility.**

MSHSL RESPONSIBILITY FOR SPECTATOR CONDUCT

School officials shall be held responsible for the proper conduct of teams, team members, students and spectators regardless of where the contest is being held. (Bylaw 409.00 #2)

School administrators should remind students about their citizenship and sportsmanship responsibilities when they act as representatives from their school community.

Each participating school shall designate a person or persons from that school to serve as crowd control supervisors or chaperones. MSHSL tournament staff may require school administrators to contact the tournament manager prior to the start of the tournament game so that they can be immediately contacted to respond to behavioral issues regarding their team members, students and/or spectators at the tournament site. Each supervisor or chaperone should be immediately identifiable to the students and to the tournament site ushers and other security personnel. This will coordinate crowd control between school supervisors and tournament site personnel.

STUDENT CONDUCT

1. All spectators must wear clothing that covers the entire torso. Those who do not comply, or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way is inappropriate will be removed from the arena/stadium if they do not cooperate with tournament personnel.
2. **UNDER NO CONDITION** should ANY member of your school's student body go on to the playing surface. The school administrator is responsible to see that this does not occur.
3. Hand held signs, which do not obstruct the view of others, will be permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs, message boards, "white" boards or other similar items not in good taste will be removed.
4. Artificial noisemakers (megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, etc.) are not allowed.
5. Laser lights are not allowed.

U OF M Spectator Policies and Information

1. Guests should stay home if they are sick or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19
2. U of M Bag Policy: o Bags cannot exceed 12" x 12" and camera lenses cannot exceed 6". Bags needed for medical purposes are subject to a search and will be tagged. Please see this link for a detailed list of prohibited items: University of Minnesota Bag Policy

3. Camera tri-pods/mono-pods and "selfie sticks" are NOT allowed.
4. No beverages, food or noisemakers will be allowed to be brought into the facility.
5. No balloons, laser pointers, noisemakers, air-horns, horns, drums, or whistles will be allowed in the facility.
6. No weapons of any kind including licensed concealed carry weapons, knives, etc.
7. No signs or banners may be hung in the facility. Hand-held signs allowed (can be held by one person).
