- Ryan Parrish made a motion to accept the minutes
- Jason Miller seconded the motion
- No discussions
- Motion passed unanimously

- Reported total assets and expenditures
- Keith Davison has asked Jeff Strueder to speak to an investment professional in regards to investing in a safe investment as opposed to all in checking/savings accounts
- Mary Friedt made a motion to accept the treasurer's report
- Ryan Parrish seconded the motion
- No additional discussions
- Motion passed unanimously

Old Business

Safe Sport

- Keith Davison reported that he has been in contact with Dan Prochnow, USA Wrestling Safe Sport representative, and we need to have someone from the board to take on responsibility of Safe Sport Coordinator for the ISWA
- If anyone comes to any of us regarding a leader within the ISWA, involving sexual inappropriateness our only process is to go to law enforcement.
- If not reported to law enforcement you are complicit.
- Once reported, the process is to come back to the board to start the process through Safe Sport.
- Safe Sport protects against sexual, physical, and verbal abuse.
- Copy of new flowchart for Safe Sport situations will be forwarded to board members and placed on the website.

New Age Divisions/Weight Classes

- Discussions around confusion of USAW age divisions (U12 being 12 and under but is actually under 12.
- Board members should make sure to frame it to help our members understand
- Keith Davison will post a clarification
- Have been questions posed from parents about athletes who are outside of the stated weight classes listed by USAW
- Pat Culp reported that this is already addressed on our website on the listing of weight classes
- Will communicate that weights will be added as needed
- Pat Culp will assist Tina Tonte with verbiage for the website.
- When setting up state tournaments, weight classes are looked at from the prior year, as a starting point.

Annual Publication

- Chris Pruitt and Tina Tonte have been leading the research and discussions with vendors
- Chris Pruitt reported that they sent out proposals to several companies and Red Pen was able to provide us with efficiencies and were able to come back with information to assist us in hitting goals from a budgetary perspective to reduce our expenditures by \$5000.
- Provided quotes for the project
- Discussed the two most favorable options
- Report is available showing production costs from Red Pen
- Tina Tonte reported that she is extremely happy with the customer service provided by Red Pen and the assistance with duplication identification.
- Chris Pruitt recommended we move forward and enter into a contract with Red Pen services and move forward with completion of the publication.
- Ryan Parrish seconded the motion
- Keith Davison discussed the initial goal was to save costs but this will enable us to move forward and with digitizing will allow us to make changes
- Discussed possibility of selling extra copies
- One will be provided per household and addition copy can be purchased
- Will print 300-500 extra copies to sell.
- Motion passed unanimously

- Keith Davison reported that he met with Shelbourne asking if they wanted to be the sponsor of the trainers' tent.

- Ryan Parrish will be working on the letter that is sent to team leaders listing new rules. Coaches have to be listed on the team roster to get in free.

State Coaches Director – Danny Struck

- Wanted to thank Pat Culp and Keith Davison for stopping by the IHSWCA clinic.
- Growth in the local ISWA clubs start with the community leader the coach this is a great venue to connect the two.
- Maybe we could do a workshop with coaches who don't have clubs to work on trying to encourage them to start one?
- Discussed the focus of a club (Folkstyle, Greco, Freestyle, etc.) is a direct reflection of what the coach of that club emphasizes.
- Sometimes this is a direct result of what education the coach has regarding the different styles.
- We need to continually educate ourselves and feed that to our local coaches.
- On November 15th, Gary Mayabb (Greco Director of USA Wrestling) will be doing a Skype Greco clinic with our age group directors (and a few more) on what he would like to see our state doing to promote.
- Has set up another Skype conference with Terry Steiner (women's national team coach) on December 20th to help educate us in the strategies he would like to see us implementing.
- Will be doing the same on a date with Joe Russell (Freestyle) on a date in January.
- When we stop learning and trashing our teams we fail.
- We should all be able to pick something up on these calls and help push out to local clubs
- Invitations have been sent, if email addresses were available.
- ISWA sent 3 coaches to the OTC for training.

