TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team takes on Canada in its final preliminary round game of the 2023 World Para Ice Hockey Championship today. Puck drop is set for 9:00 p.m. ET at the Moose Jaw Events Centre in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. Both teams enter this game with 2-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) records in preliminary round play, with the winner clinching the top seed in Group A heading into quarterfinals. Team USA carries an undefeated 13-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record this season into the game.

Team USA entered the tournament with five Sled World Championships all-time and two consecutive titles.

TALKING POINTS

SEASON SUMMARY

The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team entered the World Para Ice Hockey Championship with an unbeaten 11-2-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record on the 2022-23 season. The unbeaten streak includes first-place finishes at the International Para Hockey Cup in September in Ostrava, Czechia, as well as the Para Hockey Cup in Bridgewater, Nova Scotia, in November.

Team USA, along with members of the Men's and Women's Sled Development Teams, participated in the Hanger LIVE Sled Classic in January in Dallas, Texas, and swept Canada in the Sled Series in March in Elmira. Ontario.

MILESTONE MARKS FOR ROYBAL AND FARMER

In the preliminary round game against Czechia, **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) tallied a goal and an assist, giving him 250 career points, extending his U.S. National Sled Hockey Team Record.

In the second game of the 2023 Sled Series vs. Canada in Elmira, Ontario, in late March, forward Brody Roybal (Northlake, III.) made U.S. National Sled Hockey History, becoming just the second player in team history to record 200 career points. Roybal's three goal, one assist performance in game two also made him just the second player ever with 100 career goals, as well as the second player to ever reach 100 assists for the team.

SLED WORLDS DEBUTS

Brandon Adam (Silverthorne, Colo.), Brett Bolton (Rockledge, Fla.), Malik Jones (Aurora, Colo.), Griffin LaMarre (Haverhill, Mass.), Ben Musselman (Amelia, Ohio), and Evan Nichols (Haymarket, Va.) will be competing at the World Para Ice Hockey Championship for the first time in their careers.

For Adam, a member of the U.S. Men's Development Sled Hockey Team for the past year, the second preliminary round game against Korea marked his debut for the U.S National Sled Hockey Team.

HOFF NAMED 2022 PARALYMPIC COACH OF THE YEAR

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.), head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team, has been named the recipient of the 2022 Paralympic Coach of the Year by the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee. Established in 2004, the Paralympic Coach of the Year is presented to a coach of an elite-level club, collegiate or national-level team, or the coach of an elite athlete who competes at the highest level of their sport. Hoff has led the U.S. to an unprecedented 31-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record in his five year tenure as head coach.

MILITARY BACKGROUNDS

Four players on Team USA hold military backgrounds from the U.S. Army and U.S. Marines, including two U.S. Army veterans, Brandon Adam (Silverthorne, Colo.) and Jen Lee (San Francisco, Calif.) and two U.S. Marines in Travis Dodson (Deming, N.M.), and Josh Misiewicz (La Grange, III.).

LEADING TEAM USA

David Hoff (Bottineau, N.D.) is in his fifth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. In March of 2023, Hoff was named the 2022 Paralympic Coach of the Year by the USOPC. USA Hockey's Northern Plains District Coach-In-Chief, Hoff led the U.S. to an unprecedented fourth straight gold medal at the 2022 Paralympic Winter Games. In his debut season as bench boss, Hoff coached Team USA to a 10-1-0-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record, including an undefeated 4-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) mark at the 2019 Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic. He added a second world championship gold medal to his resume after guiding Team USA to a top-of-the-podium finish at the 2021 IPC Para Ice Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, its record fifth gold medal in world championship history. In his Paralympic debut in 2022, Hoff led Team USA to a perfect 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record and the gold medal.

Josh Pauls (Green Brook, N.J.), who has helped the U.S. capture the gold medal in the last four Paralympic Winter Games (2010, 2014, 2018, 2022), is serving as captain of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. Pauls is in his 15th season with the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team and his sixth as team captain.

INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

The defending Paralympic gold medalists and World Para Ice Hockey champions, Team USA has claimed five Paralympic Winter Games gold medals (2022, 2018, 2014, 2010, 2002) and five International Paralympic Committee Sled Hockey World Championship gold medals (2021, 2019, 2015, 2012, 2009) in addition to eight Para Hockey Cup titles (2019, 2018, 2017, 2016 (Dec.), 2016 (Jan.), 2015, 2012, 2009), the 2022 International Para Hockey Cup, the 2018 Turin Para Ice Hockey International Tournament and the 2016 IPC Pan-Pacific Championship title.

