g) President's Address:

I must start by thanking the people that work so hard on your behalf all year, your SHSAA Executive and office staff. All Executive members sit on one (or more) of our yearly initiatives....coaching symposium, youth officials symposium, women in sport conference, sport advisory groups, and SIAAA. In addition to these jobs, they attend provincial championships and meet regularly to deal with the business of the Association. Your commitment to doing the right thing for all our student athletes, coaches and schools is something I thank you for. To quote Steve Jobs, "If you are working on something that you really care about, you don't have to be pushed. The vision pulls you." And our vision is set in motion by the SHSAA office staff. Thanks to Lyle and Dave for keeping the SHSAA on the path defined guiding principles, constitution and bylaws. Eternal and sincere thanks to Jessica and Stefanie who keep us all organized and the SHSAA running efficiently on a daily basis.

As I start to write my yearly address, I try to begin by reflecting on the past year. So last September, I started to jot little notes about things I had noticed (thanks for that tip, Roger Morgan). It is uplifting to look back over the positive things that happen within our Association.... well attended provincial championships; but also being able to watch multiple provincial championship tournaments from my couch observing more and more demonstrations of sportsmanship in

tough situations; watching our volunteer base growing as the hosting responsibilities become more involved. Last year, I felt uncertain about what this year would bring. All districts were facing budget cuts and changes to their funding. I feared there would be a doom and gloom tone in some districts. As I talked with coaches and athletic directors across the province, I was struck by the determination and resilience at the grass roots of our Association. We are continuing to offer quality programs to our student athletes.

To quote Steve Jobs again, "The only way to be truly satisfied is to do what you believe is great work. And the only way to do great work is to love what you do". The passion that you share for sport and our student athletes, as coaches and athletic directors, is being seen and felt across the province. That passion is overcoming any financial obstacles put in your way. There was excitement as the North Central district held two major Provincial Championships hosted in Prince Albert (Hoopla and Provincial Track and Field). The enthusiasm of the host committees was palpable. Even faced with less than ideal weather conditions for both events, you'd never have known it by the energy of the hosts.

But it is the tough moments that consume our memory and energy. As an Association, we have had our share of loss over this year...coaches and athletes alike. The Humboldt Bronco's bus tragedy has left us all shaken to the core. There is not one of us in this room that has not been in a bus/van/car and we have all felt the responsibility for the safety of other people's children. And there is not one of us that will ever forget that fateful Friday night in April as we continue to take kids on the road again...weekend after weekend. Our hearts were, and are, broken for the families, students, and colleagues directly impacted. Sometimes there are no words...

I am so proud of this Association and our leadership and direction. We have a job like no other. It will bend your heart to the breaking point one day and exhilarate us the next.

We will continue to have great challenges and great opportunities within the SHSAA, and with your help, we will meet them and make 2018-2019 the best year in our history!

h) Executive Director's Report:

Good morning, on behalf of your office staff welcome to the 70th Annual General Meeting of the SHSAA. As we meet in Moosomin to review the past year in school sport, prepare for the future of our Association and, celebrate the individuals that have given so much of themselves to Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association, I want to thank the South East District and South East Cornerstone School Division for hosting this year's Annual General Meeting. A special thank you to Fred Jerred for his leadership of the host committee preparing for our arrival to conduct the business of the SHSAA; business that will provide opportunity for growth and reaffirmation of SHSAA as an inviting and inclusive organization; both essential as we attempt to reach as many students as possible with opportunities

to participate in school sport.

As always, the past year has provided many highlights and opportunities for Saskatchewan students to extend their education beyond the classroom. In a unique year where November 11 fell on a Saturday, the SHSAA, Legion Branches, schools, and coaches across the province provided student athletes participating in provincial championships a chance to recognize the opportunities provided to our youth through the service of our veterans. From numerous Remembrance Day Services held prior to Saturday volleyball competitions to the hundreds of high school football players who donned poppy stickers on their helmets, a strong partnership was established between SHSAA and our Legion Branches.

The December Presidents' meeting provided a number of presentations for the individuals that lead our district organizations. Included in those presentations was Warren Proctor who provided background and insights into the significant role that multi-sport participation plays in athlete development and sport for life models. There are certainly pathways for our elite provincial and national athletes, but school sport provides that complete multi-sport experience that the overwhelming majority of students in our schools should be involved in. A second presentation by Faye Matt from Special Olympics Saskatchewan displayed the growth that has occurred in a partnership between SHSAA and Special O with an emphasis on Unified Sport – a unique sporting opportunity where students with intellectual disabilities are teamed with "peer" students in a school sport experience.

SHSAA also assisted with the professional development of numerous Saskatchewan in-school athletic directors by sponsoring the Canadian Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association national conference that was held in Regina in April. Two days of intense learning and multiple networking opportunities with athletic directors from across Canada has strengthened the depth of knowledge in athletic directors in Saskatchewan.

The second SHSAA Youth Officials Conference was held in Regina two weeks ago. An initiative undertaken by SHSAA in cooperation with other provincial sport organizations has hopefully started some of our students on a path that will increase the numbers, and depth, of officials for years to come.

With August just around the corner it is a worthwhile reminder to mention the annual Coaches Symposium, sponsored and organized by SHSAA. The Symposium will be held at Saskatoon Aden Bowman Collegiate from August 21 – 22, 2018.

Sprinkled amongst all of these events and programs were 10 successful activity seasons and championship events of school sport. We sometimes become so focussed on the competition of the final destination of a provincial championship, we often overlook the fantastic work that school sport does during the season of play. I agree, there are many lessons learned at our provincial championships, but they pale in comparison to the lessons accumulated over an entire season of play. Please don't allow individuals to measure their success, or the success of our Association, with a provincial

championship but rather recognize and celebrate what makes our Association unique; allowing educational based athletics to develop the skills of citizenship in our students. Over the years, I have come to appreciate a comment by Robert Kanaby, former Executive Director of the National Federation of High Schools: "Winning on the professional level is required. Winning on the collegiate level has become expected. Winning on the high school level should be a pleasant by-product of what you're really supposed to be doing, which is developing young people into productive citizens." I believe that this statement emphasizes the importance of teacher-coaches leading your activity programs for student-athletes in order that we keep the "school" in school sport. I encourage all schools and school divisions to continue emphasizing the value of the relationships, for both staff and students, that are developed when teacher-coaches are the leaders of each athletic program.

This Association is indebted to so many. First and foremost are the individuals assembled here as the Provincial Council. You represent the thousands of volunteers in our province who along with the School Boards of Saskatchewan and our member schools deliver school sport programming. Please take the thanks of the office staff, Executive Council, and the assembled Provincial Council back to your schools and communities. If there is an opportunity please reach out to our dedicated sponsors; Sask Tel, Sask Milk, Saskatchewan Credit Unions, University of Saskatchewan, and University of Regina. There are many other event and program sponsors and they are noted and acknowledged in the Activity Report. Sask Sport continues to be the major funder of amateur sport in Saskatchewan and fortunately SHSAA continues to be a beneficiary of that funding. The Executive Council, under the leadership of your President, Val Gordon, and other committees like the Sport Advisory Groups, have once again demonstrated tremendous passion and dedication to Saskatchewan High Schools Athletic Association.

Finally, a personal thank you to Dave, Stef, and Jess for the work you do for the Association. Because of your efforts, the organization continues to roll along. Your support of the schools and coaches allow quality school sport programming to be achieved in all member schools.

In closing, I am once again honoured and humbled to have had the opportunity to serve you, the membership, and the students of our province. I wish you a successful annual meeting.