- IHSWCA sent 1 coach
- 3 other coaches paid their own way recently to the silver clinic at the OTC
- Go to ISWA.com to see what they learned at this valuable conference.
- Each coach wrote a write up of their favorite learning experiences to share with all.
- Indiana had the most coaches attend.
- Survey was sent to IHSWCA members asking them what they would like to see at spring clinic.
- Other than program building ideas the technique they want to see is Freestyle and Greco moves that will help them in Folkstyle.
- Will be bringing in someone to help who works specifically on that transition.
- Getting lots of calls and emails on the age group changes we all have to work to understand them and help area clubs and coaches understand them.

Cadet Director –Jake O'Neill

- Communicated via email, text message, and verbally with Thomas Johnson about team gear selections.
- Communicated with Keith Davison about efforts to improve Freestyle and Greco Roman wrestling in the state. Has a few suggestions:
 - Move FS/GR State back a week or two. Allows two benefits; more local tournaments and it bridges the gap between state and regionals
 - Invite all of the state's college programs and RTC's to the University age group at FS/GR State. Promote and showcase their participation. (Has already stated the conversations with the college coaches at IU, Purdue, Indiana Tech, Marian, and Manchester)
 - Promote Central Regionals and fund the trip when it is out of state.
 - Fund a trip to another regional other than our own. (Northern Plains, Southern Plains, Southeast)
 - Fund and promote Kids FS/GR Nationals.
 - Don't sanction a Folkstyle tournament after Folkstyle State.
 - Continue to recruit and train FS/GR Officials, and find ways to ramp up and improve those efforts.
 - Continue to organize and cooperate the FS/GR Tournament schedule to optimize participation (athletes, officials, and tournament directors) in respective sections, and find ways to ramp up and improve these efforts.
 - Continue to promote and recruit for our National Team trips, and find ways to ramp up and improve these efforts.

- Elementary duals filled up in a day or a day and a half.
- Online registration seemed to go very well.
- Was able to answer questions in real time.
- Ready to go after tournament meeting today.
- Looking to up the numbers next year.

- Pat Culp talked about maybe adding another tournament, doing middle school state duals
- Ryan Parrish to do a survey as to how they feel about the changes, taking a poll.
- Will add question about middle school state duals.

Regional Training Center Director – Leroy Vega

- Not Present. No Report.
- Was inadvertently not notified of meeting. Will be added to group email.

Team Leader Director – Thomas Pompei

- Not Present. Report provided via email.
- Was noted that a team leader guide was sent to the office that has a PowerPoint to be uploaded showing how to use Sports Engine.
- Hoping to get more specific trip information for certain trips.
- Looking for Junior Duals team leader, working with Brady Eppert.
- Josh Holden is unable to do again this year.

Women's Director – Jason DeLois

- Providing training for girls around the state in girl friendly rooms.
- 5 around the state: River City, Dragon, Beast mode in Albian, Wes Del in Muncie and Northeastern WC in Richmond. Generally, have 5-10 girls every week.
- Calling clubs to see if they will add all girls' divisions to their tournaments.
- Going to and talking to coaches at local tournaments.
- Composing a comprehensive list of colleges, close to 50 that offer girls' wrestling.
- New ones popping up frequently.
- Will be doing a one-stop shop for colleges, coach, email address and college major that the college is known for.
- Would like it on the women's page on the website.
- Would like to get the word out to affiliated clubs that girls wrestle too.
- Wants to put together a letter or email to clubs, maybe d a girls' day or something similar.
- Would like to provide at least 2 girls' camps to train girls. Feels we are not training them currently.
- Would like to utilize USA Wrestling by bringing in a clinician.
- Would like to get more girls in Indiana gear.
- March 21-24, pre-season nationals pushes days up to approve gear for a particular style.
- 26 girls participated last year and thins we could have 30 this year.
- Was told to work with Thomas Johnson about getting national gear early for the women
- JD Minch said IHSAA is looking to add a women's sport because they want to add men's lacrosse.
- Jim Tonte would like to see a coaching base developed. Need more women coaches for supervision purposes.
- Would like to get more clubs to add women's division help with Madison blocking.
- Pat Culp will help with that
- Extra cost would be helping with this, and for adding extra awards.
- Keith Davison said we are able to market at this point, if it will help grow women's wrestling.