Since the 2014 Paralympics, the U.S. has skated to a 78-4-1-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record (entering the 2023 Sled World Championship) across all competitions. The U.S. has captured three Paralympic gold medals and three World Championship

USA HOCKEY HAPPENINGS

U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM WINS GOLD

The U.S. Women's National Team claimed gold at the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship in Brampton, Ontario, with a 6-3 win over Canada to capture USA Hockey's first gold medal since 2019. The U.S. has now won 10 world championship gold medals (2023, 2019, 2017, 2016, 2015, 2013, 2011, 2009, 2008, 2005).

Captain **Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) was Team USA's Player of the Game in the gold-medal game with three goals, including the game-winner, and became the first player in Women's Worlds history to reach 100 points. **Aerin Frankel** (Chappaqua, N.Y) made 24 saves en route to the victory.

The tournament took place from April 5-16, 2023 at the CAA Centre, with the U.S. competing in Group A alongside Canada, Czechia, Japan, and Switzerland, while Group B consisted of Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, and Sweden. Team USA finished with a 6-0-1-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record.

TEAM USA CAPTURES GOLD AT U-18 MEN'S WORLDS

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team came back from a twogoal deficit to earn a 3-2 win over Sweden and capture the gold medal at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

The 2023 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship took place April 20-30, 2023 in Basel and Porrentruy, Switzerland. The tournament venues included St. Jakob Arena and Raiffeisen Arena.

The U.S. competed in Group B alongside Finland, Latvia, Norway and Switzerland and went 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-L-OTL) in the preliminary round before defeating Czechia, 4-1, in the quarterfinals and Slovakia, 7-1, in the semifinals.

MEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP REVIEW

The U.S. Men's National Team's run in the 2023 IIHF Men's World Championship came to an end earlier this week as the U.S. fell to Latvia in the bronze medal game at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.

Following an unbeaten run through the preliminary and quarterfinal rounds, the U.S. suffered a heartbreaking semifinal loss to Germany in overtime, before falling to Latvia in OT in the bronze medal game.

The 2023 IIHF Men's World Championship took place May 12-28, in Tampere, Finland and Riga, Latvia.

USA HOCKEY LEVEL 5 COACHES SYMPOSIUM

The 2023 USA Hockey Level 5 Coaching Symposium took place May 4-7 in Falmouth, Massachusetts,, with more than 450 coaches from across the country joining together for learning, presentations, panels, and breakout sessions – all for the purpose of continuing education, and working towards their Level 5 coaching certification, the highest offered by USA Hockey.

USA HOCKEY DISABLED FESTIVAL

The largest disabled event of its kind and one of USA Hockey's most significant events each season, the USA hockey Disabled Hockey Festival brings together all six disabled hockey disciplines, now spanning two weekends. The inaugural Festival in 2005 included 24 teams and nearly 300 players. The mission of the Festival is to provide a fun and exciting weekend of hockey in a grand event as well as promote and grow disabled hockey throughout the country.

The 2023 Disabled Hockey Festival was held in St. Louis, Missouri, at the Centene Community Ice Center March 30-April 2 and April 13-16. Blind, Deaf/Hard of Hearing, Special, Standing Amputee & Warrior Hockey were featured the first weekend.and Sled Hockey took center stage on the second weekend with Sled National Championships in a variety of age and skill divisions.

CHIPOTLE-USA HOCKEY NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

A total of 22 champions were crowned from late March to mid-April at the 2023 Chipotle-USA Hockey Girls and Youth National Championships at eight different host sites across the country. Champions hail from 14 different states.

As part of USA Hockey Girls and Youth Nationals, some 6,080 players have competed for American hockey top honors at various host sites across the United States, culminating into national champions.

USA HOCKEY'S NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Founded in 1996, USA Hockey's National Team Development Program began operations in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and remained there until the summer of 2015. The full-time program is composed of two squads, the U.S. National Under-18 Team and U.S. National Under-17 teams, which compete in the USHL as well as against international and collegiate competition.

The Under-17 Team competes in the United States Hockey League and also participates in three international events annually. The U.S. National Under-18 Team's schedule includes games against NCAA Division I and III opponents, USHL teams as well as competition in three international tournaments.