- Promoting wrestling in tournaments at beginner's level. Would like us to look at a bigger version of beginner's tournaments.
- Would like to form an advisory counsel to help build girls' wrestling at the grass roots level.

Fundraising Director – Nancy Campbell

- Not Present. Report via email
- Has confirmed with flexink.mi (in-house wrestling posters, based out of Michigan).
 This partnership will take place during the ISWA State Final Tournaments (Folkstyle and Freestyle/Greco).
- Still monitoring a possible partnership with Hoosier Realtors, the ISWA State Chair has taken lead on this effort. Waiting to ear the results of this partnership from the State Chair.
- Still following up by communication with KT Tape was made in order to discuss a possible partnership and/or sponsorship.
- Has also reached out to Battle Skin, at this time they had to decline due to numbers of interest in their product for sponsorships.
- Has also completed a grant form with Smithville (thank you to Mark Mundy for the connection), is still waiting to hear from Smithville.
- Continues to use social media to make contacts and network for possible sponsorships.
- Communication about possible in-kind and financial supporters should be made to her in order to establish a list and to maintain follow-up.
- Keith Davison reported the Marine Corps is engaged. They have a new contact and will be sponsoring at least \$5000.
- Nick Mello is interested in using us again.
- Shelbourne meeting was a good meeting. They are currently trying to become the preferred knee doctor nationally. Has been a great partnership.
- Jennifer Pierson asked if we can have commercials on our page for more money. We will need to look into Sports Engine's ability to do something like this.

Cultural Exchange Director – Lou Silverman

- 3 trips for next year. 2 away and 1 we are hosting.
- Purchasing airline tickets for Peru trip (12 athletes). 6/22 7/2 tentatively scheduled.
- Hawaii trip in early stages. Middle school 8 boys and 6 girls in late July.
- Hasn't heard anything from New Zealand recently.
- 2 options were provided. April was chosen so as to wrestle in some Freestyle tournaments. Will be reaching out.

Transportation Director – Sarah Frisz

- Not present. Report provided via email.
- Has been in contact with two representatives. Amy Eicher and Carson Weimer, from SiteSearch.
- Never received a call back from the representative at TBD Travel.
- SiteSearch representative walked her through tutorial of an example website, similar to what ours would be if we choose to partner with them.
 - Site allows tournament attendees to view the tournament information and hotel information for locations of host hotels.
 - Contains a map on the home page with drop pin showing the venue as well a drop pins for each host hotel option.

- Below the map, the hotel options appear in a hotels.com kind of format: name of the hotel, price, and customers can click on each one for more information about amenities.
- SiteSearch does the hotel research and sends contracts out to hotels which would best meet our needs, from distance from the venue to accommodations.
- We simply let them know our dates, number of rooms needed, and specific needs that we have (will come in handy especially for the SB Duals social).
- Offer a room rebate, which allows us as the ISWA to get some money back. We can choose to do it, or we don't have to.
- Attendees can book their own rooms on website. They can even book a block of rooms for their team, or individual rooms.
- We can get access to the back side of the website with a login that SiteSearch will provide, and that will allow us to see who is booking, when they booked, and how many rooms, on a day-to-day basis.
- All of this comes at no expense to us as an organization, as the SiteSearch pays on commission and through contracts with hotels.
- This this is a great option that will make arranging our hotels for any of our events (Folkstyle State, FS/GR State, and SB Duals).
- Noticed on USAW Event Schedule that Indianapolis is listed as the host city for SB Duals. Wanted to make sure we can assume this is confirmation that we are hosting. If not, when will be notified and by whom?
- Has a list started for anyone who may need a hotel room for Elementary Duals in Franklin on the night of January 5th. If you need a room, please email her and let her know.
- Thinking ahead: Cadet Duals are in Spokane, WA again for 2019. Are we planning on sending a team? If so, will get those plane tickets no later than January. Likes the process we used last year of diligently recruiting Cadets early, so she is more able to add correct names to the tickets. She'd like the names of the coaching staff as soon as determined.
